Timothy Redding

I, Timothy Redding, of Harford County, State of Maryland, do make and publish this as and for my last will and testament in manner and form following.

1st I give, devise and bequeath to my dear wife Bridget Redding and my daughter Delia B. Redding - one half of my farm - on which I reside with all live stock and farm implements - on said farm at time of my death which belong me at that time in fee simple the remaining half of said home farm.

I give, devise and bequeath to my son John Redding his heirs and assigns in fee simple.

2nd The farm near Emory M. E. Church adjoining the lands of Edward Suedgrass and others, on which my son Thomas Redding now resides, I give to my wife Bridget Redding and my son John Redding to be held by them in trust for the benefit of my son Thomas Redding said son Thomas to have the privilege of living on said farm so long as he pays all taxes and insurance on the aforesaid farm and upon his failing to pay said taxes and insurance, he the said Thomas forfeit all rights to her on and occupy said farm or to derive any benefit or profits accruing from aforesaid farm, and at his death or failure to pay said taxes and insurance whichever may first occur then said farm to revert to and become a part of my estate and to be equally distributed among all my children or the heirs of any deceased child, taking parents share.

3rd I give to my wife Bridget the sum of four thousand dollars, for and during her natural life, she the said Bridget to receive the interest on said four thousand for her own benefit and at her death to be distributed equally among all my children.

4th I give, devise and bequeath to each of my following named children the sum of one thousand dollars, each, Michael Redding, Timothy Redding, Mary J. Laughlin, Maggie Laughlin, Martin Redding.

5th I give and devise to my daughter Delia B. Redding the sum of one thousand dollars in consideration for her services rendered to me by her for the last ten years.

6th I give and devise to my wife Bridget and my son John Redding the sum of five hundred dollars to be held by them for the benefit of my brother Martin Redding to be used by them or paid to said brother at such times and in such amounts as they deem to be to his best interest.

7th I give, devise and bequeath to the Pastor of St Paul Church in Cardiff Harford County, the sum of one hundred dollars for masses for myself and family.

8th Should there be any residue of my Estate after the above

bequests have been paid in full, it is my will and I direct that said residue be distributed equally among all my children or their heirs.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife Bridget and my son John sole Executors of this my last will and testament with full power to sell and convey any and all of my real estate and to give a good and sufficient title for same, as it could be if I were living, the purchaser or purchasers to be in no way responsible for the application of the purchase money thereof, it is my will and I hereby excuse said Executors from giving bond further than the law requires, hereby revoking all former Wills.
