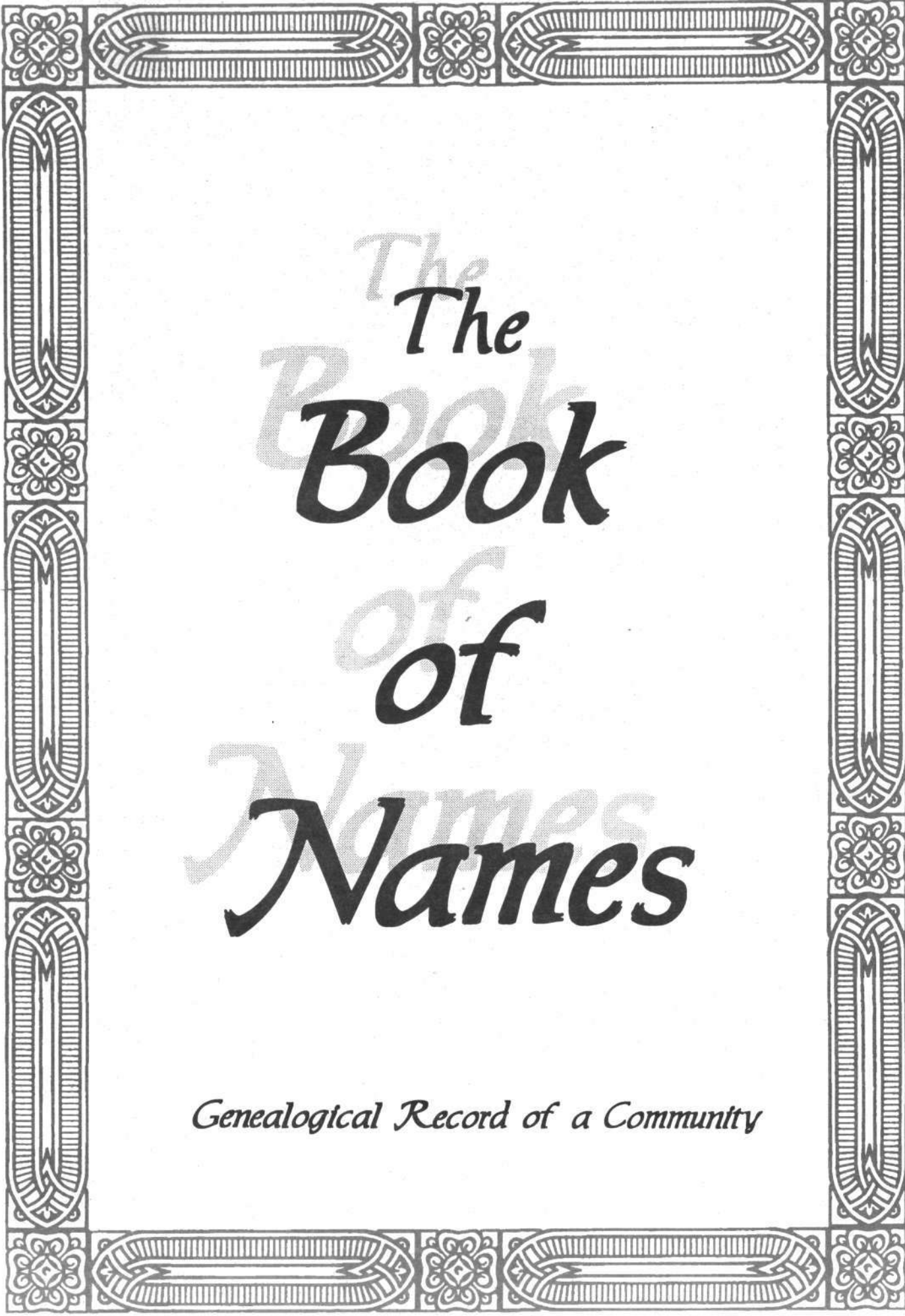

A PERSONAL NOTE & TRIBUTE TO THE PEOPLE WE MET

Far more than I ever expected, this research has absorbed vast amounts of time and emotional energy over the past two years. Yet, I think all of us who have been involved would say that it has also been an immensely interesting and fulfilling experience.

What began as a logical, orderly set of research activities evolved into a more random and personal process. Day after day, week after week, someone would call having learned about the research, wanting to include themselves or their families. Always, they had stories to tell. The fact is that, in today's busy lifestyles, theirs was a kind of knowledge and experience not typically valued ... and here we were, seeking it out with great effort! Think about it...when was the last time someone asked you to find dates of birth or death of your parent, grandparent, aunt or uncle, or "just what did he or she do?"

Some respondents had deep and significant ties to the Town, others had only short but memorable times here. Often, someone called only to learn their family lived "outside" the historic district and were therefore not eligible, and they were greatly disappointed. Sometimes, a descendant expressed little interest in supplying information. Then, a few days later, the same person would call, having sought the information from other family members, now excited by the whole process.

Sometimes, people came just wanting to talk and recall their memories or ones that were passed down in the family. One man took me on a long drive to visit his family's properties in the surrounding area. More than one person appeared with a family album and was clearly emotional upon recall of memories. Letters and phone calls from out-of-town respondents were equally personal and vivid.

Occasionally, we visited cemeteries to take the information down ourselves, or understand more the relationships among family members and make the data more accurate. Sometimes, it was a matter of playing a "sleuth" in the telephone book, seeking clues among names and areas of residence.

Even the experience of taking fifth graders on a walking tour, an experience which emerged from presentations about the research, was inspiring. They joined in so easily in imagining the lives and stories of people of the past that their enthusiasm re-charged my energy (and my hope for the possibilities of future historians!).

The stories we heard and the stories we created together could go on and on. Someday, they may become a different kind of book. But as compelling as the stories was the pride our respondents took in contributing to the research and the part they or their families played in Brookeville's history. To make a special effort to invite them to the Town's Bicentennial Celebration was the **only course to take!** It would have been an empty one without them.

HOW THE BOOK OF NAMES WAS CREATED

EARLY GERMINATION OF THE IDEA

The creation of the BOOK OF NAMES has always gone hand-in-hand with preparation for the Bicentennial. It began as a slow recognition - like a picture emerging out of shadows - that the history of any town is a reflection of the people who have been a part of it. So, too, a town's celebration of two hundred years should be a celebration of *their* lives, too, not simply *we* who are privileged to call the place "home" in 1994!

So, it only seemed fair that Brookeville's residents over its 200 years should be included in some way. I must confess that my early thoughts were really imaginings... "What would they tell us if they could? What would they celebrate? What would be the memories of a resident of 1900, or another in 1860, or President Madison as he rode out of Town in 1814? Or what would the busy Richard Thomas or Caleb Bentley have to say? Or even the resourceful Louisa Hopkins who took over her husband's harness business when he became infirm?"

Certainly, there was no way to *know* their answers. Soon, the imaginings began to take shape in what seemed a simple, yet enormously large, undertaking. Why not create a "census" of two hundred years, documenting at least minimal information? Why not document the generations of a town? Why not create a "*community genealogy*," as distinct from the more traditional family genealogy? The idea grew more compelling, knowing that Brookeville was uniquely positioned to allow such a possibility:

- The incorporated limits were set 100 years ago. The County tax map references the original 56 lots and other properties of the Brooke family.
- An immense amount of data was already recorded in the Brookeville Archives, primarily through the tireless work of Sylvia K. Nash.
- Many families or their descendants have remained in the area, and many of them were known to Brookeville residents who might work on such a project.
- The Town's Bicentennial was almost two years away, offering a wonderful culminating point and immediate application of the usefulness of such research.
- The writer loves research, almost any kind! The idea was too exciting to set aside.

THE IDEA TAKES SHAPE

The "BROOKEVILLE RESIDENTS 1774-1994 A Bicentennial Research Project" was designed to 1) document the names of all persons who have lived in, or owned property in Brookeville over the past 200 years, 2) collect certain basic demographic information about them, and 3) invite them or their descendants to the Bicentennial in 1994.

A small group of advisors was selected, representing both knowledge of the community and technical expertise. They were David L. Brigham, Stanley Stabler, Nita Archer, Sylvia K. Nash, Carolyn N. Snowden,

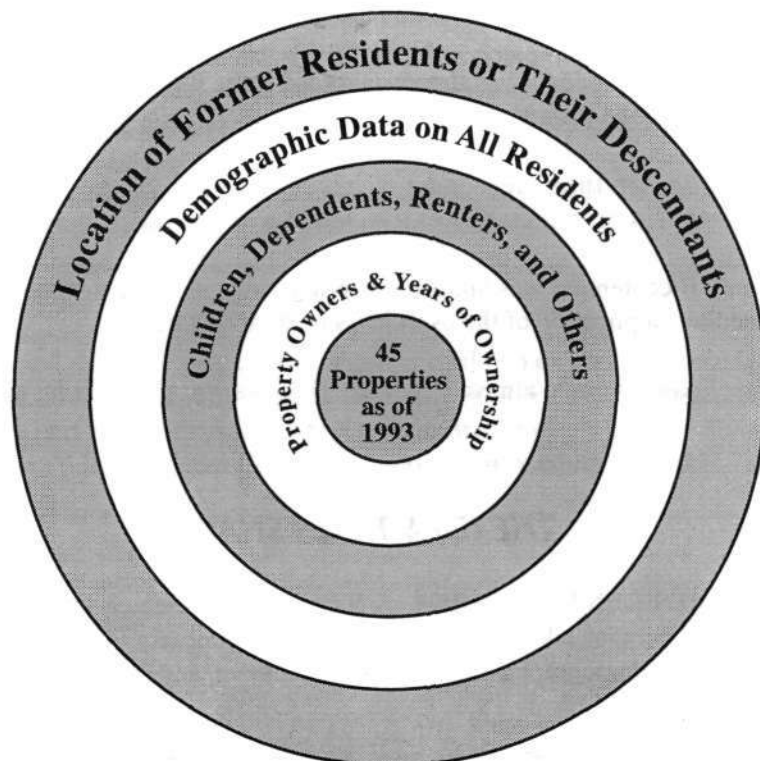
Susan Billingsley, and Anne Street. Jane Sween, Librarian, Montgomery County Historical Society, and Eileen McGuckian, Director, Peerless Rockville, also provided helpful advice. The data-gathering process was developed from their input and further study.

THE PROJECT BEGINS

As daunting as it seemed, we began, with support of the Town Commission, a grant from the Historic Preservation Commission (renewed in 1994), our advisors, and an enthusiastic and knowledgeable band of volunteers. Those volunteers included primarily Flo Johnston, Anna Unglesbee, Sylvia K. Nash, Susan Billingsley and Betty Derx. The major sources of data were the existing Brookeville Archives, census data, interviews (especially for 20th century residents), research forms completed by or with respondents, or other documentation (e.g. cemetery data, news clippings, family records). The Sandy Spring Museum and Montgomery County Historical Society Library were useful resources.

PUBLICATION OF THE BOOK OF NAMES

This BOOK contains a summary of the research, essay histories of the Town, maps used in the research, and, of course, basic data on individuals in the INDEX OF NAMES. Someday, another edition may be written, using anecdotes and pictures.



THE RESEARCH DESIGN

The research is a fairly simple answer to a set of questions. (See Diagram on page 4.)

? 1. What and where will be the starting point? Who will be included?

This research uses as its core the 45 properties identified on the Tax Map of the incorporated Town, indicated by parcel and/or lot numbers. (See page 15)

? 2. Who has owned these properties and during which years?

An ownership history, tracing Liber/Folio numbers and years of purchase and sale, was developed for each property, using data already available in the Brookeville Archives and the Montgomery County Land Records Office. Thus, completion of this stage of the research would yield the names of all land-owners.

? 3. Who else lived with these owners or on their properties?

If we were to document **all names** of previous and present residents, the question became one of documenting their families, other residents, or renters. Persons were identified from existing Archives information, census records, MCHS and SSM resources, personal interviews, etc. Each person is linked to one or more of the 45 properties, and hence to the land history of that property.

? 4. Having now the names, what can we document about these persons?

Now, the research turned to trying to document very basic demographic information about each of them. While we had hoped to write short profiles as well, the number of names soon outweighed the feasibility of this goal within this phase of the research. Thus, we settled on the following items:

- Name: First, middle, last, and maiden name
- Date & place of birth; Date of death & place of burial
- Occupation(s)
- Spouse(s)
- Children, particularly those who have lived in Brookeville
- Relationship to Brookeville residents, not within immediate family
- Anecdotal information, when available

? 5. Where are they living currently? If deceased, can one descendant be located?

This question anticipated the Bicentennial Reunion of former residents.

SOME EXPLANATIONS AND LIMITATIONS OF THE RESEARCH

Within the limits of time and available resources, we have tried to be as complete and accurate as possible. In fact, one reason for delayed publication has been the continuing contributions of persons who learned about the research, sometimes long after we "had finished" seeking data on a particular individual family. It

is anticipated that corrections and additional data will be submitted upon publication of this book. This information will be integrated into the ongoing files of the Brookeville Archives.

The following represent some points of explanation and limitation of the research.

INCLUSION

The BOOK OF NAMES identifies all persons associated with Brookeville, either by ownership or residence. Race is denoted by "C" for Caucasian and "AA" for African American.

LOCATION

Brookeville's current 45 properties (and therefore, street addresses) are each identified by a Parcel number. Those properties which are located on the original 56 lots are identified by Parcel and Lot numbers. The Location Finder lists these 45 Parcel Numbers (some with their original Lot numbers), together with their current street addresses and owners' last names. Since current properties frequently include one or more of the original Lot numbers or smaller parcels located elsewhere in the Town, earlier owners and residents can be "associated with" these same 1994 properties.

Space on the page did not permit both parcel/lot number and street address. Since the former is the more historic and unchanging, it is used in the INDEX OF NAMES. The reader can use the Location Finder or Tax Map to identify the street address for the corresponding Parcel and Lot number(s).

OWNERSHIP

Owners of Brookeville properties are included in the BOOK OF NAMES, whether resident or not. They appear in **bold type**. For persons owning multiple properties, only the two most significant ownerships are included.

In early land records, women were not always listed as "buyers" with their husbands. However, land could not be sold without their assent and so they were listed as sellers. Therefore, when we knew a woman was wife of the buyer at the time of purchase, and if she was listed as owner at sale, we listed her as owner with her husband for the full period of ownership.

AGE OF RESIDENTS

When the only reliable age data available is age in a given year (e.g. as entered on a particular census) or age at time of death (e.g. on cemetery records, family bibles), an approximate year of birth is calculated and used. Similarly, if only the date of birth and age at time of death are known, an approximate year of death is calculated and used.

OCCUPATION

Occupation means occupation "while associated with, or living in, Brookeville."

In earlier records or censuses, women were typically not identified by occupation and were not usually employed outside the home. If the census record specified an occupation, even "homemaker," that occupation appears in this book. Otherwise, the item is left blank rather than assuming an occupation.

YEARS IN BROOKEVILLE

This is frequently more difficult to define. For owners, the years of ownership of the property defines the years of association, except where death precedes sale of the property. Years of residence for renters could be determined only by listing on the census or interviews with family or others. Obviously, it is subject to error.

It is not always clear how long dependents (usually children) of property owners lived with them. Extensive effort was made to answer this question reliably. Census data was not always readable or accurate and not available at all after 1920. If the child was a minor, unmarried, and still living, years of residence correspond to dates of the parents' dates in Brookeville. If a child's name appeared on one census and did not appear on a subsequent census, we used the date of the first census, followed by a "-" (e.g. 1900 -) to signify years in Brookeville.

HISTORY OF BROOKEVILLE

Someday, a more complete history of the Town of Brookeville, particularly in its second century, will be written. In the meantime, this two-part historical "sketch" is meant to provide the reader with some background context for the documentation of owners and residents.

EARLY BROOKEVILLE

The Town of Brookeville is laid out on part of a tract called Addition to Brooke Grove, one of the many parcels acquired by James Brooke the Elder, a Quaker, in April 1745, and added to his plantation called Brooke Grove. This land was inherited in 1793 by his granddaughter, Deborah, wife of Richard Thomas. A portion of the present west end of the Town was a part of the share allotted to Deborah's sister, Mary, wife of Thomas Moore.

Tradition has set the founding of Brookeville in 1794, for it was in that year that Richard Thomas is thought to have built his grist mill on the Reddy Branch (at the eastern end of the Town) and the stone miller's house just across the mill race from it. There were at the time a few other houses, notably the Madison House, the Blue House, and the Valley House.

It was on his wife's portion that Richard Thomas conceived the idea of laying out a little town. He called it Brooke Ville after his wife's family. He selected a little plateau for his site, one well watered by the Reddy Branch on the north, with the Spring Branch on the east and Meadow Branch on the west, and two ever-flowing springs, one at each end of the proposed town.

He laid out fifty-six lots, most of them of one-quarter acre each, ranged along two principal streets, Market and High Streets, and four side streets, North, South, Spring and Race Streets. Then on one day, on October 31st, 1800, he and his wife sold thirteen lots at prices of ten, eleven, and twelve dollars each. By 1806, they had sold twenty lots. The remaining lots remained in Deborah's possession until her death in 1814.

The little town grew and prospered as the young nation grew with the demands made on it by a Europe eager for our agricultural exports and other raw products. Brookeville is situated in the midst of some of the most fertile land in Maryland, on which there were many prosperous farms and plantations. There was sufficient demand for a little town that could supply the services that a farming area would need.

Brookeville served the rural community well. By 1813, it had at least fourteen houses built along the two main streets. There were two mills, a tan yard, two stores, a blacksmith, a post office, a fine private boys' school, and a constable to watch over all.

Throughout the nineteenth century, the Town continued to flourish. There were blacksmiths who made agricultural implements, seed stores, carriage builders, wagon builders, a saddler and harness maker, two doctors, a tailor, dress-makers, shoemakers, several stores, an undertaker and a post office. There were two excellent private boarding schools, the Brookeville Academy for boys and Mrs. Porter's Cottage School for the Education of Young Ladies which focused on secondary education. Later, a two-room public school provided education for the primary grades. There were two churches, both Methodist, and a cemetery. A private circulating library and a debating society provided a bit of intellectual stimulus.

History has not ignored Brookeville completely. Although in its beginnings a predominantly Quaker village, Brookeville was touched by the excitement of war when on the night of August 26, 1814, President Madison sought shelter for the night at the home of Caleb and Henrietta Bentley. The Town was full of refugees from the burning of Washington by the British. All night commotion prevailed, soldiers camped on the meadow by Reddy Branch, with couriers riding in and more refugees streaming into Town. The next day, the President went back to his burned out White House and the Town returned to its tranquil ways. But since then, Brookeville has been pleased to call itself "United States Capital For A Day."

In 1890, the Town became incorporated, with a local government of three elected commissioners. After the turn of the century, the busy life of the individual artisan working in his own small shop gave way to the faster and better production of big factories and well-developed transportation. Brookeville was a victim of this trend. The mills closed, the shops shut down as their owners grew old and retired. Younger men earned their living elsewhere. Brookeville became a residential community.

Although touched now by the new developments that threaten some day to engulf it, a hauntingly picturesque little village still remains. Even though the shops and grist mills are gone and some of the very old houses have disappeared, the Town yet lives, neat ordered, with a population mixture of young and old, a viable community conscious of its heritage and anxious to preserve it.

BROOKEVILLE AND THE BROOKE FAMILY CONNECTION

In 1800, when Richard Thomas laid out his little town on a portion of his wife Deborah's inheritance, he named it Brooke Ville in honor of her people. The Brooke family had been prominent in the affairs of the Province of Maryland since the early days of the colony.

It was in 1650 that Robert Brooke came from England - some say in his own ship - with his wife and his ten children, with twenty-eight servants, a pack of foxhounds and a cow. He had been appointed by Lord Baltimore, Commander of the newly formed Charles County. He settled on the Patuxent on a manor he named De la Brooke and eventually received grants to about 8000 acres.

The founder and patriarch of the Sandy Spring community was Robert Brooke's great-grandson, James. James Brooke had married Deborah, daughter of his guardian Richard Snowden. Following Snowden's advice, James had sold his inheritance in lower Maryland and in 1728 had obtained a grant of 1500 acres in this area, which he called Brooke Grove. It is on this tract that Brookeville is situated. In the same year, James bought another large tract nearby, called Charley Forest, where he settled with his young wife. Through the years of a long life, James Brooke owned at various times as much as 33,000 acres, most of it original patents, which he rented out or farmed himself, or bought and sold as investments. James Brooke was a Quaker, having converted to his wife's faith.

When James Brooke died, his estate was partitioned among his heirs. To his second son, Roger Brooke IV, went, along with the holdings, part of the tract called Brooke Grove.

Roger Brooke IV did not live long after receiving his inheritance. When his estate was partitioned in 1794, his daughter Mary, wife of Thomas Moore, and Deborah, wife of Richard Thomas, were each allotted about 250 acres of Brooke Grove as part of their inheritance. Deborah Brooke Thomas's share included most of the present town of Brookeville. Part of Mary Brooke Moore's portion lay at the west end of Brookeville and beyond. Mary Brooke Moore and Deborah Brooke Thomas were already living at each end of town. They were joined soon after by their sisters Sarah, who had married Caleb Bentley, and Hannah, wife of Issac Briggs.

As time passed, members of the family died or moved away from Brookeville. However, the Brooke family continued to flourish in the Sandy Spring community. Although no one today in the area bears the name "Brooke," there are many descendants of James Brooke living among us!

BROOKEVILLE IN ITS SECOND CENTURY

A FEW NOTES ON IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENTS

The look of Brookeville began to change quite noticeably after the turn of the century. Businesses closed, old structures burned or were torn down, many small lots were consolidated into larger properties with larger houses. The town slowly became primarily a residential village. Several contributors to this book have described the meaningful experience of family life and friendships through the first half of the 20th century and the impact of World War II and the Great Depression. As in most American communities, the pace of life increased after the War. As the surrounding communities grew, Brookeville became more of a "pass-through" town. In recent years, the pace of change is faster still. At the same time, there seems to be a growing public recognition of Brookeville as an important historic resource, to be preserved and enjoyed. The Town is engaged in several governmental and private initiatives to foster again a strong village identity, aware of its historic legacy and its potential for an exciting future. In this sense, Brookeville simply recalls its early role as a social and cultural hub for the larger surrounding agricultural community. History repeats itself, perhaps ever so slightly...

It is in this frame of reference that this historical note is written.

EDUCATION

Educational activities continued in Brookeville, although not as prominently. There are stories, at least, of classes in the Old Rectory, formerly the Eliza Thomas boarding house, which burned in 1912. Less substantiated are stories of classes in the Benson House and Stone House, now Valley House. It is not likely that black children received any formal schooling in Brookeville, but we know they walked or rode to schools in Olney and Rockville when such schools were opened specifically for black children. The two-room school-house on North Street operated as a public school from mid-19th century until the 1920's when it was sold into private ownership. Orndorff Hall opened as a public school in 1927 and closed in 1938. It served as a temporary site for the Friends School from 1982 until 1984. Today, no schools operate in Brookeville, but it is anticipated that more learning activities for the general public will be offered in the restored Academy.

A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE OLD BROOKEVILLE ACADEMY

While the "old" Academy closed as a school in 1869, the "new" Academy continued at Bordley's Choice, an estate owned by members of the Riggs family (now owned by the Reitman family), and closed about 1920. When people today refer to their relatives having attended the Academy, it is frequently this institution to which they refer.

The old Academy building has served as a meeting hall for various purposes throughout its history. The Brookeville Lodge No. 50 of the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows bought the building in 1869. The Montgomery Mutual Fire Insurance Company was essentially founded here and it was they who completely remodelled and furnished the second floor before moving to their new home office building in Sandy Spring in 1857. Thomas J. Holland and John W. Whiteside bought the Academy in 1900, and in 1907 granted the property to the Vestry of St. John's Church in St. Bartholomew's Parish. The Vestry did not

use the building to full capacity, and thus, they and the Mite Society (who had managed the building) leased it to the American Legion Norman Price Post #68, beginning in 1951. The Post restored, and has cared for, the building continuously since that time. The Town of Brookeville purchased the building in 1989, with the aid of a Community Block Grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, a private donation, and town funds.

The Town, with the Friends of Brookeville Academy, has launched a major initiative to restore the building as an historic site and community center. Undoubtedly, the costs will far exceed the original costs of stone hauled from a neighboring quarry, carpentry for \$179.75, masonry for \$267.67, and other donated goods. The projected restoration and renovation plans hold the promise of exciting and expanded uses of this historic treasure.

BUSINESSES

When historians speak of Brookeville as a "market town," they refer to the town in the 1800's. However, some people today still remember Andrew Dailey's store at 212 Market St., the busy, memorable store at the corner of Market and High Streets, operated by John Henry Parsly, and later, by Harvey and Wilton Boswell. The building burned in 1924 and was rebuilt by the Boswells who operated a store and post office here for many years. The building was remodelled and continues today as the Brookeville Post Office. Henry Howard, a man of many talents, ran a store and pharmacy across the street, and Charlie Benson's store at 309 and 310 Market St. stocked ice and other necessities. Some residents recall visits to Dr. French Green (who also delivered some of them) and Dr. Charles Iddings. John Whiteside operated a carriage and trimming shop at 208 Market St. At the other end of town, Rolland Fennington ran his blacksmith and machine shop, and Howard Craver was said to be able to repair anything on wheels. Both mills, on east and west ends of the town, operated until the early 1900's. Today, business in Brookeville has a very different look, including only the Post Office, Howes Plumbing (est. 1968), and small home-based businesses in landscaping, childcare, consulting, and studio arts.

CHURCHES AND ASSOCIATED PROPERTIES

Salem United Methodist Church celebrated its 150th anniversary in 1984. Originally housed in the Methodist Protestant Church, near what is now the Salem Cemetery, the congregation has always represented a mix of Brookeville residents and neighbors from the surrounding communities. The present church was built in 1910 on land donated by John Henry Parsly and of oak trees donated and felled by Brookeville residents.

The Methodist Episcopal Church on North Street was taken down in 1890. The Vestry of St. John's Episcopal Church in Olney owned the Rectory near 204 Market St. from 1878 until it burned in 1912, and the Brookeville Academy between 1907 and 1989. (The Vestry also owned the Stone House at 318 Market St. from 1869 to 1873.) Several contributors to this research remembered walking "down to the Grange" on Market St. at Brookeville Road on a weekday evening to hear the singing of an African American congregation who met there regularly for worship.

TOWN GOVERNMENT

Since its incorporation in 1890, Brookeville has been managed by a three-member elected Town Commission. The early work of the Commission is represented in the Town's Charter and Code of Ordinances. The following are more recent developments:

1991	Publishes Comprehensive Town Plan, required to take back zoning authority; Establishes a Planning Commission; Joins Montgomery County Recycling Program; Considers annexation of Abrams property (east side)
1992	Establishes Friends of Brookeville Academy; installs speed bumps
1993-1994	Organizes the Bicentennial Celebration, September 9-11, 1994
1994	Completes Comprehensive Town Plan; plans to take back zoning authority

THE ISSUE OF TRAFFIC

Probably no other issue represents more the difference between early Brookeville and the Brookeville of today than the sights and sounds of vehicles on its streets! After all, this was a market town, situated strategically on the Washington Westminister Turnpike. The noise of wheels and horses' hoofs were welcome sounds that signalled business or social activity, often from even those just passing through. Even earlier in the 20th century, passing traffic represented visitors, a modest amount of commerce, and simply the novelty of modern vehicles. Certainly, it did not mean major disruptions of every-day life.

Today, it is a different story. Traffic through the town's two streets **does mean continuous disruption**. The sounds and sights are tolerated, not welcomed, and much of the time it represents essentially an assault on historic structures, the natural environment, and personal peace. State traffic officials report a daily traffic count of as many as 8,000 vehicles. The Town began an intensive lobbying effort for the western route by-pass, as already included in the Master Plan. Public officials recognize the problem and its fundamental impact on the integrity of the town and its potential to really serve as an historic resource to the community, but funding for the project has not been approved.

BROOKEVILLE'S BICENTENNIAL • SEPTEMBER 9 - 11, 1994

Several activities have been undertaken over the years in anticipation of the Town's 200th birthday, from installation of decorative lights to research for the BOOK OF NAMES. It can probably be said that the Celebration itself was the largest activity ever undertaken by the Town. A major theme of the event was

"reunion," and over 250 former residents or their descendants returned. Their presence enriched the whole celebration. The full weekend program included a rich, eclectic mix of music and entertainment, reunion, parade, tours and displays, food, country store, sale of commemoratives, and a non-denominational service of thanksgiving. While the major intent was to promote the image of Brookeville as an historic resource, considerable profits were realized and were contributed to the Brookeville Academy restoration project.

IN CLOSING...

*It is fitting to end this historical note on the above brief description of the Bicentennial for two reasons. **One**, it was research for the BOOK OF NAMES which allowed us to locate and invite all former residents or their descendants, and **two**, the Bicentennial celebrated the Town's first 200 years, a milestone by itself!*

LOCATION FINDER (p. 2)

Each street address is signified by a "Parcel" number or a "Parcel and "Lot" number for those addresses located on one or more of the original 56 lots laid out in the late 18th century. BROOKEVILLE CIRCULATING LIBRARY ASSOCIATION

Established in 1838, this was one of the first private subscription libraries in the State. The Association was instituted at a meeting held February 17, 1849, at which Rev. Orlando Hutton served as chairman and J. O. Williamson as secretary.

The stock was taken up by private subscription, each stockholder becoming a member and entitled to his share of the property of the association. Elisha Riggs, of New York City, generously purchased a very large amount of the stock and presented it to his relatives in the county.

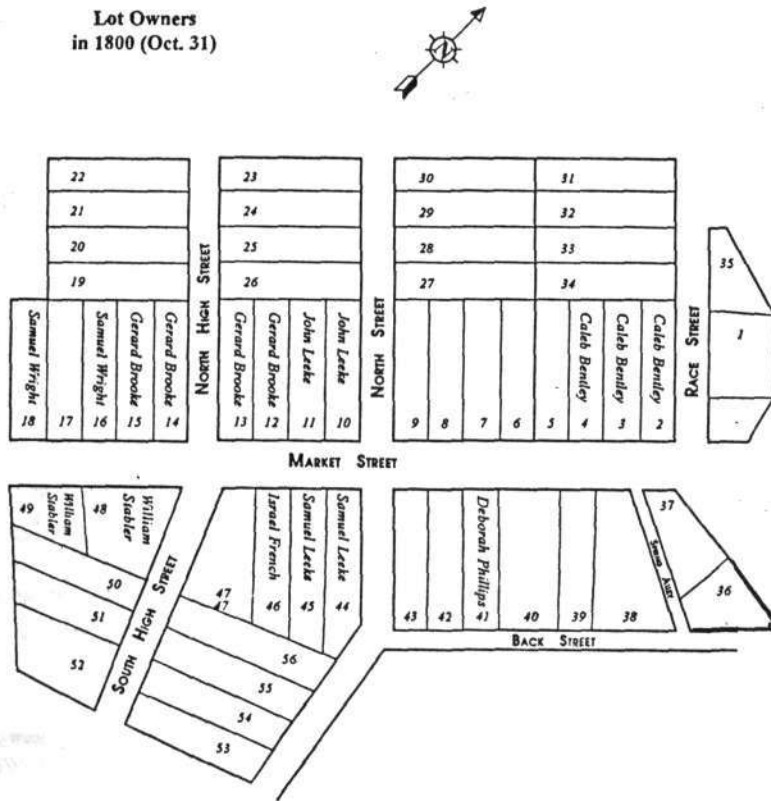

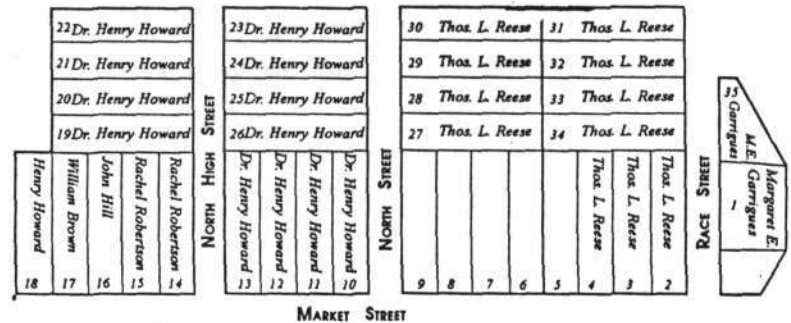
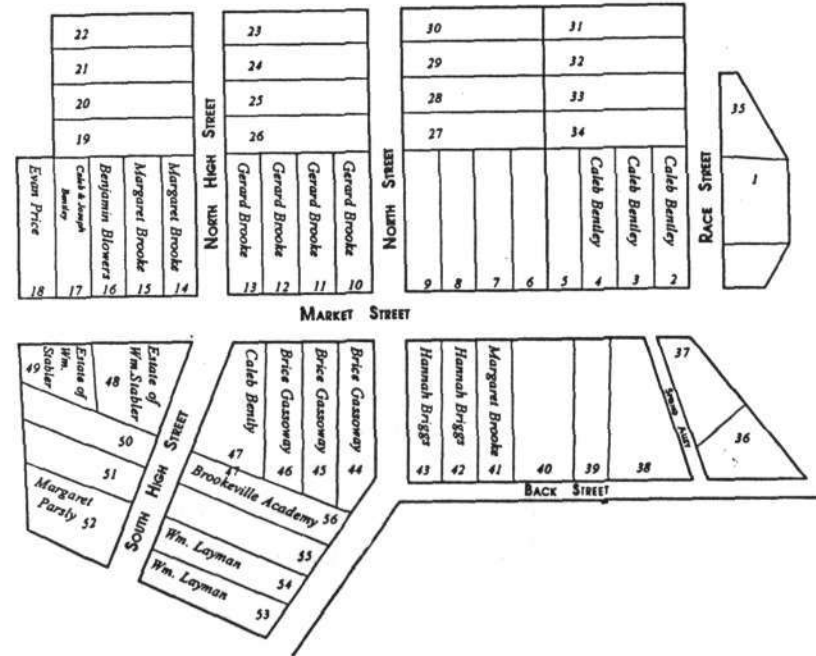

Brookeville Lot Owners in 1800 (Oct. 31)

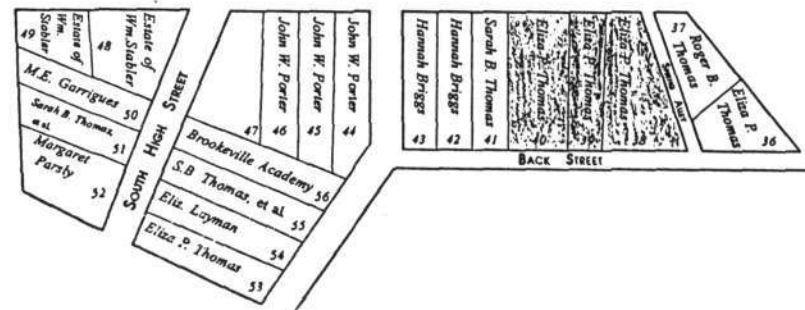


OWNERSHIP OF THE ORIGINAL 56 LOTS 1800 - 1825

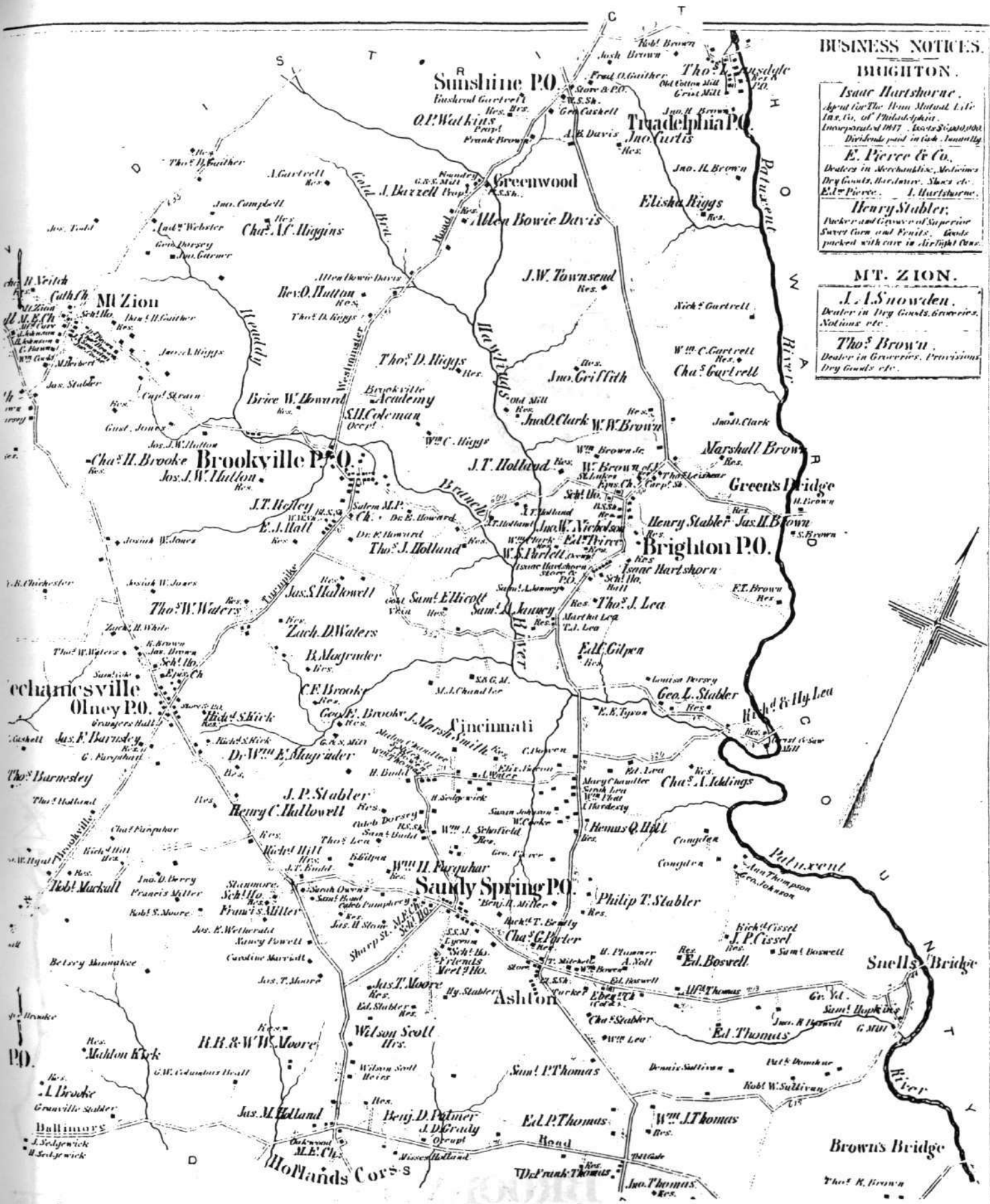

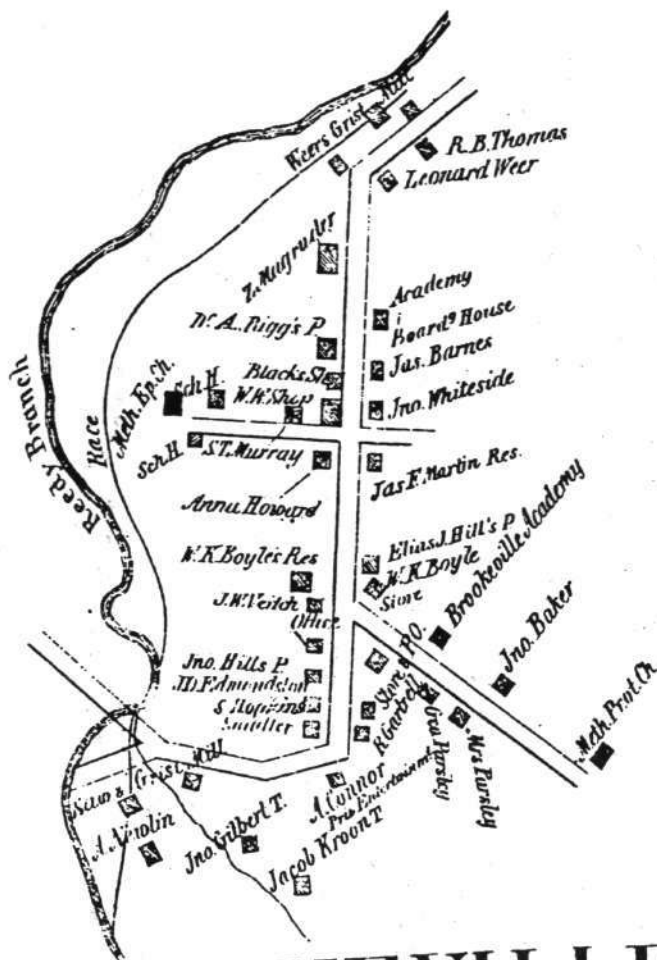

Map in the year 1873 by G.M. Hopkins, in the Office of the Librarian of Congress at Washington D.C.

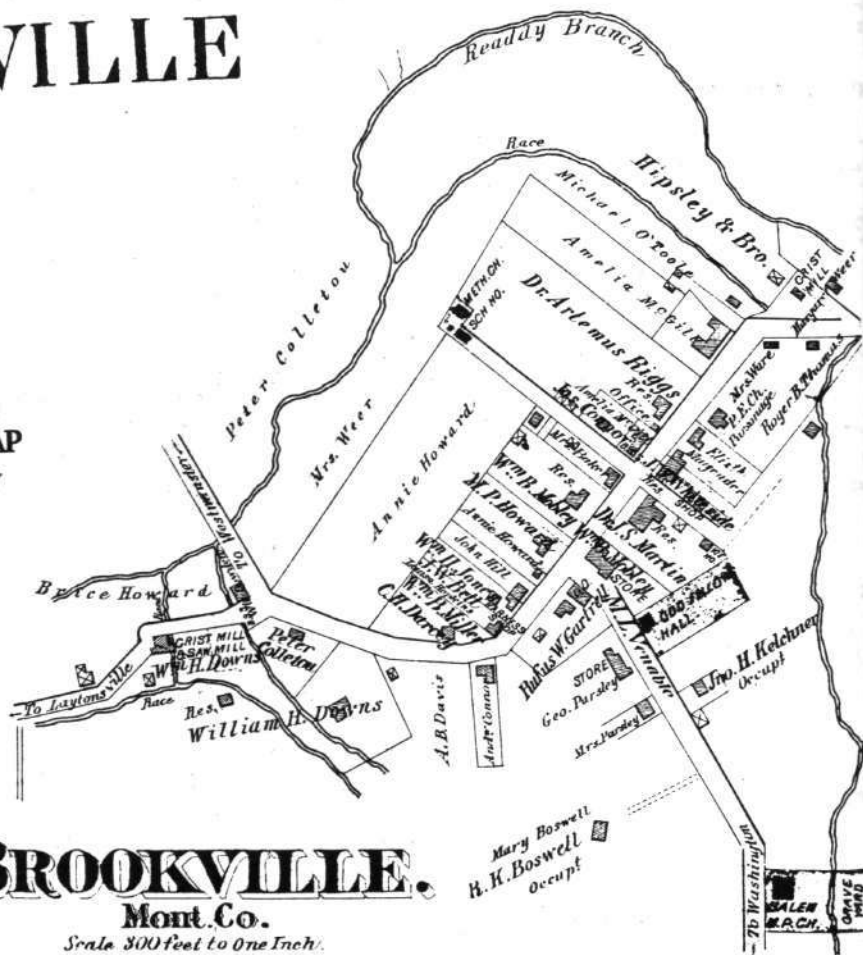
G.M. HOPKINS MAP, 1878

A CLOSING NOTE

Each year, there is both continuity and change. As it has for two hundred years, the streetscape remains quite unaltered. Change in architectural vistas and natural environment is slow. Personally, we remember what has gone before and continue some of the traditions. We see in each other the slow signs of aging, but friendships continue.

But change is always close by! Someone moves in or out, someone is born or a friend dies. Names change. Even houses change names, if identified long enough with some particular individual or family. The "who we are" changes - whether we represent young families or older couples, new residents or old-timers, the professions and the trades, differences in the color of our skin, Americans from birth or those new to our shores. *Brookeville's history is as much the history of the ideas and energies of its people as it is of outside events impacting on the course of our actions. It is **our** story. In the final analysis, The BOOK OF NAMES allows us to remember and honor each other.*

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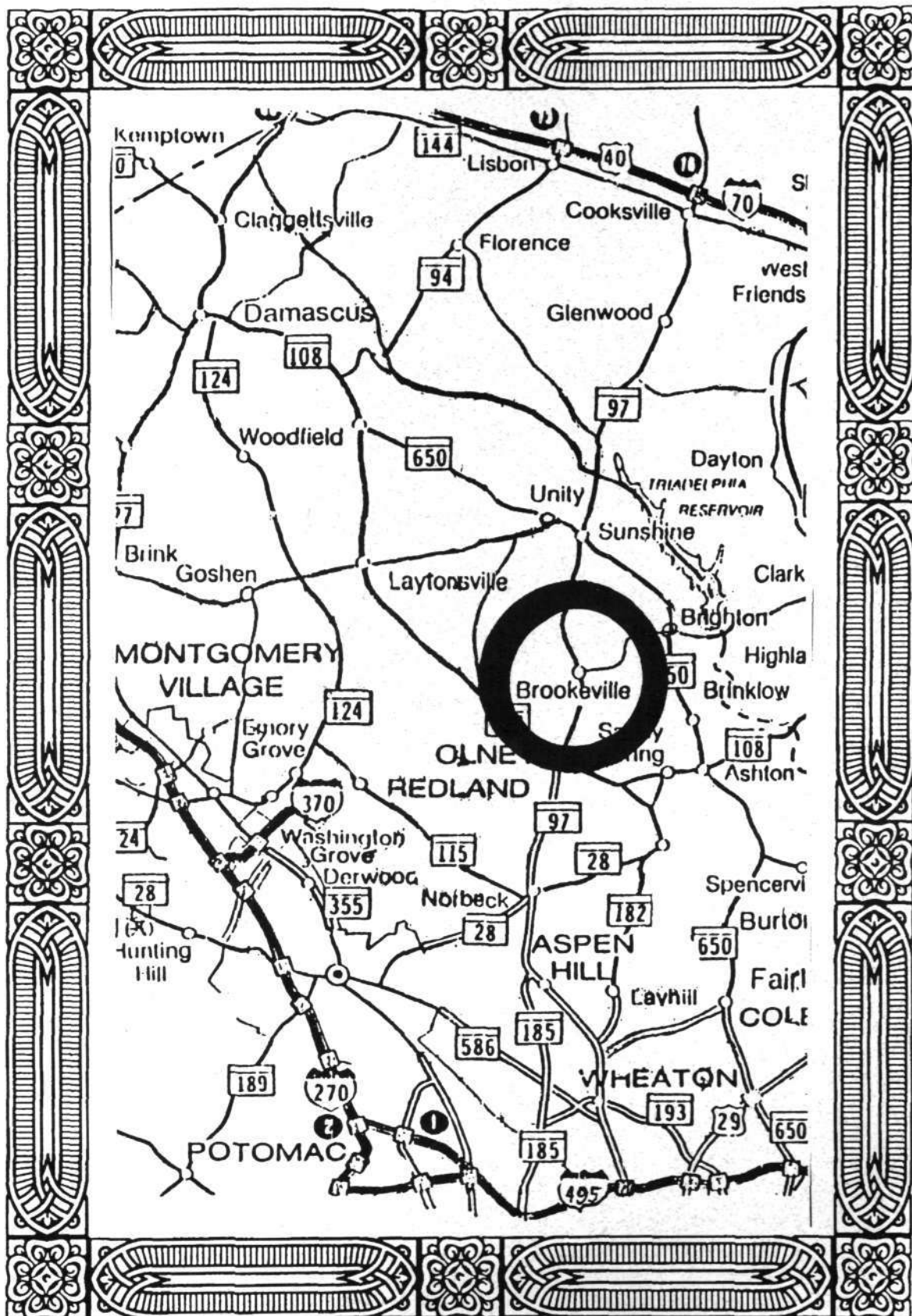
