Last Will & Testament

In the name of God, Amen! I Willi-
am Williams, a free colored man of the
city of Baltimore and State of Maryland, be-
ing of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body,
reflecting on the uncertainty of life do publish and declare this to be
my last Will and Testament. I give and bequeath to my wife Mille
all my property real, personal & mixed during her widowhood; and
thereafter or at her death it is my wish that the said property be divided
equally between my sons William & Edward their heirs and assigns for
ever. And I do hereby appoint my wife Mille sole Executrix of this my
last Will and Testament. It is also my desire that the use only of
the personal property above devised be and continue during the wi-
dowhood of my said wife and at her death or marriage to vest
in my two sons above mentioned. In testimony whereof I do hereby
set my hand and affix my seal this twenty second day of May in
the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty five.
