
Harrist Turner

Whereas a certain Harrist Turner slave of John Tilghman late of Queen Anne County stands charged with the crime of running away from her

And whereas the said Harrist Turner has been recommended to Executive Clemency by the said John Tilghman, her owner, who states that it is his intention to sell her beyond the State of Maryland as a slave for life; and as such punishment will equal that which would be imposed on her if convicted of the aforesaid offence and the ends of justice attained as well

Now therefore Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland do hereby grant a full pardon to the said Harrist Turner for and on account of the aforesaid offence upon payment of the costs accrued upon said charge; and the further condition that she be immediately sold beyond the limits of the State of Maryland as a slave for life and order and direct that all further proceedings against her on the charge aforesaid do cease and determine upon payment of the costs aforesaid and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against her for or on account of said offence


John Slaney

Whereas a certain John Slaney Senior late of Baltimore City stands charged by Indictment of the Grand Jury of the said City of the crime of conspiring to defraud one Thomas Willey of a certain sum of money

And whereas the said John Slaney Senior has been recommended to Executive Clemency by the said Thomas Willey and other respectable citizens of the City of Baltimore who state that the indictment was founded upon a presentment made by the said Thomas Willey under an alarm from certain appearances that it was the intention of the said Slaney to defraud him of a very large sum of money and that the said Thomas Willey is now satisfied that his alarm was without just foundation and that the said Slaney is entitled to and a worthy object of the exercise of said Clemency

Now therefore Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland do hereby grant a full pardon to the said John Slaney Senior on account of the aforesaid offence upon payment of the costs accrued upon said Indictment and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the Indictment aforesaid do cease and determine upon payment of the costs aforesaid and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offence.
