

FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS REWARD.



—Runaway from the subscriber's plantation, on the Patuxent river, near Upper Marlborough, Prince George's County, Maryland, on Sunday night, the 30th of May, negro men JOHN and TOM. John is black, about 35 years of age, 6 feet 2 or 3 inches in height, of rather slender make, with a very high nose. Tom is a mulatto, about 33 years of age, 6 feet high, pretty stout in make, and has also a very prominent nose for a negro. He is a smart fellow, with good address; the other talks slowly, and is less intelligent. These men were raised at the White Marsh, in Prince George's County, belonged afterwards to John Hoover, of Washington City, and worked on his farm near Bladensburgh, until I bought them in January last. They have relations in the neighborhood of the White Marsh, and acquaintances about Washington and Bladensburgh, where they may be lurking. I will give the above reward for their apprehension, if taken beyond the limits of the State of Maryland and the District of Columbia, or \$200 if taken within the State or District, or one-half those sums for either of them; provided they be secured, so that I get them again.
