Next I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Margaret Proctor my husband two acres and my best feather bed & furniture to her and after the use of the said land over and feather bed and furniture during her natural life and after her decease I give and bequeath the said land, over and furniture unto my son Gustavus Proctor his heirs and assigns. Next I give and bequeath unto my said beloved Wife heres all the residue and remainder of my estate (not above bequeathed) notwithstanding to have her profession and use of during her natural life and after her decease my Will and desire is that this said residue and remainder of my estate as above mentioned, be equally divided between my three children, to wit To my son Gustavus Proctor (to my Daughter Elizabeth Proctor and to my Daughter Catharine Proctor to them) and their heirs and assigns. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved Wife heres executrix of this my last Will and Testament, according to the Will and Testament by me heretofore made: and in Witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal to this my last Will and Testament in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifteen.
