

# FARMS TO RENT, for 1835.

1st.

A FARM, about 5 miles from Cambridge, laid off into three fields, of about 100 thousand corn hills each—building common.

2d.

A Farm, about the same size of the above—the building also common.

3d.

A Farm, about the distance of the above from Cambridge—much out of order, and requiring an industrious man, with hands and funds, to put it in good condition.

4th.

A FARM, about the same distance from Cambridge—A good tenant would be encouraged, and could have the farm for several years.

5th.

A Farm, adjoining Upper Hunting Creek Mills, laid off into three fields, containing about 80 thousand corn hills each—The building common.

6th.

A Farm, adjoining the last mentioned, and about the same size.

7th.

A small Farm in Cabbins Creek Neck, on the Great Choptank—It abounds with fish, &c., in their season, and has a good marsh, though the buildings are small.

8th.

A Farm, much better than the last, and adjoining it—It contains about 100 thousand in a field, and has a good fishery and marsh, &c.

9th.

A good Farm, on the Nanticoke, about 120 thousand a field—It has a landing where wood, &c., are delivered, and wharfage received—The building in bad repair.

10th.

A small Farm, near Vienna.

11th.

A Farm near Salem—buildings common, but land fertile

1st.

A House and Lot, at the Cambridge Cross Roads—a good stand for a merchant or doctor.

2d.

A House and Lot, on Race street, Cambridge, formerly occupied as a carriage shop.

3d.

A small House and Lot, adjoining the above.

4th.

A small House and Lot, also adjoining the above.

5th.

A good House and Lot, on Race and Mutt street, Cambridge—a good stand for tavern, store, or other business.

6th.

A good House and Lot, on Race street, Cambridge—a good stand for public business.

7th.

A small Office, on High street, Cambridge

8th.

A House and Lot, on High street, near the Court House—a good stand for a tavern or store.

9th.

A small House and Lot, opposite the last mentioned—a good stand for a store.

The Brick House and Lot, on High street rented for next year.
