

## Twenty Pounds Currency Reward.

**R**AN AWAY, from the subscriber, in Caroline county, Eastern shore, about the 27th of December last, TWO SLAVES, who were concerned in a robbery of £. 120 currency, one of them known by the name of DANIEL PERKINS, a *Mulatto*, a stout well made fellow, about 5 feet 10 inches high, speaks good English, and is a sensible artful fellow; has taken a great many good clothes with him, and is generally very drestly; he was seen in Talbot county about the last of December, and it is supposed he has got a passage to Baltimore. The other is a *black Fellow*, named LONDON, stout and well made, and is a *Guinea Negro*; has some cuts in one of his cheeks, and has a considerable scar on one of his heels, and one of his feet, which was by a cut with an ax, which has made one foot broader than the other;—he speaks good English, and is very sensible; his cloathing are, one duffil or bearskin great coat, one searnought jacket, one pair of new kersey breeches, new yarn stockings, double-soled shoes, two linen shirts, with fundry other cloathing.—It is possible they may get passes, and may pretend they are free men. Whoever takes up the said RUNAWAYS, and secures them, so that I get them again, shall be paid the above Reward, or TEN POUNDS for each.
