

Thirty Dollars Reward.

RUNAWAY from the subscriber, on Thursday night, the 17th of January last, a Negro man named **CALEB**, about 25 years of age, about six feet high, spare built, a lively, active black fellow; formerly belonged to captain Stanley Robinson, and may have travelled down this county, or over to Cambridge. He was living with Mr. Thomas Countess, in Queen Ann's county, on wages, where he had feloniously taken some corn, and carried it away—he dreading the consequences, may be the cause of this breach. I am informed that he went away in a round jacket and trowsers of country Kersey, dyed yellow, his under jacket of striped Iwandown, a half worn wool hat, an old coarse shirred milled stockings, and old shoes; he may have other clothes that we know nothing off. Any person who secures said Negro, either in Boston goal, or Cambridge, that I get him safe, shall be entitled to **TWENTY DOLLARS** reward, or elsewhere safely kept; but if delivered to me, at my dwelling house, the Head of Wye, Talbot county, they shall be entitled to the above reward, to be paid by me.
