

Runaway Negro. Forty Dollars Reward.

A Young MAN named GEORGE, late the property of — Hayward, esq of Talbot county, eloped from the service of his master at Newington near Baltimore, on Saturday morning the 3d. December instant. He is between five feet six and five feet seven inches high, stout in his person, in color not quite black, has a round and good countenance, without any particular mark that is remembered except a small scar on one temple, and has a contusion on the top of the head, which he received about a week ago in a fracas. He is about 23 years of age, slow in his ordinary gait, bold and daring in his disposition. He ran away without any Hat or Stockings, his other cloathing was a blue and white kersey jacket and osnaburg shirt (a good deal torn,) old drab coloured woolen trousers, patched with brown new India cotton checked neck handkerchief, blue and white and red stripes and shoes about half worn.

On delivering of him to me at Mr. Horne's place at Newington, or into any jail, I will pay the following reward.

If taken within 15 miles of the city 10 dollars, if more than 15 miles from the city 20 dollars; on the conviction of any person who may wilfully harbor or take him away, twenty dollars.
