450 Dollars Reward.

THE following negroes absconded from the subscriber in Northumberland county, Va. on the 30th day of January, 1828—viz.

JOHN, a blacksmith by trade, about 25 years of age, dark complexion, 5 feet 10 inches high.

JOE, 21 years of age, dark complexion, about 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high.

HAMILTON, 23 years of age, dark complexion, very flat nose and thick lips, well made and thick set, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high.

PETER, 27 years, yellow complexion, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high.

HAL, 40 years of age, very dark complexion, has a stoppage in his speech, is 5 feet 10 or 11 inches high.

Two Boys, about 17 years old, well grown for that age, black complexions—one of them is named **ISAAC**, and the other **BEN**.

Two Women, **MARY** and **LYDIA**, the former about 18 years old, and very large; the latter about 21 years of age, very spare, and of yellow complexion.

All the above negroes had on when they went away, home made clothes.

A reward of 25 dollars will be given for each of the above negroes, if taken within the states of Maryland or Virginia; and 50 dollars for each of them if taken without said states. It is expected that they will make their way for the state of Delaware. If they should be taken in the state of Maryland, they must be delivered to Samuel Lecompte, Cambridge, Dorchester county, or confined in any jail, so that he may be informed of it; and if taken in Virginia, they must be delivered to Mr. Wm. Davis, at Norfolk.
