

75 DOLLARS REWARD.—Runaway from the undersigned, residing on Church Creek, in Dorchester County, Md., on Thursday night, the 3d March, inst. a negro man, named *CHARLES*, who gives himself the appellation of Charles Banks, aged about thirty-five years, 5 foot 6 or 7 inches in stature, of dark complexion and delicate form. This negro had on for his apparel, when he absconded, an over jacket and trowsers of blue fustian, a fur hat much worn, &c.; and took with him other clothing much better (such as are called by negroes Sunday clothes.)
