**R**AN AWAY from the subscriber, living in St. Mary's County, Maryland, near Charlotte Hall, on the 3d instant, negro man William, who calls himself William Tabbs. His clothing consisted of a country cloth roundabout and vest; the latter is striped with red, blue and yellow; domestic cotton shirt; a pair of old blue cassimere or cloth pantaloons, and an old wool hat; he also took off with him a blue cloth coat, very much worn. It is probable William has procured free papers, changed his name, and will endeavor to pass as free. He will no doubt also change his clothes. I have reason to think he is at this time, and will be often in the neighborhood of Piscataway, in Prince George's county. The above reward will be given, if he is taken and secured in jail, so that I get him again.
