

**\$300** REWARD.—Runaway from the subscriber, living in Somerset county, Maryland, on Saturday, the 9th inst. the following Negro men, to wit: HARRY, who calls himself Harry Handy, about 43 years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, dark mulatto complexion—he is an intelligent fellow, can read tolerably well and talks in a sharp rapid voice, especially when under the influence of a strong drink, to which he is much addicted—he is an excellent field hand—and can turn his hands easily to any kind of labor that may be required of him.

GEORGE, who calls himself George Henry, about 25 years of age, 5 feet 10 or 11 inches high; bright mulatto complexion, stout and extremely well made—polite and conciliating in his conversation. George was brought up as a house servant and continued in that employment until about six years past, since which time he has worked as a field hand. As a house servant and waiter, few could equal him, and as a field hand none could excel him.

JOHN, who calls himself some times John Henry and some times John Smith, is about 20 or 21 years of age, 5 feet 5 or 6 inches high, dark mulatto complexion, slightly but well formed, walks and stands erect—speaks rather slowly and has a down look. He was brought up as a house servant and continued in that employment to the time he went away, and in this calling he is a first rate servant.

The above negroes took with them such a variety of clothing that it is needless to describe any.

If the said negroes or either of them be taken out of the State, and secured in any jail, so that the subscriber get them, or him, a reward of \$100 will be given for each thus apprehended and secured. If taken in the State and out of the County, a reward of \$75 will be given for each, and if taken in the county, a reward of \$50 each.
