

# \$400.00 Reward.

**R**ANAWAY from the subscriber, residing in Dorchester county, Eastern Shore of Maryland, on Saturday night last, (20th,) the following named Negro men, to wit:—

## Charles,

aged about twenty-four years, about six feet high, well-formed and likely. He is of a dark chesnut color, is civil when spoken to, and has a scar on the left jaw, received from a blow.

## WILLIAM,

aged about 23 years, five feet 6 or 7 inches high, and of a light chesnut color. He is square built and muscular—is civil when spoken to, and is believed to have scars on his nose and one of his cheeks, as he received blows on them, recently in a frolic.

## James,

(a brother to William) aged 21 or 22 years, five feet four or five inches high and stout, with a bright chesnut complexion. He is civil when spoken to, has rather long and bushy hair, and is a likely fellow, though he walks badly.

## ROBERT,

19 or 20 years old, nearly six feet high, rather thin than otherwise, with a round face and low forehead. He is black, has a deep-toned voice, peculiar eyes and large feet. His eyes appear somewhat inanimate and he shows a great deal of the white of them. His teeth are good and stand rather open.
