

COMMITMENT.

WAS committed to the Jail of Baltimore county by John Farmer, Esq. a Justice of the Peace, on the 28th day of April, 1844, **CHARLES JOHNSON**, charged with being a runaway, but says he was free born, and raised in Leesburg, Va. Said Negro is about 30 years old, stout made, and very black; 5 feet 6½ inches high; had on when committed a pair of gray cassinet pants, black vest, coarse cotton shirt, lace boots, and yarn half hose—has a scar on the right side of his nose between the eyes, one in the centre of his forehead, and one over the left eye. Had in his possession a pass supposed to be forged, signed Charles F. Eszridge.

The owner, if any, of the above described negro, is requested to come forward, prove property, pay charges and take him away; otherwise he will be discharged according to law.
