

Was committed to the jail of Baltimore city and county, on the 27th day of Oct., 1845, by T. Hanson Belt., Esq., a Justice of the Peace, in and for the city of Baltimore, a negro man as a runaway, named WILLIAM EICHELBERGER, who says he is free, and has lived near Bel-Air, Harford county, Md., with Messrs. John Stump and John Wilson for the last seven or eight years. He is of light complexion, about 19 years of age, 5 feet 7 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches high, has a scar on the right side of the neck, and a dark spot on the left cheek, a number of scars on the right and left arms and right leg. Had on when committed a black fur hat, linsey roundabout, plaid vest, with brass buttons, one pair of blue cotton and one pair plaid do pants, cotton shirt and lace boots. The owner, if any, of the above described negro, is requested to come forward, prove property, pay charges and take him away, otherwise he will be discharged according to law.
