Was committed to the jail of Baltimore city and county on the 22d day of Oct., 1845, by John Showacre, Esq., a Justice of the Peace, in and for the city of Baltimore, a negro woman as a runaway, named KITTY BLACKSON OF WATERS, who says that she belonged to Mr. Lewis Neth, of Annapolis, Md., where she lived until 18-31 or '2, and that her father still lives near Annapolis, with Mr. John Nichols, on a farm called Primrose. She has been living in Baltimore 10 or 12 years as a free woman. She is of light complexion, about 30 years of age; 5 feet 2 1-2 inches high, and has the third finger of the right hand injured near the end, and a scar on the left side of the neck; has a variety of clothing with her. The owner, if any, of the above described negro woman, is requested to come forward, prove property, pay charges and take her away, otherwise she will be discharged according THOS, O. SOLLERS, to law. Warden Balto. city and county jail. Nov. 18, 1845 - 3w
