THE above reward will be given for the apprehension and delivery to me of two negro men who escaped from the Jail of Prince George's County on the 20th of Aug. 1851:



HENRY COMPTON is a copper color—5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, well formed, about 35 years old. No marks recollected. He has, it is believed, lost one of his front teeth.—

He was in custody as the property of the late Dr. Greenfield. He has a wife living in Georgetown, D. C., where he was apprehended a few months since.



WILLIAM CARTER is about 35 years of age, quite black, about 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, and has lost the tips of two of the fingers of his right hand. He was committed as the property of George A. Digges, Esq., who purchased

him from William H. Thomas, near Chaptico, St. Mary's county.
