He is about thirty-four years of age, of a light copper color, has a large bushy head, and wears his beard somewhat long about the chin; his nose turns somewhat up at the end; he has a scar on the right hand and wrist, occasioned by a burn when young; he is tolerably polite when spoken to, and has a pleasant countenance, unless he is confused, which is very perceptible. He has a wife at Mr. Clifford Bowie's, on the Patuxent River, near Nottingham, and a sister in the City of Washington, D. C. Clothing not recollected, except his old clothing and a new suit of a drab color, usually worn by servants, when he left.

I will give the above reward for the apprehension of the said negro man, William—no matter where taken—provided he is brought home or secured in jail, so that I get him again.
