## WEST GOLD COAST

### EXTRACTS FROM THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE MINUTES, 1925

THE seventeenth session of the West Gold Coast Conference of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, convened at Cape Coast, Gold Coast Colony, West Africa, March 7th to 17th, 1925, with the Presiding Bishop Rt. Rev. Cameron C. Alleyne, in the chair.

All the circuit ministers, three of the missionary pastors and the accredited Lay Delegates were present.

Rev. F. A. Osam-Pinanko, retiring General Superintendent, rendered a comprehensive report which was freely discussed and highly commended.

The reports of the Superintendent-pastors showed that none of the circuits (Cape Coast excepted) were self-supporting. The Bishop promised to bring this to the attention of the Home Church.

The night-sessions were very interesting. Native night, Episcopal night and Woman's Night were new features. The women carried off the honors, both as to quality of programme and amount of money raised.

Mr. Van Hine, Lawyers D. M. Abadoo, K. A. Korsah, W. E. Sekyi and Hon. E. J. P. Brown were the chairmen. They presided with grace and dignity. Their contributions were exceedingly liberal. Hon. E. J. P. Brown and Lawyer K. A. Korsah led the way with five guineas each.

Last as to programme, but not least in generosity, was the chief who presided on the closing night of the conference.

Revs. Alfred K. Ashun and K. O. Okyir were ordained Deacon and Elder respectively.

The next Probationary and candidates examinations will be held on the eleventh and twelfth of February 1925 at Cape Coast.

Steps were taken to put the work on a sound financial basis. The Bishop was urged to return to America with this end in view.

A committee was appointed to investigate and co-operate in the matter of the proposed school at Accra.

The next Annual Conference will be held at Cape Coast on the 13th day of February 1926.

A vote of thanks was enthusiastically given the Home Church for the assignment of a resident Bishop to supervise the work of the Zion Missions in West Africa.

elected to the office of Secretary.

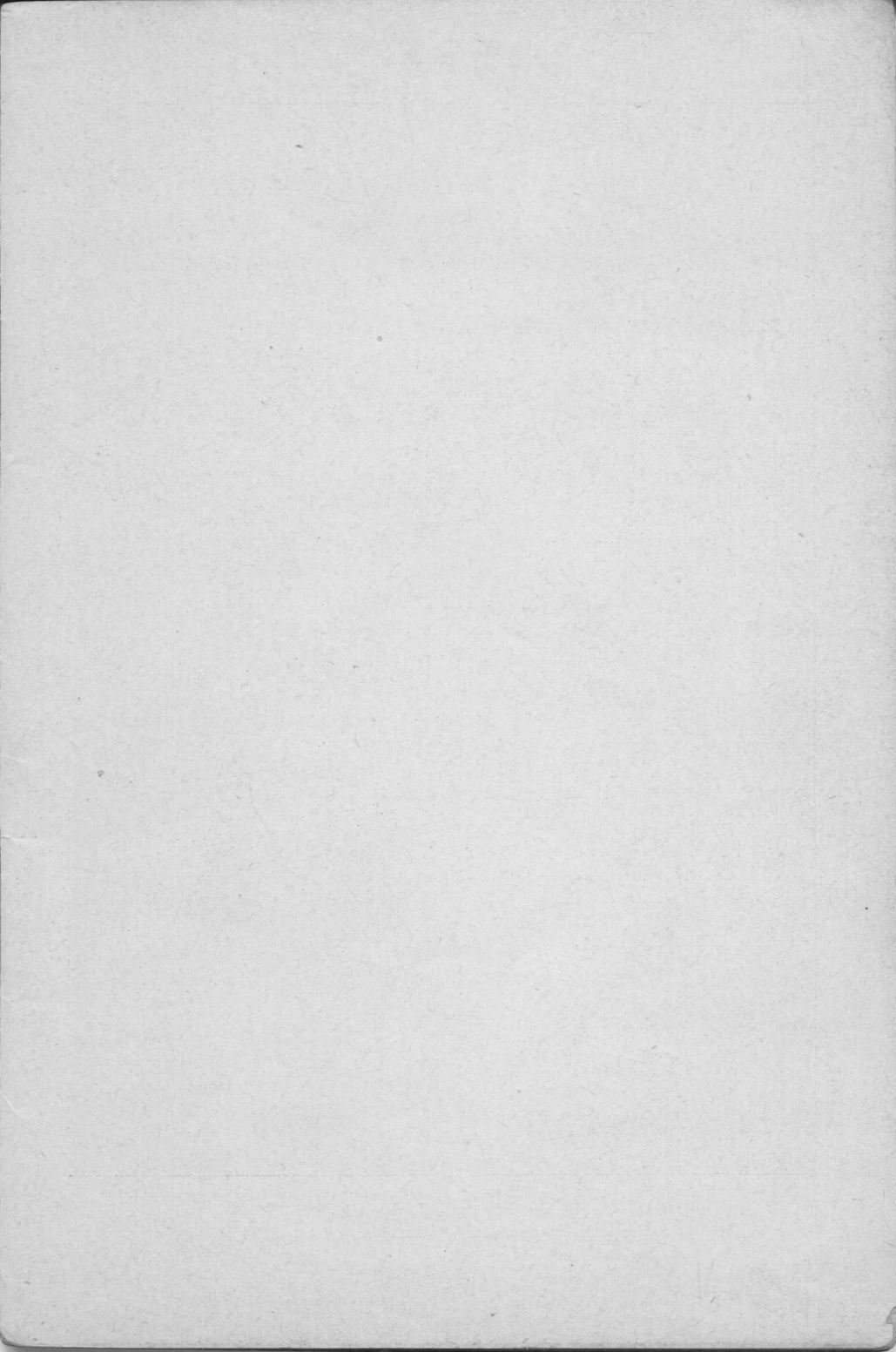
The general conference and constituency examinations will be held in

was very good.

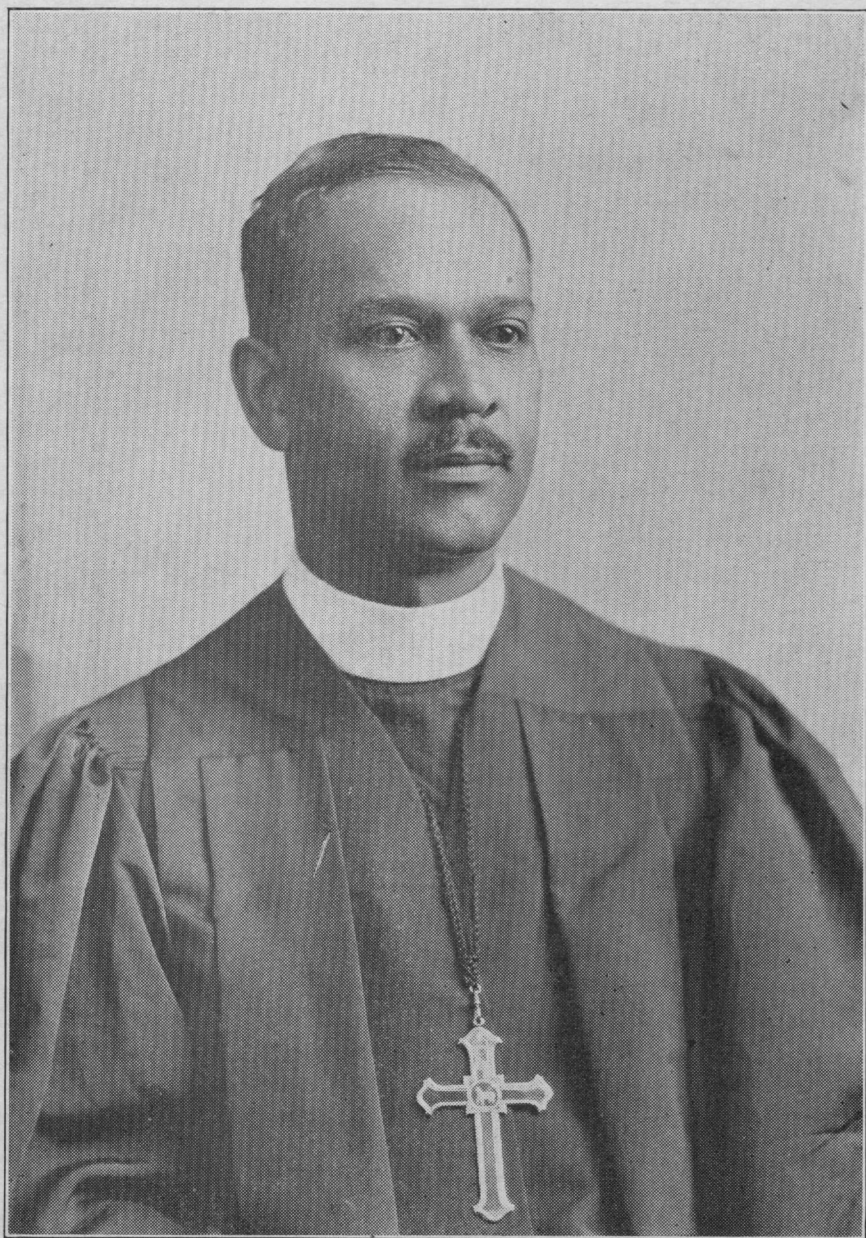
A committee was appointed to investigate and report on the

# Episcopal Address

DELIVERED TO THE EAST AND WEST GOLD COAST  
CONFERENCES.

Beloved Brothers and Sisters:

**I** GREET you, whom I love in the truth, and all who know the truth. Grace, mercy and peace be with you, from God the Father, and from Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father, in truth and love.

For some years I have carried you in my heart, and since the day of my assignment to this Episcopal District, I have not ceased to make mention of you in every supplication of mine. God is my witness how I long after you all in the tender mercies of our Lord and Saviour. I trust that your love for me will abound more and more as you know me better and our fellowship becomes closer and more constant.

Standing on the threshold of the New Year I had my first glimpse of Africa—your Africa and mine. I say mine, because I feel like a long lost son returning to the bosom of his mother. Many, many years ago my ancestors were taken as captives from this land of mystery and silence, to isles that gleam like emeralds among the waves, and to a continent which they enriched with labor and baptized with blood and tears.

When the Jews were forcibly transported into Babylon, their captors required of them a song. But they replied, "how shall we sing . . . in a foreign land?" But the enslaved Africans sung, despite tears; and through their sobbing voices vibrated a plaintive melody, like the wail of the winds when God is at the organ. This music lives today, and is recognized by competent critics as the only true American music.

They often wept when they remembered the stately palm trees and radiant sunsets of their beloved Africa. They may be said to have gone forth weeping, but in me, as one of their descendants, they come today with rejoicing, to what they then regarded as "home, sweet home."

As a boy I was taught at my mother's knee to regard Africa as the home of my forefathers. And so, for years I have dreamed of this day, longed for this day, and prayed for this day. And

now in the Providence of God, the Day is here—the day of restoration. My heart is dancing with delight, and unconsciously I find myself singing, “Le Africana, O Paradise, land of my heart.” For this is the day when I am restored to the country from which my ancestors were stolen centuries ago.

I have come, first as an African, who has wandered far and long, but have at last returned to worship under the old vine and fig tree in the old home. I fain would have the kiss of welcome, the ring of renewed relationship, even as I have heard the sound of music. Let us kill the fatted calf, while the Chiefs say, “this is my son who was lost and is found, was as one dead, but is alive again.”

I come also as the Representative of a great and growing Church. I come as the re-incarnation of Bishop John Bryan Small, who loved Africa, who laboured for Africa and with his dying breath exclaimed, “don’t let my African work fail.” I have come as an expression and re-affirmation of the love of your brothers in black beyond the sea, who more than a century and a quarter ago, founded a religious organization and named it “The African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church.” I come to emphasize the glorious fact that:

“Zion stands with hills surrounded,  
Zion, kept by power Divine;  
All her foes shall be confounded,  
Though the world in arms combine.  
Happy Zion, what a favored lot is thine.

In the furnace God may prove thee,  
Thence to bring thee forth more bright;  
But can never cease to love thee,  
Thou art precious in his sight.  
God is with thee,  
God, thine everlasting light.”

The Church at home intended that I should be given to you as a Christmas present. But circumstances, over which I had no control, have caused me to come now that the year’s on the wing. But though late, I am to be considered as having been brought by that mysterious and ancient Saint, Santa Claus.

You will realize that I come into a new environment, with an open mind and a listening ear. I well know that

“New occasions, teach new duties,  
Time makes ancient good uncouth;  
They must ever up and onward  
Who would keep abreast with truth.”

I shall make no rash promises, no radical moves, no hasty alignments. I have no foes to punish, no friends to reward. I

come with malice toward none, and charity toward all. You will find me no iconoclast who would abolish all your ancient customs overnight. But rather in a spirit of reciprocal benefit would I invite you to come and let us reason together. You are the scions of an ancient civilization. I have heard of the buildings of Zimbowee, the valour of Cetwayo, the deeds of daring performed by the Fathers of black men in the country of the Ashanti. I know of the keenness of mind, and the inherent astuteness of Africans who are untouched by the influence of Western civilization. But I also would tell you of the achievements of your sons in distant lands, the Africans of the dispersion, who because they have absorbed new ideas and conformed to new standards are climbing the heights of modern conquest and carving their names high in a niche in the temple of fame. Time prevents me from calling the roll, but there are many of them who through education have vied with their brothers in ivory as poets, soldiers, statesmen, educators, agriculturists, inventors, scientists, preachers and moulders of character. I also know that here on the west coast you have a coterie of these men, of the upward looking and the light, who are the promise of a new day, the harbingers of a good time coming, when all those who now sit in the shadow of hopelessness shall walk in the oriole of a rising sun.

We, in America, were recently electrified by the eloquence of Ntedu Kjirbuwa, young Ampiah, and Mr. S. Athan Pomeyie, who represented you in the General conferences of 1920 and 1924. Just before leaving the States I visited the Johnson C. Smith University, where the painstaking, studious Adjahoe is making a most enviable record. I am pleased to say to you that the president of that American Institution told me that Mr. Adjahoe was a burning and a shining light, an example to the other students who were inclined to trifle and waste their opportunities.

I need not tell you of Sol Fuller, the specialist in brain disturbances, or of the matchless, scholarly James Emond Kwegyr Aggrey, whom I regard as one of the brightest stars in the literary firmament of today.

And what of your women? I heard the gentle, eloquent, cultured Miss Eastman, when with her aunt Mrs. Hayford, they held audiences spellbound. I have listened to the music of Bal-lanti-Taylor, the sermons of Archdeacon Wilson, the sledgehammer arguments of young Wolo, and I come today to congratulate you in that you are sending your sons afar and they are demonstrating the fact that "fleecy locks and dark complexions" can encompass sterling qualities both of mind and heart. And he was right who said, "the mind is the measure of the man."



I may be pardoned if I indulge the hope that the sacrifices of the home Church will not be made in vain. That my coming and that of my wife, and the return of those who have before labored with you in the Gospel, with Walter Dolly and those who are to follow, will mean a new day for our Zion on the West Coast of Africa.

When the Serbians were being defeated by the Austrians, in the early days of the world war, King Peter left his palace, and taking his place among the soldiers on the firing line, addressed them declaring, "men, your old King has come to die with you." It is now written in history that his words incited them to unheard-of deeds of valor, and his presence marked a new epoch in the memorable struggle. Inspired by the noble example of their Sovereign, the Serbians were transformed, they reformed their lines and fought with a dash and vim which took their enemies by surprise and brought victory to the hitherto retreating Serbian army.

Perhaps in your case, the battle has been fierce and the odds against you. But I say to you today, "Your Bishop has come to live with you, to labor with and for you." Who knows but that I have come to the Episcopacy for just such a time as this. Lift up your eyes and look toward the hill-tops, the morning cometh, the day breaketh and victory is at hand.

In this my introductory address, permit me to convey to the representatives of the Government the thanks of the Zion Church for its forbearance and patience, its sympathy and help, all of which we greatly appreciate. I am pleased to labor under the protection of the British flag, which through the past years has stood for justice and human rights. We are inclined to believe that though called a monarchy, "she can teach Republics how they may be free." And so we join heartily in saying, "God save the King."

Like all others of the Gold Coast we look forward with pleasure to the coming visit of His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales. We trust that his coming will give impetus to the trade, commerce and educational strivings of all his subjects in West Africa. The late Queen Victoria is reported to have said to an Indian Prince that the Bible made England great. May the representatives of this Empire, on which the sun never sets, be ever mindful of the fact that Righteousness exalteth a nation, but sin, injustice and the stifling of the legitimate aspirations of a subject race, are a reproach to any people.



## Observations and Travel

I have travelled extensively through the territory of the West Gold Coast Conference. After visiting Elmina on February the third, I left Cape Coast on the 6th on a tour of inspection. During the month I was on the road, I visited the following places: Secondee, Imbraim, Ayiasi, Kumasi, Bompata, Oyoko, Asokori, Effiduasi, Nsawam, Esuoko, Asafu, Asuboa, Mansu, Winnebah, Bobokuma, Tafo, Koforidua, Akrosu, Accra, etc.

Everywhere we were welcomed with great enthusiasm and accorded every courtesy befitting the office which it is our privilege humbly to occupy.

It would be impossible within the compass of this address to chronicle all I have seen or portray all the conditions I found extant. Profound and distinct impressions have been made upon me. Wisdom counsels that some of these I should keep and ponder in my heart. "I have many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now."

Going through the sections rich in ore and abounding with gold; the fertile portions waiting to blossom at the touch of the scientific agriculturist, thoughts forced their way, against the will. In the Book it is written, "how shall we escape if we neglect?" A nation, a race, an individual cannot escape the inevitable doom of negligence. Misuse is a mortal sin. In the Stygian waters of the Mammoth caves in Kentucky they have discovered a specie of fish. They have no eyes, but on careful examination the scientists found that they have distinct marks where they should have eyes. From this they concluded that they once had eyes, but because they chose to live in surroundings where they had no use for eyes, nature took from them that which was useless. It is nature's way. On this principle the Red Indian had to surrender title to the wonderful heritage God had given him in the New World. This is not altogether analogous; but we can take the lesson to heart. The Indian resisted and died. The Negro wisely followed the path of least resistance and absorbed the new civilization. But let us take heed; absorption is not potential without rigid application of the energy necessary to build upon the foundation of the civilization which is our heritage. And we must also see to it that the foundation is not defective. I am writing this with anxious solicitude and solicitous anxiety. I have seen progress—Africa astir! But of the instruments used, and the methods adopted, I am forced to exclaim in the language of the sons of the prophets addressed to Elisha, "Alas master for it was borrowed"!

We are walking today where past and present meet. The delphic lines of Rudyard Kipling occur to me and I cannot but pray:

Lord God of Hosts, be with us yet,  
Lest we forget—lest we forget!  
Still stands thine ancient sacrifice,  
An humble and a contrite heart.  
Judge of the nations, spare us yet,  
Lest we forget—lest we forget!

I very much deplore the disposition on the part of the Native African to discount and discard his native products. In the old days there were native industries; weaving, pottery, making of slippers, house furniture, etc. All these are giving way to European-made articles. I do not condemn the use of such commodities. But why not utilize the things that are African? The world should know our ability in this respect, and be taught through exportation to use these articles, even as they appreciate things made in Japan. .

I feel it my duty to call attention to the wonderful development going on in the Colony. Road-making and the opening of the country to commerce by the building of railways and harbours are all very commendable. High praise must be given to the Government for its interest in these things, which enhance the value of our Africa and improve the conditions under which we live.

I cannot, however, refrain from saying that the method of handling crowds at the Railroad Stations is very crude if not cruel. The native policemen, armed with a little bit of authority, hamper and retard the progress of intended passengers in a very brusque and brutal way. I saw them assault women, even using their whips. No bully, white or black, should be allowed to whip a free people, who like the Ancient Roman boasts of their connection with a great Empire; an empire which guarantees life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness to all its subjects.

At Bompata I witnessed an incident which I sincerely hope is not typical. A white man employed in the Public Works Department, who was in a public store drinking that which was not water, fastened his eyes on a black boy and without any knowledge of his character, charged him with evil intentions and expressed his suspicions of him as a midnight marauder. The boy protested and said that he was employed by the Department of Forestry. But not satisfied the white man insisted that the Omanhene should organize a posse and run down the boy.

When the Omanhene demurred he abused him. Subsequently the boy returned. He threatened to kick him. And beside gave

the gratuitous information that whenever a white man tells him to do thus or so he must comply no matter what the circumstances.

Born a British subject, I have always believed in British justice. I thought a man was always innocent until he was proven guilty. But in this case guilt was assumed and the responsibility of proving himself innocent of any wrong intention put on the boy.

## Marriage

At Ayasie the question was submitted to me in its larger aspect; and everywhere I have gone some phase of the subject has engaged my attention. I have given myself to protracted meditation and sober reflection on this question. The subject is one of burning interest to me, as a man and a student. The Church which I represent believes firmly in monogamy.

Jesus said "For this cause shall a man leave father and mother and shall cleave to his wife; and they two shall be one flesh. So that they are no more two but one flesh."

When the Creator instituted marriage He provided Adam with but one woman. "And Jehovah God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make a help meet for him . . . . . And Jehovah God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; and He took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof; and the rib which Jehovah God had taken from the man, made He A WOMAN, and brought her unto the man. And the man said, This is now bone of my bone, and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called woman, because she was taken out of man. Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife; and they shall be of one flesh."

In the fourth chapter of Genesis we find an account of the beginning of polygamy, "And Lamech took unto him two wives; the name of the one was Adah, and the name of the other Zillah."

Polygamy became a general practice, and was tolerated even among so enlightened and monotheistic a people as the Israelites. This is not a treatise on the relative merits of monogamy and polygamy. I cannot but observe however, that the monogamous countries, in my opinion, are more polygamous than the polygamous nations. Insincerity, hypocrisy, prostitution and frequent divorce have cast reflection on the system as operated in the so-called Christian countries.

The polygamous countries are not without their faults. Degradation of woman, neglect of the children by the father, and a not well-defined or regulated family life, seem to characterize the peoples who espouse and practice polygamy.

A careful study of the question from a sociological point of view will convince the unbiased that monogamy sincerely adopted and nobly lived up to as the law of God, and the more natural method, is far superior to the system of polygamy which obtains only among the most backward peoples.

I am here making certain rulings which I want to obtain in our Conferences and the pronouncement of which is to be considered ex-cathedra.

(1) That our members must conform to the law of God and the Zion Church by having but one wife.

(2) That any member contracting a marriage which is polygamous after having been admitted to our communion, is a transgressor and is liable to discipline.

(3) That where a number of wives were taken before application for membership, the applicant should not be required to put away any of his wives; but he can only be grouped with those whom John Wesley regarded as "awakened" and classified as a probationer. But if he voluntarily elects to do so, he be required to make provision for the discarded wives.

(4) That the Conferences regard marriage, executed and entered into according to native custom, before contracting parties became members of the Church, just as binding as one contracted according to Western usage.

(5) That all members in full connection be urged to marry in the Church according to our Ritual as found in the book of Discipline.

(6) That none of our ministers be exonerated from blame who repudiate a regular native marriage unless on Scriptural grounds, which alone constitute a justifiable cause.

### **Our Schools**

It is hardly necessary for me to emphasize the importance of the School in the developing life of any people. Our Zion has recognized the place and importance of educating and training our young people. We believe in the most liberal training for all men and especially for weak groups and backward peoples. It is the lever by which they are to be lifted.



I very much deplore the false conception of education extant. Some one propounded the question to Miss Ruth Cameron, one of our best female writers in the United States: "Would it pay to give my girl a college education?" To which she replied: "Education is not given us to make a living, but to make a life." The educated man ought to be sufficiently equipped to make an adequate living. But this is not the "summum bonum"; the primary consideration. Education makes a life; and no life is complete, unless service finds a conspicuous place in its endeavours. To this end I counsel training of the head, hands and heart.

The Negro must "learn to work," said the late Booker T. Washington, "rather than be made to work." It is a fine distinction. The dignity of labour must be stressed in our Schools. Work is elevating. It is idleness which degrades. The consumer who does not produce is a social parasite and earns the contempt of all right thinking men. "Produce, produce, if it be the most infinitesimal portion of a product, produce it in God's name."

I give praise and high commendation to the men who inaugurated our school system and have perpetuated it through untold difficulties. But I must call attention to some weaknesses in the system which must be remedied, and that immediately:

1st. Our teachers must be better trained. Even though they procure their certificates, no stone should be left unturned to improve themselves in the modern methods of education and child training.

2nd. There must be co-ordination and complete harmony between pastors and teachers, and a sympathetic co-operation between the homes and the School management. In this regard I urge that both managers and teachers seek to know the needs of their communities and do all in their power to improve the attendance, raise the standard of their Schools, and increase the ability of their Schools in the matter of earning Government Grants.

3rd. There are many of our Superintendent-pastors, who should be in the School room. All of our Catechists and Missionary Agents must be required to engage actively in the work of teaching in our several schools.

4th. All Zionites are obligated to send their children to Zion Schools. The practice of sending our girls to other denominations must cease. I would be false to my trust if I did not, without feeling, call your attention to the constant weakening of our Church by giving our children over to be trained in educational



institutions which persist in proselyting them from the faith of their parents. This is a suicidal policy which I cannot but frown upon and assert Episcopal disfavour in the matter of its continuance.

### Conference Finance and Self Help.

This Conference is in a very bad condition financially. This is due to a multiplicity of causes. Lack of information and resultant lack of interest on the part of the folk at home. You accurately diagnosed the case when you traced the malady to its source and declared it to be lack of Episcopal supervision. I shall give the home Church an honest and comprehensive report and do all that I can to awaken them to a realization of the big opportunity.

But it is very apparent to me that we are in the midst of plenty. This is a land abounding with resources. The spies sent out by Moses were united on several propositions. They all said "It was a goodly land, flowing with milk and honey." All saw the sons of Anak and were agreed as to their physical proportions and military prowess. But Caleb differed seriously with the majority. The men who had served with him on the deputation sent to investigate the land said, "we are not able to go up against the people; for they are stronger than we." The heroic Caleb quieted the people saying: "Let us go up at once, and possess it, for we are well able to overcome it."

I am not unmindful of the difficulties. We are yet in the period known as the day of small things. But remember all religious movements have passed this way. The champions of the religion which Christ ranged in juxta-position with Judaism had to assault the citadels of organized opposition, bigotry and prejudice. Paul, the outstanding figure and militant leader of the Apostolic College "fought with beasts at Ephesus," according to the manner of men encountered. The message to the Church at Smyrna was "I know thy works, and tribulation, and poverty . . . . fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer. . . . . Ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life."

We recall how Martin Luther nailed his thesis on the door of the University at Wurtemberg, declaring, "here I stand; so help me God, I can do no other."

John Wesley, the revered father of our Methodism, denied the privilege of occupying a pulpit in the Church of England, in which he was an accredited minister, took his stand on his

father's grave. He afterwards exclaimed "the world is my parish." He laboured on in the face of reproach, recrimination and persecution. The result is the organization of a Church fated to endure until the archangel's trumpet proclaims the day of doom.

The founders of our Zion likewise faced a hostile sentiment. They were black men, in a country where black men were held in chattel slavery, denied citizenship, discriminated against. A Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, declared in a decision handed down from that tribunal, "that black men had no rights which white men were bound to respect." It was in that land they unfurled the banner of African Methodism, and successfully demonstrated that fleecy locks and dark complexion are not a "bar sinister" to achievement. But rather that:

"Honor and fame from no condition rise  
Act well thy part, there all the honor lies."

I charge you to go forth in the Spirit of the indomitable Napoleon, declaring "there are no Alps." You are here, telling me of darkened skies and troubled seas. But I borrow the language of the courageous Columbus and bid you "sail on! sail on!"

In the onward march of Pizaro to conquer Peru, there came a time when he was face to face with threatened revolt. His men, driven to desperation by hunger, want, privation and extreme suffering, declared their intention to turn back. Pizaro at this critical moment, is said to have taken his sword and drawn a line in the sand; "Men," he said, "on this side are hunger, want, privations and trial. On that Peru with its riches. Choose you as becometh proud Castillians. As for me, I go to the South." So saying, he stepped over the line, followed by a few of his more heroic followers.

Napoleon brought his troops, decimated and discouraged, beneath the shadow of the pyramids, built by the hands of black men and conceived in the fertile minds of men in ebony. Standing there he exclaimed, "Men, the centuries are looking down upon you."

Sons of a proud and courageous people, scions of noble and daring sires, I flash to you the signal "the centuries are looking down upon you." I draw an imaginary line to mark the destiny between failure, ignominy, reproach; and daring, endurance, vindication and victory. Choose as becometh proud Ethiopians. As for me I shall go the way that leads to the demonstration of self-reliance, self-assertion and the inherent ability of my de-spised race.

I dare to approach the organized opinion of affected racial superiority and lay my protest at the feet of the white god who inhabits its temple; and if I perish, I perish. I make no exaggerated claims for my group. I counsel patience, forbearance and justice. We must let no man make us hate him. Love all men. Do good to all, especially those who are of the household and labor for the upbuilding of Africa irrespective of their origin or race.

Young Cotter, a poet of Negro extraction was inspired when he penned the lines with which I close:

Brother come!  
And let us go unto our God.  
And when we stand before Him  
I shall say—  
"Lord, I do not hate,  
I am hated.  
I scourge no one  
I am scourged.  
I covet no lands  
My lands are coveted.  
I mock no peoples  
My people are mocked."  
And, brother, what shall you say?

And now, my dear parishoners, I commend you to God and the word of His grace. May we live together, hope and strive together, until "the ransomed of the Lord return and come with singing to Zion, and everlasting joy shall be upon their heads, they shall obtain gladness and joy; and sorrow and sighing shall flee away."

BRIEF REPORT ON THE WORK OF THE WEST GOLD COAST  
CONFERENCE OF THE A. M. E. ZION CHURCH  
FOR THE YEAR 1924

THE year under review is remarkable for mixed experiences and happy anticipations. The members of the last Session of this Conference rose as one man under adverse circumstances with a resolution to seek fellowship with, and supervision under, another denomination whose close Episcopal Supervision with financial support was calculated to be helpful to the growing and much struggling Missionary field. Toward the close of the Conference year, as Providence would have it, when this Conference like a little barque on the ocean, tossed about by the billows of fortune and misfortune, dry of water and provision, signalling abroad on the high seas for help, was bidden, as it were, to throw down her buckets where she was, and she would, just at this time, draw fresh supplies of water to slake the long-enduring thirst that had almost destroyed the crew of the little beautiful ship on the ocean of existence.

In obedience to the divine intention and direction and through the instrumentality of our friend, brother and compatriot, the learned Prof.

J. E. Kwegyir Aggrey, Ph. D., with the assistance of other prominent citizens of this country, Bishop C. C. Alleyne, A. M., D.D., a strong, intellectual and worthy Episcopate, a man after the order and spirit of the Bishop John Bryan Small of sacred memory, the spiritual founder of the Gold Coast Zion Methodism, who had during the year been elected and appointed the first Resident Bishop of the African Zion Missions, came on the scene, satisfactorily adjusted the difference between the West Gold Coast Conference and the A. M. E. Zion Connexion of America, and restored confidence and peace; and who, it is hoped, by the power of God, will help carry forward the work for which so much sacrifice has been and is being made for its firm foundation. Therefore, with confidence in the able leadership of Bishop Alleyne which his presence during the few weeks of the Conference year has already begun to inspire, we feel that our high aspirations will be kindled, sanguine hopes on behalf of the Good Cause will be realized which will spell advancement of the Master's Work.

The Bishop with his dear wife has already been at the most important points of the field of this Conference, and I am sure, he has had first-hand information and observation of the needs of the work in their several bearings. Congratulating the Bishop upon the great opportunity of usefulness in his fatherland, his field of Episcopal labours, and congratulating ourselves upon the grand possibilities at our disposal because of the bright prospects that loom up before us, we pledge ourselves under God, to give him our unreserved, unstinted and hearty co-operation and assistance—standing by him as it is our spirit in the manner born—I say, standing by him through rain or shine, through thick and thin, for the great work of educating and evangelizing the heathen who are perishing day by day. And with such a gallant leader, calm and resolute such as we have—a Bishop who has already made a definite statement of his deep interest in the work and his profound sympathy with the forward movement and progress of the Conference endeavours, we are safe in feeling that abundant success will crown the labours not only of this Conference, but of all the Zion Mission Conferences of West Africa to the glory of God.

To say nothing of the needs in the different points which are already made known to and observed from every possible angle by the Bishop himself, it is particularly to be solicited that Saltpond may be re-opened in order to bring the scattered sheep into the fold. The prospects there are too pleasing to be left alone for a long time. We have there a good and large land for missionary purposes

It is sad to report that the brethren D. E. Sam and K. M. Ntedu Kyirbuwa are still on the sick list. The former has been on the list for about four years in his native home at Kwaman; the latter since the beginning of the last Conference year; and he is in the Government Hospital at Accra: it is hoped that these brethren will be remembered in the prayers of the Conference and some better financial aid be provided for them on their beds of affliction.

We made very short travels during the year. Applications from different individuals for work in Zion and from places for the organization of the Mission which could not be answered. Hope is cherished that these anxious calls may be answered in due time.

It is sincerely hoped that time is not far in the distance when all that make for the deplorable lack of continued progress of this work will go down before our present leader's energy and the united sincere and enthusiastic labours of both Clergy and laity of this Conference as darkness flees before the advancing sunshine.

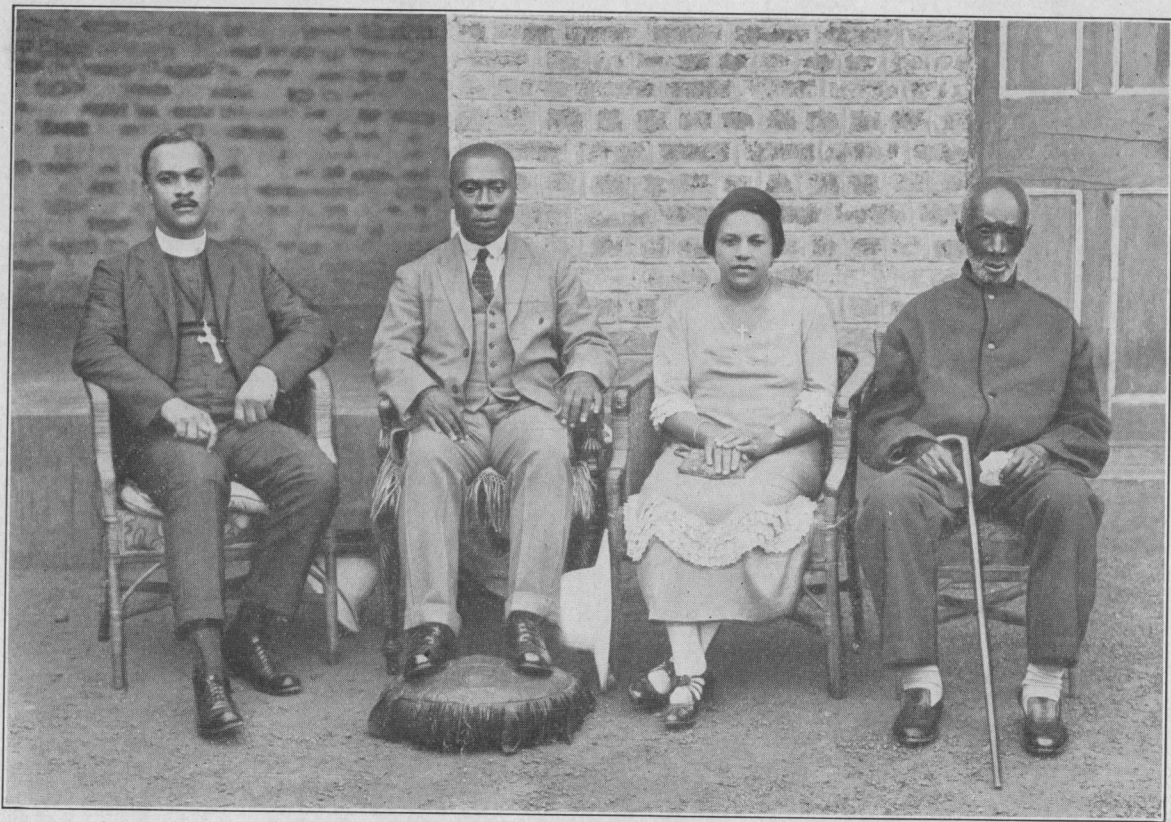

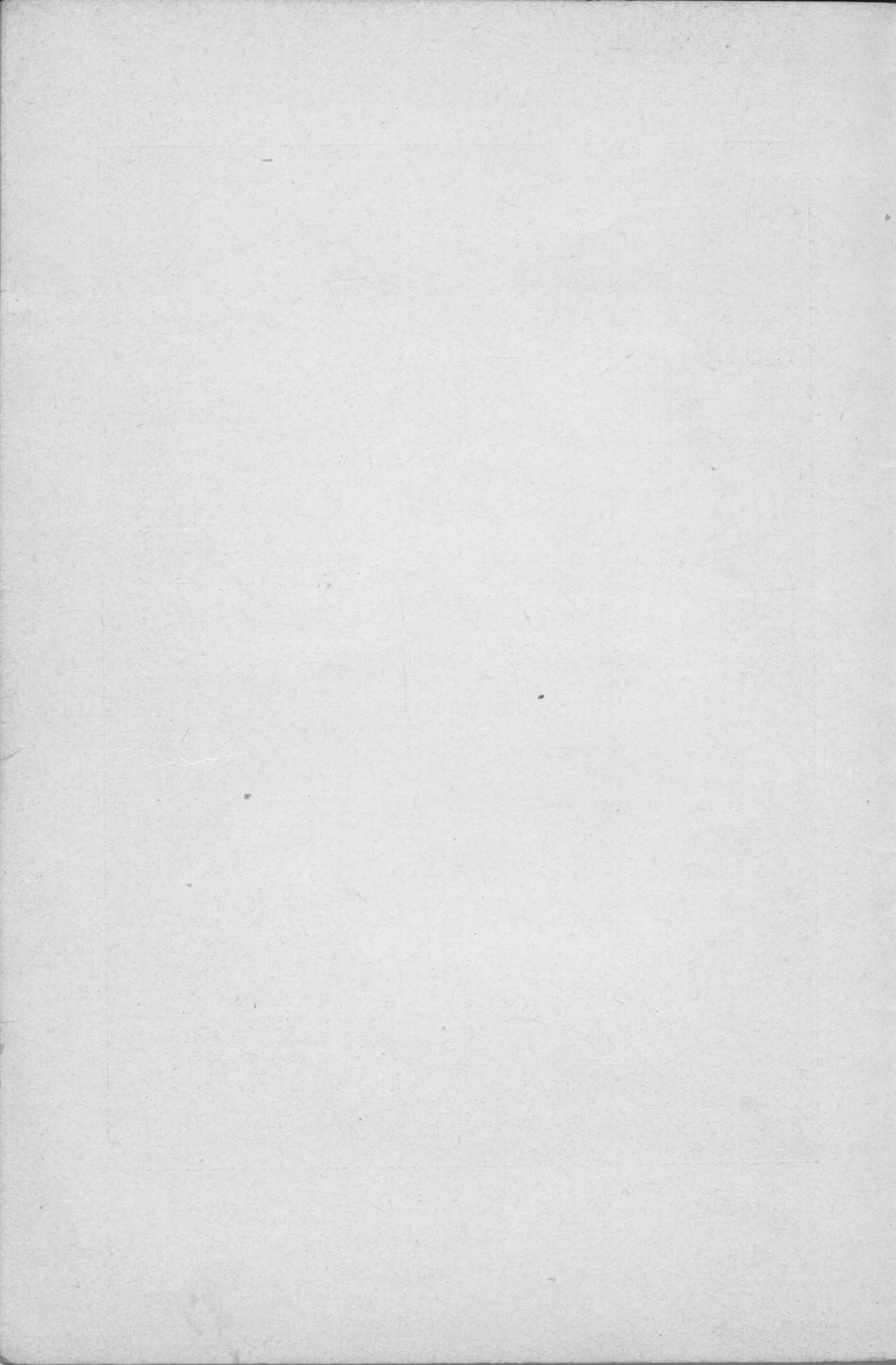

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS AS SHOWN IN REPORTS OF  
COMMITTEES

REPORT OF THE AUDITING COMMITTEE

To the Seventeenth Annual Session of the West Gold Coast Conference.—GREETINGS:

We, your Auditing Committee beg leave to submit the following report:

We have carefully gone through the books of the Circuits and find as follows:

(1) **Secondee.**—(Rev. Isaac Sackey, Pastor).—Only minor errors and the account is passed.

(2) **Koforidua.**—(Rev. Okyir, Pastor)—Account passed.

(3) **Akyim Abuakwa.**—(Rev. A. K. Eshun, Pastor).—In this account although a deficit is reported yet the sum of £23 was left in the hands of a special Treasurer, the whole or part of this amount is still on hand. It is shown, however, that £23 was paid into the treasury as a Special Offering and this might justify the sum being placed out for a special purpose. We pass the account.

(4) **Ashanti & Ashanti Oyoko.**—(Rev. Isaac Cole, Pastor)—Account passed.

(5) **Wassaw Circuit.**—(Under temporary supervision of Rev. Addo). The account passed with a small Surplus balance.

(6) **Twufu Circuit.**—(Rev. Addo, Pastor)—Account passed.

(7) **Akyim Kotoku Circuit.**—(Rev. P. D. Ofosuhene, Pastor).—While we are loathe to accept the explanations given by the Pastor of this Circuit for the sudden rise in salaries of some Teachers for September and December quarters, we allow the account.

(8) **Winnebah Circuit.**—(Rev. G. B. Enniful, Pastor)—We could not pass these accounts and recommend that they remain in abeyance until more substantial proofs are brought forward to support the various items.

(9) **Elmina.**—(Under the supervision of Cape Coast Pastor).—Account passed.

(10) **Cape Coast Circuit.**—(Rev. D. K. Brown, Pastor).—This is the only pastor who presented receipts in support of his expenditure and we were therefore able to give this Circuit a more thorough checking than any other. Since this Committee received the accounts, an additional £5.11.6 has been turned over to the Conference on the Native Missionary Fund; £42.9/—found short in the School Accounts has been refunded to the Treasury. We recommend:

- (a) That £3/2/2 loan from the School for cable to New York City.
- (b) That £11/17/—for Conference Year Book loan to the Church
- (c) That £7/2/—loan to Mr. Bresi Andoh be returned to the School Treasury.

The Statement regarding receipts does not apply to £15 said to have been paid on account of purchase of land upon which the Junior School Building stands and we urge an immediate investigation into this matter as we stand to lose not only the land but the building also if arrangements are not speedily made with the present owner.

**Rev. F. A. Osam Pinanko's Account.**—We suggest that this be referred to the Foreign Mission Board.

**General Recommendations.**—(1) That in future all accounts close at the end of the month prior to the sitting of the Annual Conference.

(2) That the present system of keeping the accounts be changed so as to prevent general Claims appearing with the expenditure and that only actual payments be inserted as expended.

(3) That before proceeding to Conference the Pastor cast up his accounts and insert under "present indebtedness" all amounts due and owing to creditors including Teachers, Missionary Pastors and Catechists with names.

(4) That School and Church Accounts be kept distinctly separate.

(5) That full amounts of Government Grants to the School be entered in the School Cash Book immediately upon receipt and not by means of apportionment.

(6) That the School Income be kept in the hands of the Treasurer and used for the sole purpose of maintaining the Schools.

(7) That all increase in salaries in Church and School be made in March quarter and only with the consent of the Bishop or his representative.

(8) That all receipts be brought to the Conference so as to allow correct checking.

(9) That the Circuit Books be audited at least once in a quarter.

5 That no debt shall be contracted by the School Manager without the concurrence of the Board of Education provided that nothing shall be done to invalidate any existing obligation to any such schools.

6 That the Board of Education shall have the power to direct the curriculum in the schools of our Conference.

7 That any member of the Board of Education of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church shall have power to examine or inspect any of our schools within his district or circuit of operation, whether the school is assisted or non-assisted in order to improve its conditions as requested by Educational code of the Colony.

8 All Building Plans must be submitted to The Board after having been approved by the Government Board of Education.

1 That in view of the fact that this Colony having grown so enormously in Intemperance, that even Nigeria the largest of the four colonies cannot compare its revenue figures in Liquor Traffic with those of this country, all our Traveling Preachers and other Church offices be requested to enforce Temperance in the homes and villages of our Church Members

2 That the use of Strong Drinks at Christian Funerals be entirely prohibited from now.

3 That Temperance Sermons be preached in our Churches at least once a quarter, and that each Circuit Pastor shall report to the Annual Conference the number of such sermons preached during each Conference year.

4 That Members who violate the Temperance Rules be disciplined accordingly after due warning, and the number of such cases, if any, be reported to the Conference.

5 That a Temperance Campaign be held by our Church in the month of November.

- 1 That Ashanti Kumasi and Ashanti Oyoko Circuits should be re-arranged thus: (a) Ashanti Kumasi Circuit should comprise Kumasi, Oyoko, Dadiasi, Ekrofunsu, Ndobem and other neighboring villages. (b) Ashanti Akyim Circuit should comprise Bompata and other stations.
- 2 We further recommend that Cape Coast Circuit should cover or include Kwaduagya, Elmina and Salt Pond Stations.
- 3 That Akyim Kotoku Circuit should be divided into two as follows—(a) Akyim Kotoku and Osenasi Abuakwa.
  - (a) Akyim Kotoku should comprise Arkrosu, Mansu, Esuosu, Anamasi, Esuboi and Eshiem.
  - (b) Osenasi Abuakwa to comprise Osenasi, Akyim Bosu and Esuoko.
- 4 That Winnebah Circuit should take charge of Bobikuma while Akyim Kotoku should take charge of Eshiem.

5 That the West Gold Coast Conference should extend from Accra upwards and the hinterland.

## COMMITTEE ON HOME AND DOMESTIC RELATIONS

Bishop and Brethren:

We your Committee on Home and Domestic Relations beg leave to submit the following report:

1 That Family prayers be observed in the homes of our members and that all our workers, ministers, catechists and teachers co-operate with parents in the home to inculcate in the minds of the children the habits, moral and spiritual, which go to form sound character.

2 That Home should be regarded by our members as the haven for the family life; and respective members pay due respect to each other, each esteeming the other better than himself.

3 That no form of slavery should be indulged in and encouraged, but as members of the Church of Christ the dignity and value of human life should be upheld and exemplified in each domestic circle and home.

4 Polygamy though an integral factor of Society and regarded with pride in the domestic life of native Africans, yet all our members should be encouraged, especially those who have not made marriage contracts (Native or Christian) to be the husband of one wife.

5 That where a number of wives were taken before application for membership, the applicant should not be required to put away any of his wives, but he can only be grouped with those whom John Wesley regarded as "awakened" and classified as probationers". But if he voluntarily elects to do so, he be required to make provision for the discarded wives.

6 That marriages executed and entered into according to native custom, before contracting parties became members of the Church, should be regarded just as binding as one contracted according to Western usage.

7 That any member contracting a marriage which is polygamous after having been admitted to our communion, is a transgressor and is liable to discipline.

8 That the formula for the blessing of a native marriage as drawn up by the Bishop is hereby adopted by this Conference.

## FORMULA TO BE USED IN BLESSING NATIVE MARRIAGES

Dearly beloved:—

Marriage is an ancient and honourable custom, ordained by God, in order to provide a help-meet for man, protection for woman, and social companionship for both.

Our fore-fathers wisely conformed to the natural law, thus providing and guarding against many alternative evils, resultant from lack of matrimonial relations.

But having come to a fuller recognition of the claims of the family upon its duly constituted head, we here and now enter into solemn agreement to forsake all others, and keep only one to the other; and we pledge our faith to love, honour, comfort and care each for other, in sickness or in health, in prosperity or adversity, so long as we both shall live.

Question:—Do you solemnly engage to perform and keep this vow and covenant between you made?

Answer:—We do.

(Minister shall then say): Forasmuch as M. and N. have previously consented together in native wedlock; and have pledged their faith either to other, and now witness the same before God and this company, I invoke the blessing of our Heavenly Father upon them as husband and wife, in the name of the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Those whom God hath joined together, let not man put asunder. Amen.

Let us pray:

O Blessed Lord God, Creator of marriage and preserver of all ennobling social customs, the dispenser of all good gifts and author of eternal salvation. Grant Thy blessing in large abundance to this man and woman, whose marriage we now publicly recognize in Thy name; and to whose mutual agreement we give the sanction of Thy Church. May they in sincerity and fidelity perform and keep the vow and covenant between them made; ever remain in perfect love and domestic tranquility together, and live according to the dictates of Thy law, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



## EXTRACTS FROM MINUTES OF EAST GOLD COAST CONFERENCE

THE East Gold Coast Conference met at Quittah on April 1, 1925. Rt. Rev. Cameron C. Alleyne presided.

The reading of the Episcopal address occasioned much discussion. The pronouncements re the marriage question were highly commended. The Conference acquiesced and felt that the situation with reference to native marriages would be greatly relieved.

The committee on the proposed Industrial School at Accra reported. The chiefs have given three square miles of land, well located and of easy access, four miles from the city as the site on which to erect the West Africa National and Industrial Institute. They pledge enthusiastic support morally and financially.

The Bishop was requested to return to America and do all in his power to raise funds for this much needed school. The Salvation of the African must proceed along lines such as are followed by Tuskegee and Hampton. The report was unanimously adopted.

The day schools were reported in excellent condition. Our students at the Government Training College were reported as doing well. They are among the youngest and brightest in the Institution. Mr. T. B. Asani, who was trained in the Quittah school, led the colony in the recent teachers' examinations.

A vote of thanks prevailed to the Home Church for the return of Rev. and Mrs. Peters; and the assignment of a resident-Bishop to supervise the work.

The conference raised in its Sunday collections the sum of £34, or one hundred and sixty-five dollars.

The programme on woman's night was very enjoyable. Mrs. A. Lucile Alleyne presided and a magnificent sum was raised.

Progress was reported and many new stations admitted.

## SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

As we have much interest in the spiritual life of our workers and some of them are anxious to take up the work of the ministry we ask that plans be made whereby they may study. An appropriation could be laid aside to purchase such books as might be helpful to them and they be required to buy the books required for preparation.

We ask that those teachers who are serving on the outstations some of them at the small salary of one pound a month be given a small grant from the conference by way of encouragement and assistance as the financial condition of the conference warrants.

That we shall develop Mission farms for the support of the work as farming is the most profitable enterprise in the district.

That we shall consider very seriously the work among the women and the girls and send to America our continued petitions for Women Missionaries to help us carry on this most needed labour of love.

That we appoint a committee to send to America such resolutions of thanks as shall be deemed proper to convey to them our gratitude for the appointment of a Bishop for the African work and our esteem for the providential assignment of the present Episcopate the Rt. Rev. C. C. Alleyne and gracious presence of his wife, all of which is of great import to the work and should call forth our most earnest endeavors.

That we thank them for the return of Bro. Pomeyie our delegate to us and ask their continued interest and support in the work.

## REPORT OF ACTING MANAGER

To the Bishop, Presiding Elder, Pastors, Officers and members of the East Gold Coast Annual Conference; Greeting:—

It has given me a great pleasure to have the opportunity of presenting a report to the Conference on the general affairs of the Mission.

2. I was appointed Chairman-Treasurer at the Executive Committee Meeting held in August 1923, presided over by the Acting Pastor Rev. Mrs. H. J. Peters. The object of this appointment was explained to be, that I should hold for the Mission, all moneys that should have been raised at the Special Education Rally which was held in .....1923.

3. In February 1924 the Acting Pastor further appointed me the Treasurer for the 25th Anniversary Fund, in subscription of which Envelopes were distributed to all the Members and Friends of the Mission to pledge sums to be paid in whole or by installments beginning from February 1924 to February this year. The pledged Envelopes returned and amount paid to me up to this time, are shown in the statement of accounts below.

4. In March 1924 the lot has again fallen upon me to act as Manager of the Schools of the Mission in this District on the occasion of the departure to the United States, of the Manager the Rev. Henrietta J. Peters accompanied by Mr. S. Athan Pomeyie.

5. As the Manager of the Schools, I became responsible for the payments of Salaries to the Teachers, and equipments of the Schools.

6. There are four Assisted Schools that were inspected by H. M. Inspector of Schools in the year under review, namely Keta Junior and Senior, Agbosome and Penyi. There are five Non-Assisted Schools namely, Sadame, Avenopeme, Gui, Bayive and Hevi. The last two having been closed in February this year owing to lack of funds to maintain them.

7. There were four visits made by me during the year under review to the Assisted Schools outside Keta, but no visits made to those not on the Assisted List.

8. There were three new buildings erected, one at Sadame, one at Penyi, and one at Avenopeme, and five now in course of erection, one at Agbosome, two at Penyi, one at Gui and one at Bayive.

9. EVENING CLASSES:— But for Mr. Arnold C. Acorlor the headmaster of the School, there would have been no more evening classes held. The number of scholars now on roll is seventeen, Teachers two. The classes have made fair progress.

10. REQUIREMENTS:— For more efficient working of the Schools, we require at Keta two separate rooms for the Fourth Standard Class and the Kindergarten, general equipments, and two more certificated Teachers, for Agbosome and Penyi Stations.

CLOSING REMARKS: I am happy to state that of the eight of my Teachers that sat for the Teachers Examination in Schedules G. H. and I. in December last, each was successful in obtaining one or more

Certificates with the exception of one. If there has been any success achieved during my tenure of the Management of the Schools, that success has been greatly contributed to, by the diligence, enthusiasm and energy of the staff of Teachers, especially the Headmaster of each School.

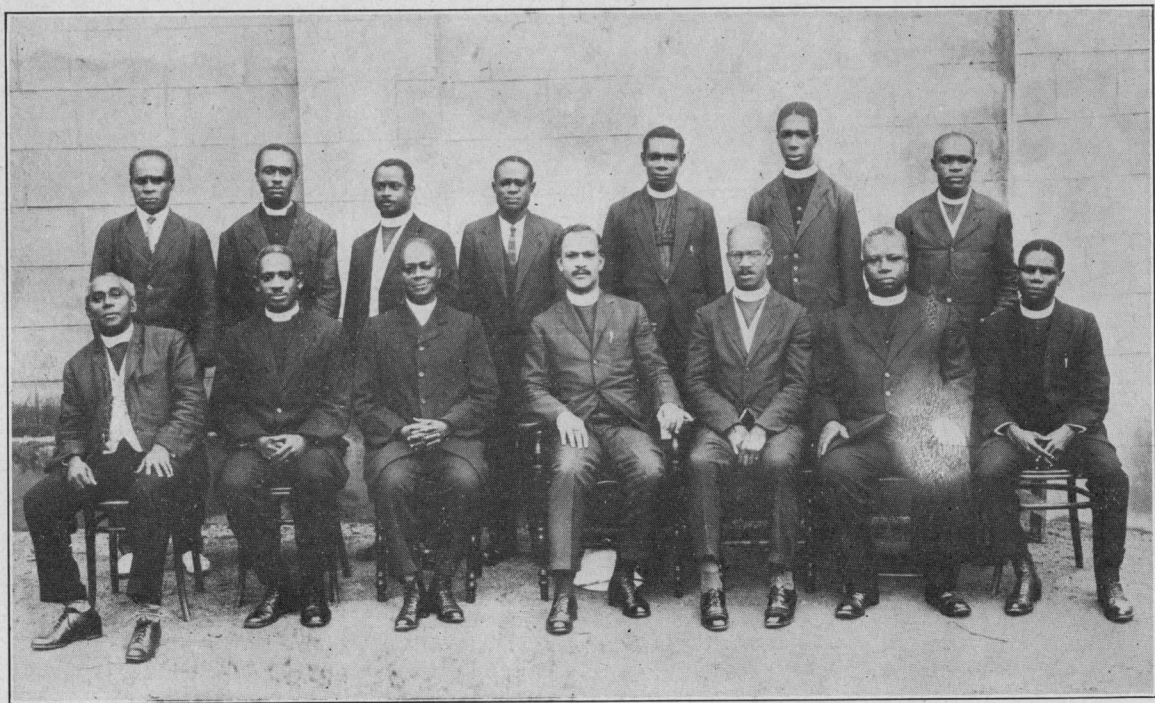
