



HE PHILOMATHIANS CLUB was organized in 1932, when Mrs. Vivian Cook and Mrs. Vashti Murphy were recalling cultural enjoyments in association with other women in St. Louis and Washington. In addition, the idea of expressing appreciation for the accomplishments of women was advanced. The two of them got together on it and there was our club in embryo. Sixteen additional women joined in the venture. Mrs. Olive Maxwell suggested the name and so we became the Philomathians.

The aims of the club are:

To study Modern Trends.

To honor women who have made outstanding local and national contributions.

Several of the original members are now making their homes in places outside of Baltimore. Others have joined us so that we maintain an active membership of eighteen as in the beginning.

Once a month we have explored the by-ways of liberal culture by having gifted members of the club, distinguished speakers and travellers discuss with us topics related to literature, art, music, drama, religion, politics, progressive education and social phenomena.

More valuable than this intellectual and cultural leaven, however, has been the development of a delightful fellowship that is our deepest and most lasting satisfaction.


