Friend Steel

Your letter came
duly to hand, and was

I find myself stationed
here at the foot of Canal
St. quarreling loot-property,
Etc. I have a Squad of
men and four non-com-
-missioned Officers under
my charge. I suppose
I shall be obliged to
remain here until the
expedition starts, which
(I should judge) will be a
number of days yet.
You know large bodies
move slow.
The Transports that are

being fitted out - are not
such as would be able to
stand the Gulf Storms
So I guess we shall not
go to Texas.

The 116 Regt. is quartered
at the Park Barracks
The "Boys" are crazy to see
the "sights" and it is a
hard matter to keep them
in long enough to drill
We have rec'd our arms, and
are drilling in the manual
of arms. I should be very
much pleased to see your
brother, but I cannot leave
here at all. I have command
of the Post and have to see to
all the freight that comes here for
the Expedition
