

Baltimore April 4th 1836

D. S. Sir

Mr. Cator and I have agreed with Mr. Howard, that Mr. Katherby, with his assistance and under your immediate direction, shall proceed immediately with the dispoⁿ of that part of the Court's order which has been made to you. For this purpose it will be proper that Mr. Katherby should meet Mr. Howard and you, at some convenient time and place, in order to settle the plan of operation. Mr. Howard will attend at any time and place which you & Mr. Katherby will appoint. On Monday week he will probably be in town, for the purpose of meeting Mr. Green, who is to undertake that part of the work, which is to be done in this neighborhood. Perhaps the day after would be

be a convenient time for you & Mr. Ketchum
to see him. If you will inform me of the
time & place that will suit you, I will
convey the information to Mr. Howard.
