

Saturday Morning.
 April 8th, 1826.

My dear Grandfather,

I send you, according to your request, a full list of all the bills as yet brought against my Father's estate, and another of all the debts that I have paid until now. The former, you will see, amount to \$7137.56; the latter, to \$4399.98: leaving still due \$2738.42 $\frac{1}{4}$; including Jones's debt, and all others except W. Oliver's.

The receipts for nearly all these bills yet paid are in

your possession. You sent
to me for them, a few
days before I went to the
south, and I gave them
to you. In the course of
a week or so, I shall
call on you for them to
present them at the
Orphan's Court, and by
winding up the admi-
nistration relieve you
of all further risks as
security for me.
