RATES OF POSTAGE.

LETTERS not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce in weight, to any part of the United States, not over 3000 miles, 3 cents; If over 3000 miles, 10 cents. (California and Oregon, 10 cents.) Letters weighing over $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. and not over 1 oz. double these rates. *Must be prepaid in all cases.*

DROP LETTERS, 1 cent. May be prepaid or not.

ADVERTISED LETTERS, 1 cent, in addition to the regular rate.

VALUABLE LETTERS may be registered by application at the office of mailing, and the payment of a registration fee of 5 cents.

TO CANADA and other British North American provinces, when not over 3000 miles, 10 cents for each $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. When over 3000 miles, 15 cents. Prepayment optional.

TO GREAT BRITAIN or Ireland, 24 cents; but if sent to or from California, or Oregon, 29 cents. Prepayment optional.

TO FRANCE, 15 cents for each $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. Prepayment optional.

LETTERS to other FOREIGN COUNTRIES, vary in rate according to the route by which they are sent, and the proper information can be obtained of any Post-master in the United States.

NEWSPAPERS, Periodicals, Unsealed Circulars, or other articles of printed matter (except books,) when sent to any part of the United States, and weighing not over 3 oz. 1 cent, and for every additional oz. or part thereof, 1 cent. If within the State, and not weighing over $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. $\frac{1}{2}$ cent.

WEEKLY NEWSPAPERS (one copy only) sent to actual subscribers within the County where printed and published, FREE.

BOOKS, bound or unbound, not weighing over 4 lbs. for any distance under 3000 miles, 1 cent per oz.; over 3000 miles, 2 cents per oz. The above must be prepaid.

DAGUERREOTYPES will be charged with letter postage by weight.

NO PACKAGE will be forwarded (except books) which weighs over 3 pounds.

morning every thing quiet.

FRIDAY 10.

Today is clear we are still
in our camps this morning
and every thing quiet up
to this time today no news
of any importance all the
today worthy of note.

June,

SATURDAY 11,

1864

We broke our camp near
Cole harbor about 4 1/2 o'clock
this morning and moved
towards White house land
ing. every thing appeared
quiet in front today.

SUNDAY 12.

Today we are still laying
encamped. there is nothing
of much account going on
today there was a little
confounding last night
and early this morning.

MONDAY 13.

We broke camp about 6 o'clock
last night and
crossed the Chickahomany
river about 4 o'clock this
morning without any
interuption.

June,

TUESDAY 14,

1864

We started on the march again about 6 o'clock last night and we are now laying upon the James river. The thing is apparently Dutch here to day.

WEDNESDAY 15.

Today is clear and very warm we are still laying near the James river under cover of the gun boats. There is a little cannonading to be heard at a distance all night here.

THURSDAY 16.

We broke camp this morning about day light and marched to the James river and crossed in three parts. When we remained about 2 hours and took up the march ^{again}.

June,

FRIDAY 17,

1864

We were laying on the left of our line till about sundown when we moved toward the right in reserve. Our Regt. lost 2 men wounded today.

SATURDAY 18.

This morning we moved to the left. Throughout skirmish and advanced in line of battle we had one man killed out of the regiment on the skirmish line and one wounded by shell.

SUNDAY 19.

Today we still lay in the woods on the left of our line of battle. Some little skirmishing and cannonading through the day none on the Regt hurt.

June, MONDAY 20, 1864

We are still in the woods in the day time and go out in the entrenchments at night. There was considerable shelling done here on the left tonight but no one in the Regt hurt.

TUESDAY 21.

Everything quiet in front of our Co's. The regiments Co's moved to the left of the line this morning. Considerable cannonading on the right in the afternoon.

WEDNESDAY 22.

We laid quiet in our same old position till about 5 o'clock in the afternoon when there was a break made on part of the 2nd Co's and we went to the left to support them.

June, THURSDAY 23, 1864

We laid quiet all day till about 4 o'clock when we moved on the extreme left and threw up entrenchments on the flank we left the entrenchments again about 10 o'clock returned about a mile back & camped for the night.

FRIDAY 24.

We staid on the left till about 5 o'clock when we returned to the center again. Very heavy cannonading for about 3 hours yesterday. Musket firing appears to be ^{king} over the ^{line} ~~front~~ ^{front} ~~line~~.

SATURDAY 25.

We laid still all day. Nothing going on of much importance. We received orders to go out on front line after dark and send one company on the skirmish line. Considerable firing while relieving

June,

SUNDAY 26,

1864

Today we were lying in the entrenchments till after dark when we were ordered out as skirmishers. every thing quiet except a little skirmish firing on the line ^{7:30} & struck

MONDAY 27.

Today we are skirmishing. One on the line hurt out of our Regt one man wounded in the best works by a stray shot, we were relieved about 9 o'clock by Company B

TUESDAY 28.

Today there is considerable skirmishing going on and a little Cannonading. None of the Company on duty today because some going against the Camp today.

June,

WEDNESDAY 29,

1864

Today is clear and very warm nothing going on except a little skirmishing and Cannonading. None of our Company on duty today. we are still out on the front line

THURSDAY 30.

Today has been very quiet. None of the Company on duty. The skirmishes are going on but quiet. There was continual firing with shotters all night. There was some thing burning all night

July,

FRIDAY 1.

Today is clear and very warm. One man out of the Pennell Legion shot seriously and hurt. Skirmishing going on but heavy Cannonading almost all night every part of the morning

July,

SATURDAY 2,

1864

Today is Clear and very warm

We have had a steady rain all day and it still has the appearance of a rainy night nothing of much importance going on here none of the Co on duty.

July, WEDNESDAY 20, 1864

Today is still cloudy but
