

Camp Near Knoxville July 16th

Dear Sister

I take this present opportunity of writing a few lines to you to let you know that I am well at present we arrived here today about noon we may lay here a day or two. Before we cross the river I put a letter that I had partly wrote a few days ago in the office at Knoxville yesterday with that likeness in that I mentioned to you in one of my other letters I expect make you will get it the same time you get this one we are doing very hard marching now we marched about 20 miles yesterday I am in a rather bad fix for I have run out of money and there is no telling when we will get any more I would like you to send me a letter or some of your letters for I have just paper and stamps to write you a more letter you might put 50 cents in a letter once in a while till you hear from me and I will write and let you know when I get it I have a kind of an idea that

that they wont take this regiment very far away
from hear because about one half of our men
time of service is out and this has got to be
the smallest Corps in the field for they got cut
up very bad at Gettysburg and one brigade
time is expired We are in the 1st Army Corps
3 division & brigade of the army of the potomac
When you direct again direct to

Co A. Maryland Regiment Vols
3 division & brigade 1st Corps Army of the potomac
I have not got time to write any more now
So I will close my letter the next letter you write
put 50 cents in and if it comes I will know weather
it will be safe to send for any more I am a looking
for some of your letters that you have wrote
this month to home
