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HOW TO KEEP PARISH RECORDS

Every Parish and Mission should keep three books or sets of books. The PARISH REGISTER is kept by the Rector; the MINUTE BOOK by the Clerk of the Vestry; the FINANCIAL ACCOUNT BOOKS by the Treasurer. All three are to be open to all proper parties at all times.

The PARISH REGISTER contains the vital records of the Parish, and is legal evidence as to births, marriages, and burials. It is to be examined by the Bishop at his annual visitation. The records should be entered *immediately* upon performance of any office, by the minister himself. The Marriage Record should invariably be signed by each of those parties specified in the Canon. [In the larger Registers, the Marriage Register constitutes a second volume.]

All permanent entries should be recorded in black ink. Temporary memoranda as to Communicants—as “can’t find”, “ceased to communicate”, etc.—if made, should be in pencil as easy to erase and not proper as matter of permanent record. No name should ever be erased or scratched. Every name, once entered, must be accounted for in the Register. Where communicants are transferred to another Parish, enter “transferred to A. B.”, with date. If Letter of Transfer is not issued, enter “removed to A. B.” It is wise in such instances, to apprise the Rector of the parish into which such parties have moved.

A new name entered on any page should also be entered in the Index. The Index should refer to each page upon which any name is entered for any purpose.

Suitable blanks and certificates for Marriage, Letters of Transfer, Applications for Baptism and other offices, Blanks for Family Record, etc., may be obtained from the Publishers of this Register.

My other concern is the minimal amount of participation by members of the congregation in the variety of activities that are being offered by the Diocese. I hope that we will have the benefit of more participation by the members and that you will actively promote the same.

I am grateful for the good things that you have done for the mission of the church in that area.

ST. JOHNS OBSERVES
40TH ANNIVERSARY

Ladies Guild Entertains Vestry
And Members Of Parish

INTERESTING PAPER
ON CHURCH HISTORY

Wife Of Rector Presents Information.
Opening Of Birthday Envelopes Af-
fords Much Amusement And Brings
Neat Sum For Church.

In honor of the fortieth anniver-
sary of St. Johns P. E. Church of this
city, the Ladies Guild entertained the
Vestry and members of the Parish, at
the home of Miss Blanche Riggin on
Somerset Avenue last Wednesday eve-
ning.

A beautiful cake with forty candles,
decorated in the church colors and a
gold cross in the center, adorned the
center of the table. After a business
meeting from 8 until 9, the remainder
of the evening was spent in social
entertainment. Mrs. Hugh V. Clary,
wife of the rector, read a very inter-
esting paper on the history of the
church dating back to the days of old
Rehoboth.

The opening of the birthday envel-
opes afforded much amusement and
brought in a neat sum which has been
added to the repair fund of the
church.

St. Johns Church had its beginning
with the holding of services in Cris-
field in 1883. The services were held
in the town hall and had to be aban-
doned after a few weeks. Another ef-
fort was made to establish a Protest-
ant Episcopal Mission in Crisfield in
1888, and for three years following
alternate Sunday night services were
held and much interest awakened.
The Rector then took steps to build a
chapel here and the lot on Main Street
was secured on which St. Johns Church
was originally built. The cornerstone
of the new church was laid on Friday,
July 23, under the direction of Rev.
Oliver H. Murphy, the Rector; and on
January 9, the Rt. Rev. William F.
Adams, D. D., Bishop of the Diocese,
consecrated the new church.

Among the Rectors who have serv-
ed St. Johns from its establishment
until the present were: Rev. Oliver
H. Murphy until 1892; Rev. E. W.
Jones, 1892-1898; Rev. Stephen J.
Morgan, June, 1898-November 1899;
Rev. Wyllys Rede, February 1900-De-
cember 1900; Rev. H. McD. Martin,
July 1901-September 1902; Rev. John
Vernon Ashworth, September 1903-
March 1917; Rev. Jerome M. Wright,
1918; Rev. J. Frederick Virgin, March
1921-1923; Rev. Frank H. King, Jan-
uary 1924-June 1924; Rev. Walter
Archbold, October 1924-June 1925;
Rev. Delber W. Clark, June 1925-De-
cember 1927; Rev. Hugh V. Clary,
present Rector, June 1, 1928.

In the Name of God, Amen.

Forasmuch as on a former day, by our predecessor, the Bishop of the Diocese of Easton, according to the order of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, this fabric was duly consecrated and hallowed by the name of St. John's Church, St. Bartholomew's Parish, Crisfield, Maryland; and

Forasmuch as his Sentence of Consecration has been of full force and effect until this date:

We, William McClelland, Bishop of the Diocese aforesaid, do hereby declare said Sentence of our Right Reverend predecessor to be revoked and canonically annulled, and do hereby revoke and annul the same, and do remit this fabric and the appurtenances thereof to secular and common uses for any lawful and reputable employment by honest men, for their good and honourable work, business, or profession, according to the laws of this land.

And this fabric, accordingly, is hereby forever secularized and the Sentence aforesaid is voided and revoked, and this place, heretofore a holy place, and sacred to the preaching of God's holy Word, and the ministration of His holy Sacraments, is hereby pronounced secular and unconsecrated, and no longer within our canonical jurisdiction, but given back solely to the protection of the laws of the land, and to none other than such common uses and secular control as by said laws are recognized and allowed.

Given under our hand and seal, in the City of Crisfield in the State of Maryland, and before divers witnesses duly published within the walls of the fabric aforesaid, on this second day of August in the year of our Lord God and Saviour Jesus Christ one thousand nine hundred forty four.

Leaders Dead

Fr. Mac Donald-Miller

Sixty-two years a priest in the Episcopal Church, The Rev. Donald MacDonald-Millar died on Easter Even, April 21, at his home in Crisfield, Maryland.

Fr. MacDonald-Millar was born in Nashville, Tenn., on July 13, 1884. He graduated from the General Theological Seminary in 1910 and was ordained to the Diaconate and the Priesthood that same year. Except for two years as Rector of St. John's, Columbia, South Carolina, he spent all his ministry in the Diocese of New York before retiring in

1952. His last charge in that Diocese was St. Andrew's in the Bronx. On retirement, Fr. MacDonald-Millar moved to the Eastern Shore and served the Church faithfully as Priest-in-Charge of St. Paul's Church, St. Bartholomew's Parish, Marion Station, until advancing age forced him to relinquish that responsibility three years ago.

The Rev. Mr. MacDonald-Millar had a life-long interest in architecture. He was a member of the National Association for Antiquities and was frequently consulted in connection with the restoration of historical monuments, including Andrew Jackson's Heritage and the House of Seven Gables. He was involved in the early restoration plans for Williamsburg.

He designed the parish hall at St. Paul's and the reredos in the church. He was also a well versed liturgist and contended that the Bishop's pastoral staff should be presented to him at the time of consecration along with the Bible in accordance with ancient custom. Fr. MacDonald-Millar designed the pastoral staff our Bishop carries with him on Episcopal visitations.

Fr. MacDonald-Millar is survived by his wife, the former Willo Marie Hicker.

The Burial Office was said at St. Paul's by the Bishop assisted by the Lay Reader-in-Charge who is a candidate for Holy Orders, together with the Dean and other clergy of the Southern Convocation of our Diocese. The interment was in St. Paul's Churchyard.

OBITUARY

Donald Macdonald Millar - 1884-1973. The work of one of America's senior architectural historians has come to a close. Donald Millar was born in Nashville, Tennessee, 13 July 1884, and died at Crisfield, Maryland, 21 April 1973. He was trained as an architect and worked with a firm in Nashville; but his principal education was at the Theological Seminary in New York City, and he was ordained as an Episcopal minister. Like many nineteenth century English clergymen, who promoted the Gothic Revival, architecture always was of primary interest to the Reverend Donald Millar.

He met William Sumner Appleton in 1910, at the time of the founding of the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities, and as a result set to work measuring, analyzing and making restored drawings of seventeenth century and later New England, East Coast and Southern houses. He wrote a number of articles, which were published with numerous illustrations in the *Architectural Record*, *Old-Time New England*, the *Pennsylvania Museum Bulletin* and others; and between 1916-30 three large volumes of his *Measured Drawings of Some Colonial and Georgian Houses* were brought out in New York. Professor Fiske Kimball borrowed heavily from Millar's material for his series of lectures on American architecture given at The Metropolitan Museum of Art in 1920, and he used illustrations and notes from the same source for his monumental book, *Domestic Architecture of the American Colonies and of the Early Republic*, issued several years later by Charles Scribner. Unlike lesser men, Prof. Kimball was scrupulous about giving due credit for his borrowings. We are indebted to Donald Millar for our knowledge of the pristine form of several important early houses, such as the Arthur Allen house (Bacon's Castle) in Virginia, the Reverend Joseph Capen house at Topsfield, the John Ward and John Turner (House of the Seven Gables) houses in Salem, Massachusetts, the George Müller (the miller's) house at Milbach, Pennsylvania, and the Jean Hasbrouck house at New Paltz, New York.

Farther afield, Millar investigated and made restored drawings of notable houses in his home state of Tennessee, especially Andrew Jackson's home, *The Hermitage*, outside Nashville, for which his advice was sought in its restoration. He also worked on buildings in Great Britain: the Dr. Samuel Johnson house in London was rebuilt after devastating war damage from Millar's drawings and notes. In 1925 the Architectural Book Publishing Company of New York issued his *Measured Drawings of Colonial Furniture*, a volume of large plates. The Rev. Donald Millar also designed many houses and special features of houses, often based upon historic buildings. He was aided in his work by the Foundation for Research in American Art. During the early days of the project, he was engaged by the Williamsburg Holding Corporation, later Williamsburg Restoration, Inc., making a trip to England in the interest of finding material.

His mother being the last of the Macdonald line from Sleathe in Skye, in the late 1920s he had his name changed to Donald Macdonald-Millar. His father's people also were Scottish, coming from County Caithness. His publications may be found under both styles.

In 1940 he married Marie Hecker, who had been a nurse in China and spoke Chinese, and who provided an exotic note and the best of cooking to the household. For many years the Rev. Donald Macdonald-Millar presided over a church and parish at Clason Point, New York. He went into semi-retirement in 1952, and the Macdonald-Millars moved to Crisfield, Maryland, where he held services for 18 years in a church at Marion, St. Paul's Episcopal, built in 1848 after a design by Richard Upjohn. The building had been neglected and was restored under his direction, and the congregation was revived. It is fitting that he should have been buried at its doorway.

The Rev. Donald Macdonald-Millar is remembered by his friends as a great raconteur, not a few of his stories having to do with the investigation of houses. One pertains to a detached kitchen in Charleston, currently used as the maid's room. He was fascinated over recording a chain connection from a spit to a crank at the side of the fireplace. The occupant of the room had threaded strips of crepe paper through the mechanism to disguise its mundane function, which had to be removed for completing the drawing. He was unable to get them back. The maid was standing in the door, arms akimbo, when he departed. His reversed collar notwithstanding, as he walked past her she said: "Sir, the proper place for the white gentleman is in the white lady's parlor, and not messing around a colored woman's bedroom."

His mind was repeatedly turning to verse, reciting it and composing it. In the mid-1940s he wrote a poem based upon a passage in Talbot Hamlin's *Greek Revival Architecture in America*, defining the influence of the books of Peter Nicholson, which was the title of the poem. The first verse goes:

*If you seek to build a house
In the Neo-Grecian style,
With "Venetian" doors and windows,
A superbly classic pile -
You will find the Why and Wherefore,
The Lay-out and the How -
In the books once used by workmen
To bring the Past up to the Now -
The Books of Peter Nicholson.*

Donald Macdonald-Millar's original drawings have gone to appropriate repositories. Those of buildings in Massachusetts and surrounding states have gone to the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities. Those of Tennessee houses have been sent to the state library. And those of buildings in Scotland have been given to The Clan Donald Society in Edinburgh.

Mrs. Mayne A. Collins Died Last Thursday

A long career of public service came to an end Thursday evening of last week when Mrs. Mayne A. Collins, widow of the late H. Edward Collins and daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James H. Cullen, died in a hospital in Cambridge, Md., where she had been a patient a short time, in her 83rd year.

Born in the Asbury section, she was schooled in political matters at an early age by her father, who at the time was a prominent Democratic leader in Somerset, and as a young woman she became active in public affairs and remained that way until her death.

For some years Mrs. Collins taught school, and married a school teacher, who later became the hydrographic engineer for the State Conservation Commission.

In 1934 she was the first Eastern Shore woman to be elected to the Maryland House of Delegates, where she served two terms. She was a charter member and for years chairman of the United Democratic Womens Clubs of the Eastern Shore, and was president of the United Democratic Club of Somerset County for a long time. She also was a member of the National Order of Women Legislators.

In 1955 she was elected president of the Senior Auxiliary Board of the McCready Memorial Hospital here, and she initiated and carried out each year an "Open House" on her birthday, Jan. 9th, at which contributions were received for use of the hospital. A small Chapel was recently built in the hospital by money received in this manner.

After her husband's death, she was appointed adult educational director of the Eastern Shore under the Public Works Administration and organized nursery schools and adult educational classes throughout the shore.

For a number of years she also took a position as clerk in the House of Delegates in Annapolis while the Legislature was in session.

She was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, near Marion Station, a charter member of the Crisfield Public Library Board; the Crisfield Civic Club; former vice president of the Auxiliary to the Crisfield American Legion; Eastern Shore Society of Maryland; Maryland Woman's Council; charter member of the Maryland Historical Society; and a past president of the Somerset

County Parent-teachers Association.

She was most proud of her Gold Star membership with the American Legion Auxiliary. A son, Hiram Collins, was killed in the World War II D-Day invasion of Europe, June 6, 1944.

Funeral services were held in St. Paul's Episcopal Church at 2:30 Sunday afternoon conducted by the Rev. Donald Macdonald - Millar. Burial was in Asbury Methodist Cemetery.

Bearers, all members of the Board of Directors of the McCready Hospital were former Governor J. Millard Tawes, Wm. S. Sterling, Norman Polk, A. Wellington Tawes, Sr., H. Parker Tull and Jesse L. Long.

Surviving are a son, J. Edward Collins, Ocean City, Md., three grandchildren, and two sisters, Mrs. Edwin Lawson, Vero Beach, Fla., and Mr. Clifford O. Henry, Canandaigua, N. Y.

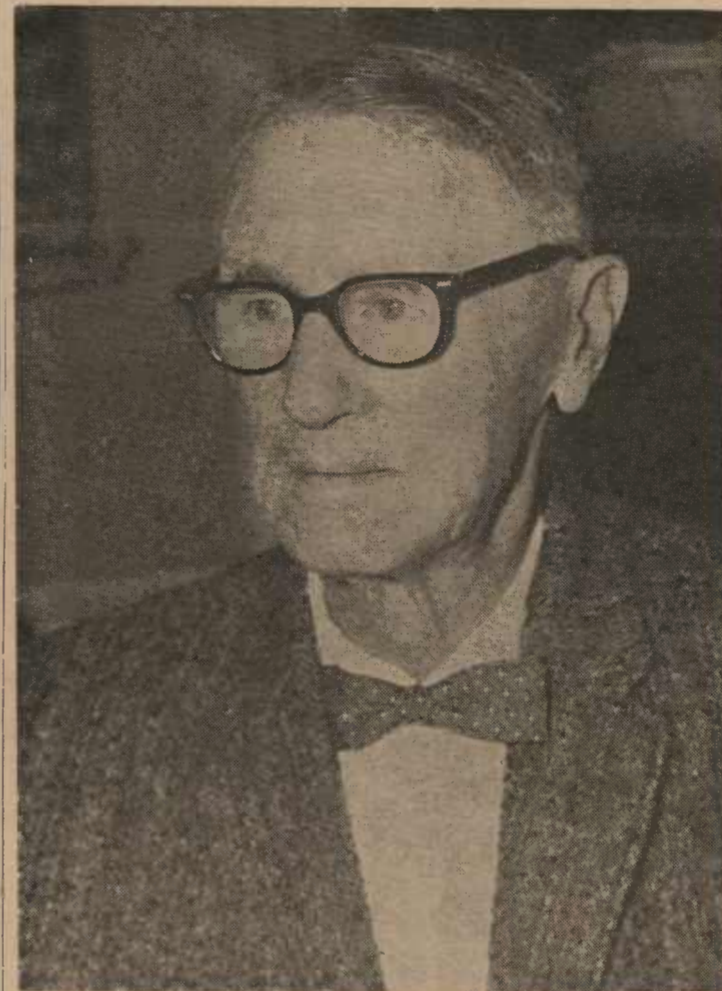

Had Long And Colorful Career

A Thirty-Year Association Ended Abruptly Last Friday, February 9th

Egbert L. Quinn, editor of the Crisfield Times since 1934, a political servant for thirty-two years, an Episcopalian by faith, a supporter of and contributor to all worthy causes, a staunch Democrat, and above all — a gentleman — has gone to his reward.

Bert Quinn had lived a full life. A man of many facets, he was more than just an individual, he was an institution. He did more community good than can be imagined. His advice was sought by many, his help went to people in all walks of life, he gave freely of his time, his talents, and his financial support.

Bert Quinn was never idle. From the time he was a young man his interests were many and varied, from drug store clerk to bank cashier; a whack at the seafood business; the operation of a tent factory and a crab meal plant.

Interspersed with these activities were two of his favorites, his newspaper and politics. He had a talent for writing editorials and news stories, and his comments were widely read. He expressed his views on all matters, from local to international. His political life was long and colorful.

His latest interest was in keeping alive the Maryland Board of Motion Picture Censors, of which he was chairman. He was sincere in his belief that the Board should not be done away with, and he was prepared to fight for its existence.

Cap'n Bert appeared to be much younger than his 83 years. He was erect in stature, he walked with a snappy gait, he was alert and active. He was seldom seen without a cigar.

He spent the last day of his life where he had spent so many days in the years gone by, the office of the Crisfield Times.

Bert Quinn is gone, but he will be remembered for a long time to come.

Having been associated with Bert Quinn for the past thirty years, it was regrettable to have that association end abruptly last Friday, February 9th.

Succumbed Friday In Front Of Home Here

Egbert L. Quinn, editor and publisher of the Crisfield Times, died suddenly of an apparent heart attack in front of his home on Third Street last Friday, February 9th. He had left the Times Office at about 5:00 p. m., had driven to his home and parked his car when he was stricken. He was 83 years of age.

Mr. Quinn had lived a full life, one that was filled with activities from the time he was a young man until the end came on Friday. He had had a part in organizing a number of local civic and fraternal groups, was a life-long Democrat and took a vigorous and active part in local, state and national political campaigns, and he was a contributor and supporter of all worthy causes.

At the time of his death he was Chairman of the Maryland Board of Motion Picture Censors, the last such state board in the Nation. He had fought vigorously to preserve the board, and succeeded at the last session of the Legislature when he showed state legislators some of the films branded as obscene by the board. He was prepared to continue the fight this year.

Mr. Quinn was born in Pocomoke City and moved to Crisfield with his parents when he was a youngster. His late father, L. C. Quinn, Sr., founded the Crisfield Times in 1891 and was Mayor of Crisfield from 1912 to 1914.

"Cap'n Bert," as he was affectionately known, attended public schools here, and when he was a young man was employed at the Will Peyton Drug Store, where he held an Assistant Pharmacist Certificate. At one time he was in the seafood business with his brother Wallace, later to become cashier at the Marine Bank here. He became editor of the "Times" about 1934, operated a tent factory during World War II and for

several years operated a crab meal plant on Route 113, just a short distance from the city limits.

He was a member of the City Council of Crisfield from 1936 to 1948, and was Mayor of the City from 1948 to 1954. In 1957 he was elected to the Maryland House of Delegates, and served through 1966. He was a close friend of former Governor J. Millard Tawes, who appointed him to the Censorship Board in the latter part of 1966, a board that was formed in 1916 to oversee the moral standards of silent films.

Mr. Quinn was the first Worshipful Master of Chesapeake Lodge No. 147, A.F. & A.M. of Crisfield, and was a Charter member and first Worthy Patron of Chesapeake Lodge No. 28, Order of the Eastern Star. He was the first president of the Crisfield Rotary Club. He was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church near Marion; was on the Board of Directors of the McCready Memorial Hospital; and was a member of the Crisfield Elks Lodge No. 1044, the Crisfield Country Club, the Somerset County Farm Bureau and the Delmarva Poultry Industry, Inc.

Mr. Quinn's wife, Clara, died in 1958. Surviving are a son, E. Lyle Quinn, Jr., Crisfield Postmaster; a daughter, Mrs. Emily Eachus, Ward, Pa.; a brother, Wallace M. Quinn, New Orleans, La.; three grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. A sister-in-law, Mrs. Emily Johnson, who resides at the Quinn home on Third Street, survives also.

Funeral services were held on Monday at 2:00 p. m. in the Bradshaw & Sons Funeral Home here, conducted by the Rev. Donald Macdonald-Millar, retired Episcopalian rector, assisted by Percy Reese, Lay Reader.

Burial was in St. Paul's Cemetery, near Marion, where graveside services were conducted by the Masonic Order.

Miss Gunby was dedicated to her profession. During her years of work and following her retirement, she devoted time and effort to obtain scholarships and to give direct financial assistance to high school graduates who would otherwise have been unable to continue their education in college.

She was a long time member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, where she had served as Warden, Treasurer, and a member of its Vestry, a member of the Senior Auxiliary Board of the McCready Hospital, of Chesapeake Chapter No. 28, Order of the Eastern Star, and of the Asbury Homemakers Club.

In her teaching profession she had won the admiration and affection of parents and pupils alike, and her activities in her church were valuable and highly appreciated. Deep respect and affection came to her from all sides, and her talents, which were many, were always used to help and benefit her fellows.

She is survived by a brother, Mr. Paul L. Gunby, a sister, Mrs. William T. Chaffey, both of Marion, and a number of nieces and nephews.

At the funeral ceremony on Monday members of Chesapeake Chapter of the Eastern Star paid final respects in a service at the graveside.

Well Done, Thou Good And Faithful Servant

For half a century Miss Carrie Gunby, who died last Saturday, was a dedicated educator, and we mean dedicated in the fullest sense.

She not only taught youngsters in various grades in Somerset County schools, but a number of them owe their college education to efforts she made to obtain scholarships for them and in direct financial assistance.

When she began teaching, school salaries were low, very low. In all her years of teaching, though, salary was a secondary consideration. Educating young people was her mission in life, and this included deportment, manners, as well as the material in the school books.

Miss Carrie would have made a good executive in any business or industry. Her conversation, her manner, was direct and forceful. She reached the heart of a subject as forthrightly, as delicately, as a surgeon with a scalpel delves to the diseased area which causes agony to the human body. Firm she was, and courageous, apparently gruffly impersonal at times, but always with the object in view of helping. She was a fighter for what she believed in, and her principal belief was that all children have the opportunity to receive an education that would last them all their lives. In this she was uniformly successful, for she had the ability, the know-how, to make it come true in most instances.

Tall, raw-boned, her motions bordering on the awkward at times, standing straight as a ramrod, it was the inner strength reflected in her direct, piercing look that impressed people with her intelligence and ability. And she could be, and was, tender, recognizing that youngsters, to be properly trained, needed affection as well as direction. While youngsters were a trifle awed by her brusque manner which have lasted through the years.

One of her greatest assets was her Christian faith. An Episcopalian, she worked diligently in her church. She was a member of the Vestry, and a Church Warden for years. Here too, her determination to make things better was reflected in late years by her care for the church cemetery, to keep it a pleasant place for observant eyes to see, to make it a place where the living could be comforted when visiting the hallowed ground in which dear ones rested.

Miss Carrie was, in a sense, an institution. She did the work she had chosen to do splendidly. She had a heart that was warm and compassionate, and an understanding of human nature that was remarkable. She had great energy, a fine sense of timing, and whatever she undertook she generally accomplished without regard to obstacles. She retired from the teaching profession several years ago, after 50 years of work, and was active until illness visited her. It is not too much to believe that, when Miss Carrie's soul left her body, it went directly to the Throne of Grace, where God laid His hand on her and said: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant."

DONALD MACDONALD-MILLAR

The celebration of a ministry of unusual length took place in St. Paul's, Marion on Friday, May 22nd when a large gathering of clergy and laity led by our Bishop gathered for Holy Communion at 11 A.M. to mark the 60th anniversary of the Ordination of the Rev. Donald Macdonald-Millar.

In 1910 the day was Trinity Sunday and Father Millar was made Deacon upon his graduation from Gen-

eral Seminary in New York. Born in Nashville, Tennessee in 1884 he served in the Diocese of New York until coming to the Diocese of Easton on his retirement in 1952. He has lived in Crisfield since then and supplied sacramental ministry in St. Paul's, Marion and shepherded the flock in true pastoral fashion, ably helped by the faithful ministry of Mr. Percy Reese who read the Epistle at the service. Women of this devoted congregation served luncheon after the Celebration in the Church.

Father Macdonald-Millar is a man of many talents who was architect of an adequate and attractive Parish House and both designed and painted a beautiful reredos for the sanctuary. Early in his career, he was identified with the work of the prestigious Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities, in the course of which work, his knowledge and skills in the field became known to the planners of the restoration of Williamsburg, Virginia, and he was commissioned to tour England to study the domestic and public architecture of the desired period and make recommendations for the restoration. His presence in the Diocese of Easton has been of great blessing both spiritually and in the Church Arts.



Sixty Years Of Sacred Orders

Rev. Donald Macdonald-Millar, who has served St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Marion for the past eighteen years, was honored on Friday, May 22nd, at the end of sixty years of Sacred Orders.

Bishop Taylor, of the Diocese of Easton, and some twelve of the clergy of the Diocese, and a large congregation held a special Communion service in honor of the occasion, with the ladies of the church serving a delicious luncheon.

Rev. Macdonald-Millar was born in Nashville, Tenn. July 13, 1884. He began his long and

colorful career with the church when he entered the General Theological Seminary in New York City. He graduated from the institution in 1910 and was ordained on May 22 to the Sacred Ministry as a deacon. He was ordained priest in December of the same year.

He served as assistant in various churches in New York, and was rector of St. John's Church in Columbia, S. C. He then returned to New York in Trinity Church and three of its Chapels. He was assistant rector of St. Matthews and St. Timothy from 1932 to 1940, and

St. Andrew's in the Bronx, from 1940 to 1952.

It was in 1952 that Rev. Macdonald-Millar retired, and with his wife came to Crisfield, where they have lived for the past eighteen years.

The special Communion Service and luncheon in his honor was a unique and wonderful occasion, thoroughly enjoyed by all attending, and a deserving tribute to this 86 year old gentleman, who has spent 60 of those years in the ministry.

St. Paul's Church History Comes Full Circle

A dusty chapter in Somerset County's history was reopened recently when the Episcopal Diocese of Easton, at its 1980 convention, voted favorably on a petition to return St. Paul's Church, Marion to the rolls of Coventry Parish.

Coventry was one of the four Anglican parishes that were decreed by a special session of the Court of Somerset on November 22, 1692. Encompassing all of the Somerset County of that time (which included most of present-day Worcester and Wicomico Counties as well), the proclamation called for grouping: "Manokin and Mony hundred into one parish Called Somerset, Pocomoke and Annemessex into one parish Called Coventry, Wiccocomocoe and Nanticoke into one parish Called Stepney, and Bogatee Norton & Mattapony hundred into one parish called Snow Hill." ("Hundred" signified that an area had been heavily enough settled to be able to furnish a hundred armed men to the militia in case of emergency.)

With the change from a proprietary to a royal colony in 1692 at the ascension of William and Mary, the Church of England had become the official religion of Maryland, and freeholders of all religious persuasions were taxed (often in tobacco) for the expense of organizing the Church of England's parishes and building their houses of worship. The parish church of Somerset is Grace Church in Mt. Vernon.



The parish church for Coventry stood near the Rehoboth Presbyterian Church on the banks of the Pocomoke River; it eventually fell into disrepair, the congregation dwindled away, and ruined walls are all that remain.

An ordinance of the Assembly in October, 1695 further directed that "where churches are already built, vestries should expend what tobacco they shall collect, or shall be remaining after Churches are built, in creating Chapels of Ease in their respective parishes," wherever the size of the territory demanded such for the "ease and

convenience" of the scattered population. Seven miles was generally considered a convenient distance for a rural family to make the round-trip to services.

Annemessex Chapel (later named St. Paul's) was one of three "chapels of ease" proposed for Coventry Parish. The second, at Dividing Creek, fell into disrepair. Whether it was replaced by the old St. Stephen's in Upper Fairmount (1751) or by St. Mary's in Pocomoke City is a matter of debate among local church historians. The third chapel was never built.

Annemessex Chapel thrived, on a site in

Marion between today's Route 413 and the Coulbourne Creek inlet from the Big Annemessex River. Just when the chapel was established is not known; records are missing. The date must have been well before 1726, for by that year the building had become so dilapidated that it had to be replaced by another "chapple" (sic) on the same land. In 1820 a third meeting place was built on a new site in Marion, where the Boshen home now stands. Vestry records and a hand-written contract for the work now hang in the vestibule of St. Paul's.

In 1848 the third building was dismantled, board by board, and today's small Gothic chapel was erected on a pine-crowned knoll farther inland still at Tull's Corner, using much of the salvaged material. The design was taken from a little book on "Rural Architecture," published earlier that year by Richard Upjohn, the designer of Trinity Church in New York. Moving the chapel had been sought by a group of parishioners in the belief that "the present location of Annemessex Chapel is such as to retard the growth of the Church in that part, of the parish and that its prosperity would be much increased by the erection of a Chapel in the neighborhood of John H. Miles' store." The name of St. Paul's was adopted at this time.

The Civil War, which turned family against family and brother against brother in a border state like Maryland, contributed to the decline of Anglican congregations in

the latter part of the 19th century in Somerset County, where, prior to 1850, three out of five families were Church of England or "Episcopalian."

Shifting population patterns and the rise of Crisfield after 1870 made a new parish desirable in the southern part of the county. St. Bartholomew's Parish was organized in 1898 to take in St. Paul's and the new St. John's Church in Crisfield (St. John's was first located where the Esso Station on Main Street is now. Later, a church and rectory were built at the junction of Somerset and Columbia Avenues. Condition again changed with the passage of the years, and St. John's was deconsecrated in June, 1934.)

St. Paul's, which had latterly been able to offer worship services only through the kindness of visiting ministers, came into the care of a dynamic retired Episcopal priest, Donald McDonald-Millar, in 1952. Father Millar handed his charge onto Percy Reese, a former employee of the C&P Telephone Company who had served as a layreader for many years. Mr. Reese celebrated the fifth anniversary of his ordination last December. He says he is what is known as a "tentmaker priest," since, like St. Paul, who was once a maker of tents, he followed

another vocation before making the church his life. The rector is assisted at St. Paul's by two layreaders, Martin R. Atkins, Jr. and Richard Reese. Services are held every Sunday at 11 a.m. with the celebration of communion on the first and third Sundays of each month.

This February, the vestry of St. Paul's joined with the vestry of St. Mark's, Kingston in petitioning the return of St. Paul's to its original parish, Coventry. St. Mark's, which was founded in 1848, is the only remaining place of worship in the old Coventry Parish. In recent years its members have dropped away, and the church has been kept open only during the summer months with the help of the Reverend Robert Kurtz of St. Andrew's Church, Princess Anne. It is the hope of Mr. Reese and his assistants to offer worship services in the little square white building on the old Westover-Crisfield Road this summer.

Final ratification of the parish realignment will have to wait a year until the 1981 diocesan convention, but approval is a foregone conclusion. The past is very near in Somerset County, but sometimes a small nudge such as St. Paul's move to close ranks with St. Mark's brings it even nearer.

REUNITING OF ST.BARTHOLOMEW'S AND COVENTRY PARISHES

RESOLVED, that St.Bartholomew's Parish, set apart from Coventry Parish in 1898, be reunited with Coventry Parish.

RESOLVED, that the bounds of Coventry Parish as reunited be and hereby are declared to be as follows:

Beginning at the mouth of Back Creek, on Manokin River, thence with said creek to the bridge known as Back Creek Bridge, thence south by and with a road leading from Princess Anne to Kingston, about 1/4 of a mile to the head of the County Road leading to Green Hill, thence by and with said road to the head of a road (near the farm owned in 1875 by Mr. James Dryden) leading to Rehoboth, thence southerly with said road to the head of a new county road leading into the road from Newtown to Rehoboth, thence with the said new county road easterly to the said road from Newtown to Rehoboth, thence with said road about 1/2 mile to a branch called Chicken Branch, thence with said branch to Pocomoke River, and thence with the shore line of Somerset County to the place of beginning.

RESOLVED, that the application of the Vestries of St.Bartholomew's Parish and Coventry Parish to become one Parish again, under the name of Coventry Parish, be finally approved.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, at its regular session passed in the year 1949, by Chapter 711 (approved May 6, 1949) and Act entitled

"AN ACT to authorize the parishes and separate congregations of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the State of Maryland to establish by-laws governing election of their vestrymen as an alternate method to the provisions of Chapter 24 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, session of November 1798, known as the Vestry Act of 1798."

and

WHEREAS the provisions of the said Act of Assembly, Chapter 711 as aforesaid, were made known at the regular annual congregational meeting of St. Bartholomew's Parish in Somerset County, Maryland, held on the 8th day of April 1951, at which meeting a quorum was present and said provisions were discussed, whereupon the following resolution was, on motion duly made and seconded, unanimously passed:

RESOLVED that it is the sense of this meeting

1 That it is the intention of this parish to avail itself of the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland passed at its regular session in 1949 by Chapter 711 and in pursuance of said provisions the annual congregational meeting for the election of vestrymen shall hereafter be held during the first week of January of each year, but if for any cause the said election should not be held during said week, then said election may be held on any subsequent date appointed for the purpose after giving notice by announcement by the rector at any service held in the Church on two successive Sundays, or if there be no rector, by any two vestrymen in writing set up at the front door of said Church ten days before the day of said meeting for said election, and should there be no election by either method, then the vestrymen already holding office shall continue until such time as their successors are properly and legally elected.

2. That the number of vestrymen so elected shall be nine.

3. That of the nine lay members of the vestry at the first election three shall be designated to serve for three years, three to serve for two years, and three to serve for one year. Thereafter the three whose term of office expires shall be eligible for reelection. The terms for those elected at the first meeting under these provisions shall be as follows; The three receiving the highest number

of votes shall serve for three years, the three receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the three receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for one year.

4 That this resolution shall in all respects be subject ~~to~~ to the provisions set forth in the aforesaid Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at its regular session in the year 1949 (Chapter 711) as aforesaid, and shall become effective only upon approval of said Act by a canon duly passed and approved at a meeting of the Diocesan Convention duly held.

St. Paul's P.E. Church To Observe Its 104th Anniversary

St. Paul's Protestant Episcopal Church near Marion will celebrate its 104th anniversary on Sunday, Dec. 21st. It is a part of Coventry Parish, which dates back to the 1600's. St. Paul's was consecrated Dec. 21st, 1848.

Among the families affiliated with the church, established first as the Church of England, were: Elzey, Revell, Bosman or Bozeman, Beauchamp, Thorne, Brerton, Dennis, Hall, Earnabe, Woolford, Fountain or Fontaine, Furniss, Poole, Jones of Monie, Mitchell, Dashiell, Downes, Betts, Barrs, Ballard, Renshaw, Nelson, Panter, King, Purnell, Tillman, Askworth, Winder, Haste, Spence, Maddox or Maddrix, Noble, Cottman, Rhodes, Ward, Tull, Walker, Melvin, Evans, Day, Chambers, Whittington, Newbold, Scarborough, Smith, Handy, Hammond, Hollbrook, Howard, Dixon, Coulbourne, Horsey, Boston, Lawsons.

From "Old Somerset on the Eastern Shore of Maryland," by Rev. Clayton Torrence, we find the following interesting history of Annemessex Chapel:

The date of the erection of "Annemessex Chapel" is not now known, though we find it in use in 1726. In November, 1726, Somerset Court gave permission to William and Solomon Coulbourne to turn the road which ran from the head of Coulbourn's Creek to the head of Jones' Creek; and in the court's order it is stated that the road from Annemessex Chapel

to the bottom of Little Annemessex" goes through the lands of the said Coulbourns. At November Court, 1739, John Scott, who owned a piece of land described as lying between "Annemessex Chappel and a dam called Beaver Dam", petitioned for turning the road formerly called Duke's Road. At August Court, 1741, on motion of Captain Thomas Williams, a new road was ordered to be made from the main road near Joseph Porter's the most direct route, "to the Chapple at the head of Coulbourns Creek". In 1748 a road was directed to be run from Captain Thomas Williams' gate to "Annemessex Chapel." (Somerset Court, Judicials 1724-27, page 180; 1738-40, page 197; 1740-42, page 144 and 1747-49, page 183. The references of 1726, 1739 and 1748 specifically call this chapel "Annemessex Chapel." The record of 1741 definitely locates the chapel at the head of Coulbourn's Creek.

Footnote —

"The Chapel in Princess Anne Town was consecrated as a church under the name of "St. Andrew's Church" on November 11, 1845, by the Right Reverend William Rolinson Whittington, Bishop of Maryland."

"Around this church today, in graves marked and unmarked, rest the bodies of several generations of "churchmen" who have worshipped in this House of God. "God's Acre" is still sacredly

kept here. Just beyond the north west door of the church is the grave of John Oliver Barton Priest, and for many years pastor of this congregation and rector of Somerset Parish. Just beyond the southwest door is the grave of Henry Crosdale, a faithful and honored Priest. To the south of the church is the grave of Oliver H. Hurphy, Priest, at one time beloved rector of Coventry Parish and an indefatigable student of parochial history in Somerset County. Near the southwest corner of the church the body of the venerable William W. Johnston, a great benefactor of this church, lies buried. Throughout the churchyard one finds on grave-stones the honored name of Waters Woolford, Dashiell, Dennis, Duer, Barton, Dixon, McMaster, Polk, Kerr, Waller, Long, Jones, Johnston, Covington, Whittington, Sudler, Daugherty, Wilson, Wise, Stone, Stewart, Cottman, Young, Smith and many others; while there is ample evidence of many unmarked graves."

The first constructed "Annemessex Chapel" at the head of Coulbourn's Creek, which appears in records of 1726, 1739, 1741, and 1748, evidently fell into wretched condition and required replacing. By Chapter 16, Acts of Maryland Assembly, 1762, the justices of Somerset and Worcester Counties were empowered to levy 62,400 pounds of tobacco on the inhabitants of Coventry Parish (which lay partly in Somerset and partly in Worcester Counties' for uses specified in the said Act; the said uses being: (1) the empowering of the vestry of Coventry Parish to purchase, in fee, two acres of land in Somerset County, in the said parish, at some place between the head of Coulbourn's Creek and Annemessex Dams and thereon to build a Chapel of Ease for the said parish; (2) the said vestry is empowered to enlarge the Chapel of Ease on Dividing Creek in Coventry Parish (Bacon's Laws of Maryland, Acts of Assembly, 1762, Chapter 16).

From this act of Assembly, 1762, we assume the probable condition of the "Annemessex Chapel" of 1726, 1739, 1741 and 1748 references. We have been unable to discover any record of conveyance to the vestry of Coventry Parish for the land at the head of Coulbourn's Creek on which it is specifically stated his chapel stood. Then on November 10, 1763, Stephen Horsey and Michael Holland (for 14 lb. each) conveyed to the rector, vestry and wardens of Coventry Parish, two acres of land, "it being the ground whereon the New Chappell now stands", the said two "beginning at a marked oak cedar stake being the boulder of a tract called Pomfret near the

westernmost corner of the new Chappell" (Somerset Court, Deed Liber 0 24, page 196).

This deed of November, 1763, locates the "new Chappell" near a boulder mark of the tract of land called "Pomfret", which boulder was near the west corner of the said chapel. This court order of August 1741 (quoted above) refers "to the Chapple at the head of Coulbourn's Creek." The "new Chappell" mentioned in 1763 evidently replaced the "Chappel at the head of Coulbourn's Creek", of the court order of 1741. The site of the "new Chappell" in 1763, and the site of the "Chapple at the head of Coulbourn's Creek," in 1741, are practically identical; the land is the same, though there may have been a slight variation in the building sites — certainly, however, not more than a matter of "yards and feet." The tract called "Pomfret", (whose boundry marker is named as "near the westernmost corner of the new Chappell"), lay immediately to the southwest of the head of Coulbourn's Creek and bordered on that creek. The Horsey lands, called "Coulbourne" lay to the northeast of Coulbourn's Creek and bordered on the creek. In the year 1763 Stephen Horsey owned this southeast corner of the "Coulbourne" tract and Michael Holland owned the northeast corner of the "Pomfret" tract, and their lands joined at this point.

Footnote —

"Worcester County was until 1742 a part of Somerset County, Coventry Parish (in which Annemessex Chapel stood) was from 1692-1742 wholly in Somerset County, but when Worcester County was created, in 1742, that part of Coventry Parish lying east and south of the Pocomoke River fell within the boundaries of the newly created Worcester County.

"This deed was made by Stephen Horsey and Michael Holland to Nathaniel Whitaker (present incumbent (rector) of Coventry Parish), William Allen, James Gunby, John Dennis, Outerbridge Horsey, Littleton Dennis and Elijah Coulbourne (vestrymen of Coventry Parish) and William Melvin and Thomas Marshall (church wardens of Coventry Parish).

The "Annemessex Chapel" (both the old and the new ones)

stood on Horsey land immediately north, or northeast, of the head of Coulbourne's Creek, but the limits of the two acres conveyed evidently extended over onto the Holland land and hence the necessity for Stephen Horsey and Michael Holland making a joint conveyance in 1763 to the rector, vestry and wardens of Coventry Parish for this land on which the "new Chappell" stood.

Thus we find that the older (and first) "Annemessex Chapel" of 1726, 1739, 1741 and 1748 references, disappeared and had been replaced by a "new Chappell", 1763, (also called "Annemessex Chapel" in tradition and record); this "new

Chappell" occupying the same land, if not the identical building spot, of the older chapel.

Among the fragmentary items relative to Coventry Parish which have come down to us through the manuscript "Notice of Coventry Parish — by John Crosdale, Rector — 1848," we find several relating to the "Annemessex Chapel," which are as follows:

"August 2 (1779) — Ordered that Mr. Duett make application to the neighborhood of Annemessex to meet at the chapel and prevent if possible its falling."

August 5, 1782, Thomas William Dixon appointed to have Annemessex Chapel repaired.

1786. During course of this year extensive repairs made on Annemessex Chapel.

The site of the "Annemessex Chapel" — both old and new — at the head of Coulbourn's Creek may be at this present time (1934) located about one mile west of the town of Marion in Somerset County.

In 1818 subscriptions were made to rebuild "Annemessex Chapel" (new one which appeared in 1763 as the "new Chapel") and work was commenced thereon. This was the third building of this chapel. In 1821 this third building was completed and the pews sold. At the time of the erection of this third chapel building the building site was changed from the Horsey lands at the head of Coulbourn's Creek. This chapel, erected 1818-1821, was placed on the county road leading from Marion to Crisfield, on land belonging to Benjamin Coulbourne. At this site the third building of "Annemessex Chapel" stood for thirty years, when in June, 1848,

Isaac Marshall contracted to build the church in Annemessex. Again the site was changed. This time the building was erected on land about two miles east of the town of Marion — where the church then built remains standing (and in use) at this present day. In July, 1848, the chapel (erected 1818-1821) was taken down, the materials carried to the new location east of Marion, and mostly used in construction of the new church. On July 27, 1848, the cornerstone of this church was laid, and on December 21, 1848, the church was consecrated under the name of "St. Paul's Church" by the Right Reverend William Rolinson Whittington, Bishop of Mary-

land.

Footnote —

"The items relative to Annemessex Chapel from this point on are from the manuscript entitled "Noticiae of Coventry Parish, Consisting of extracts from old parish Register now in possession of William Williams, M. D., by John Crosdale, Rector, January 1st, 1848." These notes by Mr. Crosdale were made on the first page of an old Vestry Book of Coventry Parish now (1934) in possession of the vestry of that parish. The "old parish register" to which Mr. Crosdale had access and from which he made his notes has disappeared.

Macdonald-Millar, Rector of St. Paul's.

Service on Christmas Day will be Holy Communion at 10.00 a.m., and the Church School will have its Christmas Service on Sunday, Dec. 28th, at 10.15 a.m.

Continuing the history of Coventry Parish from last week is the following addenda by Rev. Oliver H. Murphy, who was Rector of Coventry Parish, and relates to St. Paul's, St. Mark's and St. Stephens churches, and the old church at Rehoboth and the celebration of its 200th anniversary in 1892.

(History)

"On Thursday, Aug. 24, 1892, the parishioners of Coventry Parish celebrated the two hundredth anniversary of the organization of the Parish. The day will long be remembered with feelings of gratitude and joy. It was especially interesting to those who were permitted to assemble for public worship in the old historic parish church at Rehoboth. The presence of the beloved Bishop of the Diocese, who came with several visiting clergymen to take part in these services, made them more enjoyable. The Rt. Rev. Dr. Adams, the Bishop of Easton, preached a most instructive sermon on "Christian Nurture." then followed the administration of the Holy Communion to a very large number of people. The Anniversary sermon was delivered by Rev. Samuel F. Hotekin, rector of St. Luke's Church, Bustleton, Pa.

The succession of Centennials which the church during the past few years has been celebrating all over the country press, home upon all who think the principle of the perpetuity of that kingdom which God has established on earth for the salvation of men.

There is a happy propriety, therefore, that this bi-centenary service, which chronicles the history of Coventry Parish from the earliest settlement in this part of Maryland to the present, should take place upon or near the site where the first church in Somerset County was built.

Two centuries or more have come and gone in the history of this old and venerable parish. Two centuries is a long time measured by the life of man, but it is not a long period in the history of the church. For so men die, but the church lives on, her work continues from generation. "Star succeeds star in the golden candlestick, but the candlestick remains, and He who walks among them lives forever."

During this time many devoted clergymen and laymen have done faithful service in this part of the Lord's vineyard and long since passed to their rest. They labored not in vain; their work goes on, and we have entered into their

labors. Much do we owe to them who raised up such men as His servants, and who by his grace gave them the desire to do such service and made their work effective by His blessing.

It should be borne in mind that while parish boundaries were not legally defined in Somerset county until 1692. A.D. when Sir Lionel Copley issued orders for this purpose, yet this portion of the county, designated as Coventry Parish, had an ecclesiastical existence prior to this date. As early as 1658 the provincial government of Maryland offered large and generous grants of land to all who would settle within this part of the province. Doubtless it was this kind of invitation that induced Rev. Mr. Teacle, a clergyman of the Church of England, and a rector of a parish in Accomac county, to lead out a considerable number of settlers (probably his parishioners) from the colony of Virginia.

The settlement appeared to have been prosperous and affluent and for the most part was composed of churchmen and somewhat more numerous in proportion to the whole population than elsewhere. They were attracted by the forests and came in hopes that they might make themselves farms and comfortable homes in the beautiful and well wooded country lying on the fertile banks of the Pocomoke and Annessex rivers.

For the existence of church services before the organization of the parish, these earnest and faithful men were sponsors. They seem to have possessed faith and devotion enough to meet and join in divine service in the humble dwelling, lead by some humble christian man; and doubtless as soon as permitted, they built their church. Public worship then depended mostly upon lay reading but was made continuous by the encouragement of occasional services and administration of the sacraments former rector; the Rev. Mr. Teacle or some other clergyman.

The action of these men evinces that they were steadfast; men who believed in the faith of their forefathers, and the adherence of a considerable portion of their descendants for more than two centuries to this faith is a practical comment upon the sturdy character and lasting influence of their ancestors and the founders of this venerable parish.

The first services of the church in Fairmount district, or "Potato Neck," were held in a school house on the lands of Capt. Henry Davy, on the county road from Jamestown to Annessex. This old building is now occupied by a colored family, a few hundred yards from the county road from Westover to Fairmount. The services were inaugurated by Rev. James A. Young and afterwards continued by the rector of the parish, the Rev. John Crosdale, D.D. At this time, 1856, there were but two communicants in the district—Mrs. Thomas Furniss and Mrs. Tubman Sudler. So great was the interest on the part of the people in this sector in our church services that the appointment at the school house became regular, and since then services have been held regularly. In 1862-63 a lot was given by Francis M.

which to erect a church; and the present St. Stephen's was rebuilt thereon, after having been removed from Dividing Creek, Worcester County. The means for the church was provided for mostly by the liberal and generous offerings of those who resided in the section.

In 187— a lot near the church was donated by the widow of the late Francis Boggs and the

Messrs. Waters, on which a large and commodious rectory was built. The title for this property is held by the trustees of the Diocese. The rectory was built by the earnest efforts of the ladies of St. Stephen's Church, to whom credit should be given for their indefatigable labor in this behalf. The beginning of church services at Crisfield was attended with many difficulties, Sunday evening, July 17, 1883.

The present rector began holding services in the Town Hall, which after a few weeks he was obliged to abandon. Another effort was made on Sunday evening, July 25, 1888, to establish a mission in Crisfield which met with better success. Alternate Sunday night services were held for the next three years, an interest in our services being awakened. The rector took steps toward

building a Chapel at this point. An eligible lot was secured on which St. John's Memorial Church was erected. Friday, July 28, 11 A.M., the rector, with the few friends of the Mission met to lay the corner stone of the new church.

The creed and Collect were said by the Rev. Oliver H. Murphy, the rector. The following persons were present: Mrs. Thos. S. Hodson, Miss Edna Fontaine, Messrs. Ol. Mitchell and Barton Yerby. Thus began in a humble way the work at St. John's, Crisfield. On January 9, 10:30, the Rt. Rev. William F. Adams, D.D. the Bishop of the Diocese, consecrated the church. The congregation have now a minister living among them, who is known as the assistant of Coventry Parsh, with special work at Crisfield.

Before closing this sketch, I think it due to the memory of those who have departed, as well as just to the living descendants of the founders of the old parish to mention the names of those who were more or less prominently identified with the work of the church in Coventry, and thus rescue from oblivion, names which might otherwise be forgotten.

- A glance at the above names will show that the parish was in very flourishing condition and the parishoners were many. Not con-vned simply to our part of the county, but were scattered through Pocomoke Annamessex Hundred and also on the Manokin, in Potato Neck.

Containing the history of Coventry Parish by Rev. Oliver H. Murphy, from last week, this week's article has to do with the old church at Rehoboth, part of the walls of which still stand, and of St. Paul's, St. Mark's, St. Stephen's and St. John's churches:

Somerset county is rich with historical places, many of which are veritable landmarks, but none is fuller of interest than this parish church at Rehoboth. "The ancient church of colonial date, deserted long or left to hapless fate, Till nave and shrine are hastening to decay Where once our fathers learned the Heavenly way."

This old building has withstood for more than a century the ravages of time, and today it stands as an unbroken link connecting the past with the present. Surely this old temple is indeed valuable to the lineal descendants of the first settlers of the country, nor is it less interesting to those who pass by.

It is proposed to renovate this old church, to repair its crumbling walls, to restore its altar, in other words, to make or put it back just as it was a century or more ago. To accomplish this good work we confidently appeal to the sons and daughters and other descendants of those who left such an heritage.

It is pleasant to note that in this age of change and restlessness there is scarcely a family in this part of the county who are not in some way identified with the early history of this parish. The reason is readily seen when we remember that there was no place for divine worship in the radius of Somerset county except the old Pocomoke church (at or near the present church at Rehoboth). In those days

all the inhabitants of the colony were, without exception, churchmen. In fact, the first minister of the gospel in America was an English clergyman, nor must we forget that the church to which we belong was permanently rooted in Jamestown in 1607. long before the Puritan fathers came over in the Mayflower, 1620, and also was on the ground before the Roman Catholics settled in St. Mary's county, 1633. It is a church of more than eighteen centuries of life and continuity.

A glance of the early records of the parish show the parishioners of this time were very religious, as the names of their children will attest, and were also friends and defenders of good morals, for all who violated the law of purity felt the stern hand of discipline administered by those in authority. So prosperous was the cause of religion in the colony that soon after the organization of the parish the inhabitant of Annamessex and Pocomoke Hundred were obliged to build two "Chapels of Ease" for convenience of divine worship. The first chapel was built in Annamessex and the other at Dividing Creek, now in Worcester County. These chapels, together with the parish church at or near Rehoboth, built in 1692, gave ample opportunity for public worship. The congregations appeared to be flourishing and the people were constant at church services.

The Chapel of Ease in Annamessex was built in "Henry Field" on a knoll, near Marion, on the lands of the late John C. Horsey, and on the lane leading from Capt. John H. Garrison's to county road, which was at this time one of the entrances to the Horsey estate. The chapel was afterwards removed to the county road leading from Marion to Crisfield, on the land of Mr. Benjamin Coulbourne, near a sycamore which is now standing. This tree was planted by the Rev. John Crosdale D. D. and Thomas Williams, Esq. The building was again removed and is now the present St. Paul's Church, Annamessex. The parish now rejoices in five churches. The old parish church was built in 1783 and consecrated in 1795 by the Bishop of The Diocese of Maryland.

St. Mark's Church, Kingston, built in 1845, consecrated June 2, 1846, by the Rt. Rev. Wm. R. Whittington, D. D., the Bishop of the Diocese of Maryland.

St. Paul's Annamessex, built in 1848 consecrated December 21, 1848, by the Bishop of the Diocese. St. Stephen's, Upper Fairmount, built in 1862-3, consecrated in 1884 by Rt. Rev. Henry L. Lay, D. D., Bishop of Easton.

St. John's Memorial Chapel was built in 1889 and consecrated Jan. 9, 1890, by the Rt. Rev. W. F. Adams, D. D., the Bishop of the Diocese.

Beautiful New Reredos Given To Saint Paul's

1955.

In St. Paul's Episcopal Church near Marion there will be a special service at eleven o'clock Sunday morning, Dec. 18th, to commemorate the forty-fifth anniversary of the ordination to the sacred priesthood of the Reverend Donald Macdonald-Millar.

The Right Reverend Allen J. Miller, Ph. D., D. D., Bishop of Easton, will preach, and as a thank offering the Reverend Donald Macdonald-Millar has designed and made a beautiful painted altar-piece which will be dedicated at this service.

The "Times" is presenting a picture of this addition to the little church, which is one of the finest pieces of art in the whole Diocese.

St. Paul's Church was consecrated on St. Thomas Day, December 21st, 1848, and is therefore now 107 years old.

The reredos is of gold-painted wood, with five panels of blue and silver. The central panel depicts a large-rayed sun against which the fine old craved altar cross appears in gold, with panels picked out in red and blue. Below, on shields, are the Arms of the Diocese of Easton, and of the donor.

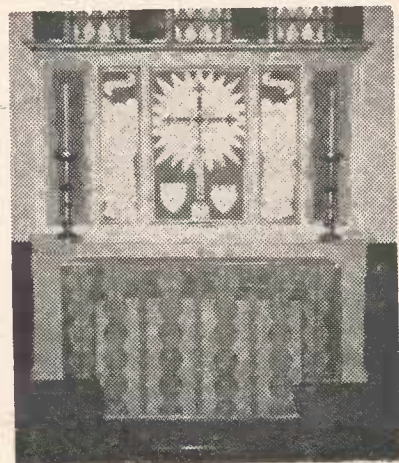
The intermediate panels have each a standing angel in silver, sketched with black lines in a poster style, very effective in their design. They veil their faces in reverence, and on scrolls above are Latin words meaning "This Is The Holy Place."

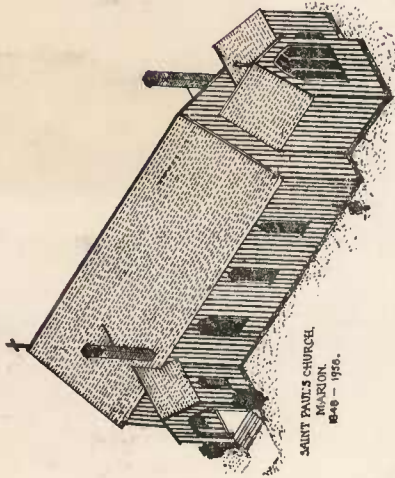
The end panels are plain blue, forming a background for the gilded candlesticks with their white candles. The gilt cornice above is decorated in blue. The base of the erection is suitably panelled and painted a grey stone color.

The Reverend Donald MacDonald-Millar graduated from the General Theological Seminary in New York and was ordained Deacon in St. Thomas' Church on June 22nd, 1910, by the Bishop of Tokyo, acting for the Bishop of Tennessee, and was ordained priest on December 18th, 1910, in Grace Church, New York, by the Bishop of New York.

He served seven years in historic Trinity Parish, sixteen at the Church of St. Matthew and St. Matthew and St. Timothy, was rector of St. John's Church in Columbia, S. C., and after ten years as Vicar of St. Andrew's Church in the Bronx, he retired.

Upon his retirement from the active ministry, he moved to Crisfield, where he has been most helpful with services of the Holy Communion and preaching at St. Paul's.





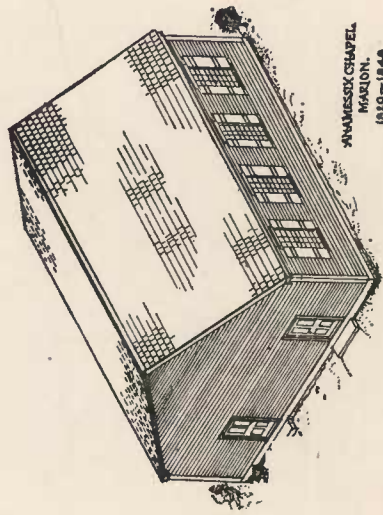

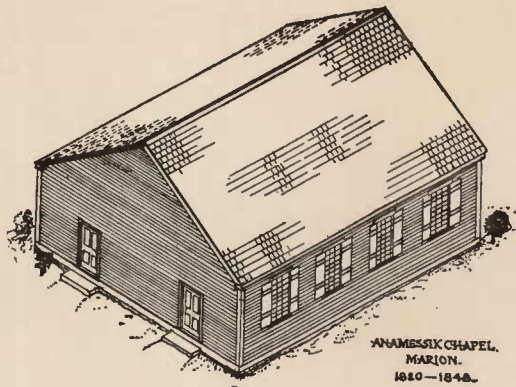

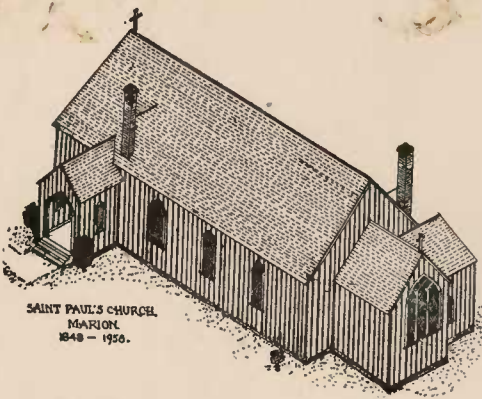

ARTICLES OF MERGER AND UNION

of

VESTRY OF COVENTRY PARISH
and
VESTRY OF ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S PARISH

WHEREAS Vestry of Coventry Parish is a religious corporation of the State of Maryland, duly organized in 1798 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 24 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1798 (the 1798 Vestry Act), and existing since that date in Somerset County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish is a religious corporation of the State of Maryland, duly organized in 1898 pursuant to the provisions of the 1798 Vestry Act and of Chapter 23 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1870, and existing since that date in Somerset County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS Vestry of Coventry Parish and Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish desire to merge pursuant to the laws of the Maryland relating to non-stock corporations, and thereby to unite their separate religious corporations, and approval of such union in conformity with its applicable canons has been given on February 7, 1981, by the Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Easton in conformity with Chapter 23 of the Acts of 1870; and

WHEREAS to achieve the merger and union above described, these Articles are executed.

NOW THEREFORE, Vestry of Coventry Parish and Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish, being the religious corporations which are the parties to these Articles of Merger and Union, do hereby

agree to effect a merger of these corporations upon the terms and conditions herein set forth.

I. The corporation to be merged into the successor corporation is Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish, which became a corporation as set forth in the preamble hereto, and whose principal office is located at Marion Station, Somerset County, Maryland. Its corporate existence will cease upon the effective date of the merger, in accordance with Section 3-114, Corporations and Associations, Annotated Code of Maryland. All its interests in land are located in Somerset County, Maryland.

II. The successor corporation is Vestry of Coventry Parish, which became a corporation as set forth in the preamble hereto, and whose principal office is located at Kingston, Somerset County, Maryland. All its interests in land are located in Somerset County, Maryland.

III. The terms and conditions of the merger and union set forth in these articles were advised, authorized and approved by each corporation party to this transaction in the manner and by the vote required by their respective charters and by-laws, and the merger and union was initially approved by the Annual Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Easton on February 2, 1980, and was finally approved by Annual Convention on February 7, 1981, in conformity with Diocesan canons and Chapter 23 of the Acts of 1870.

IV. Vestry of Coventry Parish, the successor corporation, shall continue to have and exercise all property, rights and powers previously conferred upon it by Chapter 24 of Maryland Acts of 1798 and by Section 298, et seq. of Article 23 of the

Maryland Annotated Code (now Chapter 97 of the Acts of 1976), and shall have transferred to it and vested in it all property, rights and powers previously vested in Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish.

V. Vestry of Coventry Parish and Vestry of St.

Bartholomew's Parish are both non-stock religious corporations, and the successor corporation similarly will be a non-stock corporation, organized and functioning pursuant to the provisions of the 1957 Vestry Act affecting the Diocese of Easton (now Chapter 97 of the Acts of 1976).

VI. This merger and union was duly advised to the members of the respective congregations entitled to vote thereon by the respective vestries of each of the merging corporations, as advisable in accordance with the terms of these Articles, and after approval by the Diocese of Easton as above recited and due notice to the members of the respective congregations, was approved by a majority of the members of each congregation entitled to vote and then voting at the respective regularly called parish meetings.

VII. The effective date of these Articles shall be the date on which they are accepted for filing by the State Department of Assessments and Taxation.

Thanks for your note. I could never have gotten through the heinous incident without the support of friends and now, there, is the trial set for August. And after that disgrace^{ful} and outrageous verdict in the Hinkley case, and with the shyster lawyers in L.A. County, anything can happen. But with our Nations Capital's population over 90% black who knows the difference between psychology and psychiatry?? And theres the Hinkley millions. I wouldn't doubt that the jurors all received a bonus! In Susan's case, the D.A. admitted to Val, that anything could occur. He said, if the majority of jurors were middle aged white women, there attitude was "she got what she deserved" and the sentence was light, and the culprit was soon back on the street again. Susan is doing fairly well, lost 24 pounds which she could ill afford to do, and is having therapy. She will not be pregnant and is having medication to prevent possibility of V.D. She is living with friends until she can find another apartment, one with Security. The man told her he had killed one girl^{up North}, who had tried to resist him, and that could happen to her. To prove his point, he then cut her three times on her neck. Police are now working with homicide in the Northern town to see if the story is factual. The Judge denied him bail, so he is in jail. Only until this week, have I been able to sleep in the dark again. I have kept every room in the apartment ablaze! And the doctor has reduced the sedation medicine. Where, oh where, is our Church headed? Thanks for the clippings. What chance does Allen Spicer have to become the next Bishop? Bob Gowley is a good one, too. I am against going

out of the Diocese. But who asked me??

And now to Sonny's inquiry.

We came to the Diocese in June 1928 and St. Marks was on its present site. We were shown the spot from which it had been moved and were told if the building were ever not used for church purposes, the property would revert to the Methodist Church. Whether to anyone, particular congregation or the Conference, I do not know. Mr. Clary spent the better part of a day, with Mr. Cassius Dashiield (lawyer) at the Court House in Princess Anne, but could find no record of any type of arrangement. I believe your best contact should be with Mrs. Bill Ardis (married to Greff Haymon, first marriage). Her sister, Mrs. Kavenough is a neighbor of yours but she was one of the younger Derby sisters, so may not know. What happened to the old school house, St. Marks purchased and remodeled into a Parish House? It was never on the present church site.

Sorry, I cannot be of more help to you.

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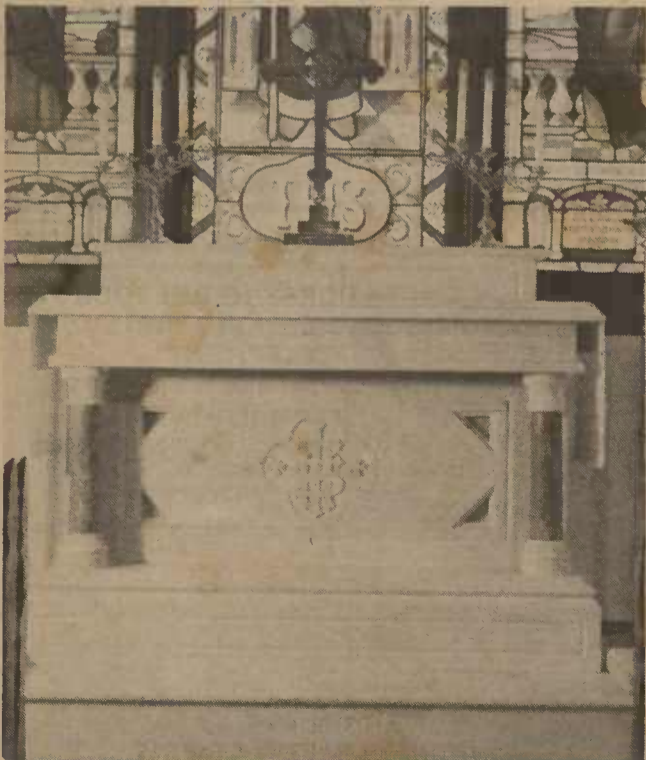

Shrewsbury Nears 300th Anniversary



General John Cadwalader, Kent County's famous Revolutionary War hero, is interred beneath this stately monument. The general, who died in 1786 at age 44, was memorialized by Thomas Paine, a violent political enemy during his lifetime. In 1992, Shrewsbury Parish Church in Kennedyville, Maryland, will celebrate its 300th anniversary. While this milestone is a cause for jubilation, there is undocumented evidence that the first Shrewsbury Church may, indeed, be even older than the accepted date would indicate!

Preparations are under way for the commemoration of this significant anniversary in the proud history of a quaint and charming country parish. During an event of this nature, there is a tendency to make each celebratory occasion more elaborate and spectacular than the one preceding it. It is to be hoped that this will not be the case for Shrewsbury's anniversary, because pretentious galas and ostentatious extravaganzas are not what this church is all about!

Shrewsbury Parish Church is about historical significance and proud heritage. It is about caring and sharing and camaraderie and compassion. It is about generosity and devotion and dedication. It is about peace and serenity and optimism, enthusiasm and total faith. It is about the legacy of those who have gone before, nurtured by those who stand in their places, to be passed on proudly to those who will follow.

Parishioners of this historic Episcopal church currently are undertaking an extensive and ambitious restoration/renovation project. In doing so, they carry on the time-honored traditions of

their predecessors whose noble and continual efforts preserved this magnificent house of worship and rectory.

A capital fundraising program, called the Bell Tower Fund, has been launched to raise \$90,000 to repair the bell tower, replace the wood shingle roof, update the electrical system, preserve the stained glass windows and to cover other necessary repairs.

Each family in the congregation has been requested to pledge a designated amount, and contributions are being solicited from former parishioners, friends of Shrewsbury, historians and preservationists and anyone who wishes to prolong the life and preserve the beauty of this national landmark in Kent County, Maryland. All contributions may be forwarded to The Bell Tower Fund, Shrewsbury Parish, Kennedyville, Maryland 21645, c/o Lt. Col. Robert Ayres.

In order to appreciate fully the significance of this historic site and its place in Maryland's and the nation's past, present and future, one must know something of its beginnings, its struggles, its successes, its failures and its people.

Although it is an oversimplification, one can divide the history of Shrewsbury Parish Church into three segments: 1692(?) - 1729; 1729 - 1835; and 1835 to date. While there are ob-

vious overlaps and nebulous specifics, there is one absolute: This church has endured three centuries of vicissitudes and has emerged victorious. Shrewsbury, its rectors and its parishioners seem to have endured every kind of "famine" which can befall a church and its members, quite often suffering the effects of several varieties at the same

time - leadership, membership, financial and spiritual.

Pre-Church And 1692(?) - 1729

The only surviving records of the early Anglican parishes in Maryland are records of the churches. Little is known about the early religious practices, because religion

was practiced primarily in the home. If held at all, baptisms, weddings and funerals were held in the homes.

There was an act passed in 1692 which stipulated provisions for laying out the counties into parishes, for selecting vestrymen, for erecting churches, for paying the ministers, for empowering vestrymen to collect gifts, grants and bequests, and for levying fines and collecting contributions.

Shrewsbury Parish Church had no regular minister for many years after it was erected. No baptisms were recorded until 1697. The records indicate that a Reverend Richard Sewell was sent to Maryland to minister to North and South Sassafras Parishes, and the first baptisms were recorded

July 25, 1697.

Among the interesting anomalies surrounding this early church is the fact that it was "in need of reparation" by 1701. Had the structure been built only nine years before (1692), would repairs have been necessary? This frame structure could have been 20-30 years old by 1701. Intriguing!

Vestry minutes of 1703 reveal the agreement to build a 20-foot addition to the tiny 24-by 30-foot church. Aisles were also widened at this time, and the church was described as a 24-by 50-foot structure. Weatherboarding, a new door and new hinged shutters were added circa 1705. The first recorded marriage took place in 1706. The vestrymen continued to approve improvements to the church, since the lack of a regular minister freed those funds for such projects.

The first recorded burial, in 1712, took place at a family burial ground. The first record of a burial in the church yard would not appear until 1730.

The first mention of decorating the church for holidays came in 1713. Christmas, Easter and Whitsontide were listed as the "Great Festivals."

In 1721, the vestry and wardens agreed to "build a new church and erect it at the same place where or by (where) the old one now stands." Shrewsbury followed the trend of the times by choosing to erect a larger brick church. In the same time frame, Reverend James Williamson decided to leave his post after almost a decade -- a phenomenal tenure for the time! The congregation was described as between 300 and 400.

1729 To 1835

The new church measured 40 feet by 60 feet and contained 26 pews in three tiers. A gallery measured 15 feet by 40 feet. All work was deemed to be completed by 1730. The first church was removed and burned, but useful timber and planks were spared.

A significant break in the history of Shrewsbury was caused by missing vestry minutes between

1730 and 1745. In 1730, it is believed that the church was in the best financial and spiritual condition it would ever enjoy. The church had come through its early years (1692-1730) and was moving into the pre-Revolutionary War period (1731-1775). It is these early years which fascinate so many -- perhaps because of their elusive and speculative nature. The early and mid-eighteenth century years were ones of increasing unrest and a significant loss of prestige for the established

maintained a file of its past catalogs, she informed me that it does not. I wish there were a way to compel manufacturers to save at least one copy of each of their catalogs. At the very least, they should send one copy of each to the library of their local historical society. Old catalogs are extremely helpful when doing research about objects.

Had my efforts failed through the Chamber of Commerce, I planned to contact the International Society of Antique Scale Collectors (20 North Wacker Drive, Chicago, Illinois 60606). If you do not belong, you certainly should.

One final note, you requested a personal reply, something I simply do not have the time to do, because you have trouble obtaining copies of the paper in which "Rinker on Collectibles" appears. The answer is simple. Every paper for which I write sells subscriptions. Subscribe. If you did, you might have found this answer to your question.

QUESTION: I have an old ice cream maker. It is not the common bucket-type; rather, it is a rectangular box with a top section that lifts up. The ice and ice cream unit rests sideways in the box. What is its value? - AP, Perkasi, PA

ANSWER: Your letter provided me with a perfect excuse to call Ed Marks, editor of *The Ice Screamer* (Box 5387, Lancaster, Pennsylvania 17601), and one of the premier collectors of ice cream memorabilia. Your ice cream maker is known as a hori-

zontal freezer. Bucket-type freezers are readily available on the market, old ones selling in the \$30 to \$45 range. Horizontal freezers are much more difficult to find. A complete unit marked with the name of the manufacturer and in very good condition is worth between \$550 and \$600. Your freezer shows signs of heavy use, and the manufacturer's label appears to be missing. Its value falls in the \$350 to \$425 range, still not bad for an old kitchen utensil.

QUESTION: Many years ago I acquired a sitting bulldog doorstop about eight inches high. There is no date on the piece, but it is marked "D. J. Murray Manufacturing Company, Wausau, Wisconsin./Castings - Iron, Aluminum, and Bronze." How old is it and what is it worth? - BL, Emmaus, PA

ANSWER: I first consulted Jeanne Bertioia's *Doorstops: Identification & Values* (Collector Books: 1985). Jeanne's excellent book contains a section giving a brief history of doorstop manufacturers. I was surprised to find D. J. Murray Manufacturing Company not listed. My curiosity was aroused.

Next, I did what any good researcher would do under similar circumstances: called the reference librarian, Gary Gisselman, at the Marathon County Public Library, Wausau, Wisconsin. Gary informed me that the D. J. Murray Manufacturing Company, founded in 1882, was acquired in 1966 and became Murray Machine Company. Cast machinery for paper mills was the principal product of the company.

Since the company was still in business, I called and spoke with Tom Novak, a longtime employee, who agreed to do some checking for me. Based on his research, your doorstop was made in the 1950's or early 1960's. The company did not sell the doorstop; they gave it away as a promotional item. In addition to the sitting bulldog, the company also made a frog doorstop.

Unfortunately, you did not indicate from what material your bulldog was made. If it is made of aluminum, it dates before 1961. The D. J. Murray Manufacturing Company stopped making aluminum castings in that year.

You also did not in-

dicate if your doorstop was painted or report its condition. Your doorstop is valued between \$30 and \$40 if it is not painted and in good condition. If it is painted and the paint is original, you can add another \$10. If you painted it, deduct \$10 from its value. Actually, the bulldog's value is probably greater to an advertising collector than to a doorstop collector. Enjoy it for a few more years. The value is certain to increase.

QUESTION: I have a 7½" long, blue glass bottle in the shape of a fish. On one side near the eye is "MILLVILLE/NEW JERSEY," and on the reverse is "DOCTOR FISCH'S BITTERS." The bottom is marked "WHEATON, NJ." What is its value? - IG, Allentown, PA

ANSWER: Ralph and Terry Kovels' *The Kovels' Bottle Price List, Sixth Edition* (Crown Publishers: 1982) lists five variations of an 1866 Dr. Fisch's bitter bottles, all made in either an amber or near yellow color glass at prices ranging from \$120 to \$375. Please read carefully. The key is the color - amber or near yellow, NOT BLUE.

The answer to the origin of your bottle is found in the introduction to the "Wheaton Commemoratives" category in *Warman's Americana & Collectibles, 3rd Edition* (Warman Publishing: 1988): "Beginning in 1971 Wheaton Industries... manufactured a series of flasks and bottles which, while not reproductions, are similar in style to 19th century flasks and figural bottles. These were produced in milk glass, amber, ruby, blue, amethyst and green. They can be identified by 'Wheaton, NJ,' 'Nuline,' or 'W' embossed on the base." These copycat bottles sell between \$1 and \$4.

Wheaton Industries deserves our thanks for clearly identifying their copycat bottles. Not all manufacturers of copycats and reproductions are this honest.

QUESTION: I have an original Bethel, New York, security jacket that I obtained in 1969 at the Woodstock Festival. It is yellow in color. In red on the left side of the front is "SECURITY" and on the back a large circle with "PEACE." How much is it worth? - WK, Liberty, NY

ANSWER: Ted Hake, owner of Hake's Americana & Collectibles (P.O. Box 1444, York, Pennsylvania 17405), sees Social Cause collectibles from the late 1950's through the early 1970's as a rapidly growing collecting interest. I agree.

Since this is a new field, there is still a great deal of price speculation and fluctuation. Your jacket probably has a value in the \$25 to \$50 range. Howev-

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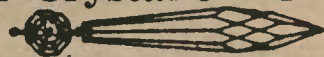
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A Celebration Of Libraries

In a joint venture of extraordinary magnitude, the 16 member libraries of the Philadelphia Area Consortium of Special Collections Libraries

(PACSCL) are presenting an exhibition of nearly 250 rare books, manuscripts and works of art. Entitled "Legacies of Genius: A Celebration of Philadel-

phia Libraries," the exhibition will be on display September 25 in the adjoining galleries of The Historical Society of Pennsylvania and The Library Company of Philadelphia at 1300 Locust Street in Philadelphia.

To celebrate the wonders and importance of libraries, the exhibition displays together, for the first time, many of the world's greatest book treasures housed in Philadelphia. From the oldest known Passover Hagga dah (from 11th century Egypt) to John Von Neumann's original typescript of the first stored computer program (1945), this collaborative exhibit offers unusual opportunities for the public to experience the beauty, the genius, the talent and creativity of these timeless documents.

Through dramatic exhibit design and creative lighting, this exhibit reveals in detail the genius behind the works. Graphics, portraits and artifacts -- such as an 1830 Globe Theatre model, a Fraktur writer's case (with samples of the German folk art), as well as old medical instruments -- draw the visitor to a closer understanding and en-

joyment of the works.

"Legacies of Genius" features important documents of American history, classics of science, literature, children's books, art and architecture, physical science, medicine, natural history, and religion. Books, manuscripts and works of art are grouped together into subject categories.

The treasures on display include a jewel-like illuminated manuscript Psalter of the 13th century, which vies for beauty with the colorful miniatures in a Persian epic of the 16th century. Books printed before Columbus discovered America and the 1493 published announcement of that event share honors with the original autographed manuscripts of Dickens' *Pickwick Papers*, Poe's *Murders in the Rue Morgue*, and James Joyce's *Ulysses*.

Many first editions are being shown, among them the famous *Shakespeare Folio* of 1623, *Paradise Lost*, *Robinson Crusoe*, *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, *Alice in Wonderland* and *The Tale of Peter Rabbit*. Visitors can see the only known copy of a preliminary proof of the first printing

Despite all this, the church was entering a spiritual decline. Attendance and interest waned and financial support declined. Guild membership fell off also. Wyllie was better suited as an administrator and researcher than as a spiritual leader. It fell to the vestry and Guild to "mind the store."

Fortunately, parishioners remained devoted and special bequests improved the financial situation. Shrewsbury was removed from the list of "aided parishes" in 1963 and became self-sustaining.

A multitude of repairs and improvements were initiated beginning in the mid-'60's and continuing for a decade - funded by Mrs. Harry Clark Boden, with some funds from the vestry.

Repairs and additions to the rectory in the late '60's and the '70's included: new shingles, shutters, chimney repairs, a new roof, plumbing, heating and electrical improvements, including a new water pump, and bathroom and kitchen renovations. Storm windows and doors were installed, and the rectory and parish house were repainted. The final two stained glass windows were installed in the church, and all windows were protected by the installation of exterior glass panels. A new iron fence was installed to enlarge the cemetery.

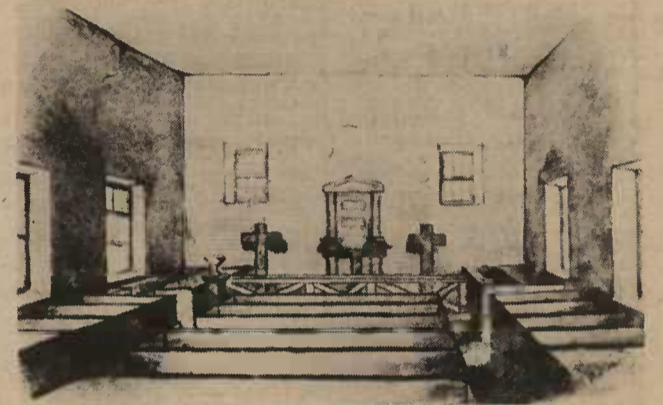
Once again, Shrewsbury's fortunes declined in the late '70's during Reverend Wyllie's three year illness. On the surface, Shrewsbury was unable to support a full-time rector. Membership and enthusiasm had diminished, but the remaining parishioners were unwilling to "let go." Plans were instituted to increase membership, and the decision was made to search for a joint rector for North Sassafras Parish and Shrewsbury.

The Reverend Thomas M. Stuhr III was elected as rector by the vestry of both parishes, effective December 1, 1977. Shrewsbury, under the capable leadership of the enthusiastic Reverend Stuhr, is thriving once more -- after being almost literally "down for the count."

The Reverend Stuhr's goal was that each parish should become an independent and financially stable one, each able to justify a full-time rector. Through spiritual leadership, ambitious fundraising efforts and sheer tenacity, Shrewsbury has rebounded from near disaster. Social aspects of church membership were addressed also. On June 1, 1980, Stuhr resigned from his post at North Sassafras Parish to devote full-time attention to Shrewsbury. The Reverend Stuhr's

innovations and enthusiasm have proven contagious. Numerous repairs have been carried out on the parish house, church

and rectory. New policies, procedures and activities have generated renewed interest among pari-

shioners. Financial security has encouraged the vestry to initiate the aforementioned Bell Tower Project. The Shrewsbury Tercentennial Committee now goes forward with plans for its monumental 300th anniversary celebration, and the congregation looks ahead to the fourth century of Shrewsbury Parish Church.

In 1986, Shrewsbury was entered into the National Register of Historic Places. The history of the church had been recorded earlier by Mrs. Simon W. Westcott, Sr. (Elizabeth Hurtt), and the most-recent research has resulted in *A History of Shrewsbury Parish Church* by Katherine Myrick De Prospro. This excellent and accurate book, source of all factual information in this article, is available from Chesapeake College Press, P.O. Box 8, Wye Mills, Mary-

WHEREAS Vestry of Coventry Parish is a religious corporation of the State of Maryland, duly organized in 1798 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 24 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1798 (the 1798 Vestry Act), and existing since that date in Somerset County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish is a religious corporation of the State of Maryland, duly organized in 1898 pursuant to the provisions of the 1798 Vestry Act and of Chapter 23 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1870, and existing since that date in Somerset County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS Vestry of Coventry Parish and Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish desire to merge pursuant to the laws of the Maryland relating to non-stock corporations, and thereby to unite their separate religious corporations, and approval of such union in conformity with its applicable canons has been given on February 7, 1981, by the Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Easton in conformity with Chapter 23 of the Acts of 1870; and

WHEREAS to achieve the merger and union above described, these Articles are executed.

NOW THEREFORE, Vestry of Coventry Parish and Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish, being the religious corporations which are the parties to these Articles of Merger and Union, do hereby

agree to effect a merger of these corporations upon the terms and conditions herein set forth.

I. The corporation to be merged into the successor corporation is Vestry of St. Bartholomew's Parish, which became a corporation as set forth in the preamble hereto, and whose principal office is located at Marion Station, Somerset County, Maryland. Its corporate existence will cease upon the effective date of the merger, in accordance with Section 3-114, Corporations and Associations, Annotated Code of Maryland. All its interests in land are located in Somerset County, Maryland.

II. The successor corporation is Vestry of Coventry Parish, which became a corporation as set forth in the preamble hereto, and whose principal office is located at Kingston, Somerset County, Maryland. All its interests in land are located in Somerset County, Maryland.

III. The terms and conditions of the merger and union set forth in these articles were advised, authorized and approved by each corporation party to this transaction in the manner and by the vote required by their respective charters and by-laws, and the merger and union was initially approved by the Annual Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Easton on February 2, 1980, and was finally approved by Annual Convention on February 7, 1981, in conformity with Diocesan canons and Chapter 23 of the Acts of 1870.

IV. Vestry of Coventry Parish, the successor corporation, shall continue to have and exercise all property, rights and powers previously conferred upon it by Chapter 24 of Maryland Acts of 1798 and by Section 298, et seq. of Article 23 of the

Maryland Annotated Code (now Chapter 97 of the Acts of 1976), and shall have transferred to it and vested in it all property rights and powers previously vested in Vestry of St.

Bartholomew's Parish.

V. Vestry of Coventry Parish and Vestry of St.

Bartholomew's Parish are both non-stock religious corporations, and the successor corporation similarly will be a non-stock corporation, organized and functioning pursuant to the provisions of the 1957 Vestry Act affecting the Diocese of Easton (now Chapter 97 of the Acts of 1976).

VI. This merger and union was duly advised to the members of the respective congregations entitled to vote thereon by the respective vestries of each of the merging corporations, as advisable in accordance with the terms of these Articles, and after approval by the Diocese of Easton as above recited and due notice to the members of the respective congregations, was approved by a majority of the members of each congregation entitled to vote and then voting at the respective regularly called parish meetings.

VII. The effective date of these Articles shall be the date on which they are accepted for filing by the State Department of Assessments and Taxation.
