

### Work and Program of the Charge

During this past year, your pastor has conducted four weddings and five funerals. Extensive pre-marital counseling is done before any marriage is performed. Counseling of all types has consumed many hours this year. What a privilege it is to be invited into the brokenness of another's life, where the healing Word can be spoken. As has always been true, the healing Word is a hard Word until it is accepted and lived out of.

Again this last year, we took the Fairhaven M.Y.F. on a Spring Mission Work Camp to the Cherokee Methodist Mission. Eleven youth and four adults (Mrs. Ada Howard, Mrs. Alice Trueson, Mrs. Marilyn Barton and myself) and Paul took the trip. The M.Y.F. worked with the Mission pastor, studied the book God is for Real Men, met with two Cherokee M.Y.F.'s, attended a recreation night at the Cherokee High School, and of course, a lot of recreation. By careful planning, we ate well for \$4.33 per person per meal.

Fairhaven's Building program was continued in the planning stages. At present, the architect has stopped work on the plans until our kitchen requirements are determined.

Further delaying the building is the County's dragging out of the rezoning of Fairhaven's present location. Our chairman, Mr. Leo Chocor, has done an excellent job bringing us along step by step. A successful Building Fund Crusade was carried out under the directions of our National Board of Missions. Forty-eight (48) adults and sixteen (16) youth pledges totaled \$23,248.30 to be given over a three year period.

A charge School of Missions was conducted by the combined Commissions of Missions and Christian Social Concerns under the leadership of Alma Ridgley and Gillian Whalen. While attendance left something to be desired, the programs were excellent.

The Commissions on Membership and Evangelism will both later tonight recommend persons to be removed from our membership rolls. Those from Fairhaven have been inactive for some years. Those from Pleasant View were actually removed by Quarterly Conference action some years ago, but their names were not removed from the roll. Pleasant View's action is therefore remedial. I recommend that during this next year both Commissions draw up a list of any members who have been inactive and then seek by every means possible to reactivate them. If they refuse to be reactivated, their names should be recommended to this Quarterly Conference for removal. It should always be remembered that any name removed may be returned to the roll by the pastor when that person becomes active again.

## REPORT OF THE PASTOR (CONT'D)

I recommend that any new officer who will be reporting to the Quarterly Conference be given, at the beginning of the year, a copy of the report he will file. This report will help him to know what records he should keep during the year.

During this year your pastor has served the District as Sub-District M. Y. F. Director.

The Trustees from both Churches this year have made improvements on our properties. Pleasant View Trustees painted the exterior of their church and are planning to re-landscape their cemetery. Fairhaven Trustees painted the parsonage and fenced the parsonage back yard.

The amount of tension this year has hindered the work of Christ. It seems highly unfair by human standards that any people should be called upon to be forgers of the future as we have been. To have merged two congregations separate for half a century--to have sold a building deeply loved by so many--to have purchased new land and developed building plans--to have become independent of Annual Conference support. This Fairhaven has done, but the tension has taken its toll. Now to be called upon to forge new patterns of social relations and new symbols of what it means to be a person--this seems just too much.

Yet this is what God is calling us to do. We may wish that He had chosen another people, but He has chosen these two congregations to be the People of God in the Twentieth Century. The danger is not in what we are called to do, but the fear-filled refusal to embrace it. Our God is The Lord of yesterday, today, and tomorrow. If we by our challenge, be assured that as He has done in the past, our God will cut us off like the dead branch of a tree. If we respond in creativity, be also assured that He will hear the words "Well done".

## REPORT OF THE PASTOR

### Work and Program of the Charge

During this past year, your pastor has conducted four weddings and five funerals. Extensive pre-marital counseling is done before any marriage is performed. Counseling of all types has consumed many hours this year. What a privilege it is to be invited into the brokenness of another's life, where the healing Word can be spoken. As has always been true, the healing Word is a hard Word until it is accepted and lived out of.

Again this last year we took the Fairhaven M.Y.F. on a Spring Mission Work Camp to the Cherokee Methodist Mission. Eleven youth and four adults (Mrs. Ada Howard, Mrs. Alice Thompson, Mrs. Marilyn Harton and myself) and Paul took the trip. The M.Y.F. worked with the Mission pastor, studied the book: God is for Real Man, met with two Cherokee M.Y.F.'s, attended a recreation night at the Cherokee High School, and of course, a lot of recreation. By careful planning, we ate well for \$.33 per person per meal.

Fairhaven's Building program has continued in the planning stages. At present, the architect has stopped work on the plans until our kitchen requirements are determined.

Further delaying the building is the County's dragging out of the rezoning of Fairhaven's present location. Our chairman, Mr. Leo Chrobot, has done an excellent job bringing us along step by step. A successful Building Fund Crusade was carried out under the directions of our National Board of Missions. Forty-eight (48) adults and sixteen (16) youth pledges totaled \$23,248.80 to be given over a three year period.

A charge School of Missions was conducted by the combined Commissions of Missions and Christian Social Concerns under the leadership of Alma Ridgley and Lillian Whalen. While attendance left something to be desired, the programs were excellent.

The Commissions on Membership and Evangelism will both later tonight recommend persons to be removed from our membership rolls. Those from Fairhaven have been inactive for some years. Those from Pleasant View were actually removed by Quarterly Conference action some years ago, but their names were not removed from the roll. Pleasant View's action is therefore remedial. I recommend that during this next year both Commissions draw up a list of any members who have been inactive and then seek by every means possible to reactivate them. If they refuse to be reactivated, their names should be recommended to this Quarterly Conference for removal. It should always be remembered that any name removed may be returned to the roll by the pastor when that person becomes active again.



## REPORT OF THE PASTOR (CONT'D)

I recommend that any new officer who will be reporting to the Quarterly Conference be given, at the beginning of the year, a copy of the report he will file. This report will help him to know what records he should keep during the year.

During this year your pastor has served the District as Sub-District M.Y.F. Director.

The Trustees from both Churches this year have made improvements on our properties, Pleasant View Trustees painted the exterior of their church and are planning to re-landscape their cemetery. Fairhaven Trustees painted the parsonage and fenced the parsonage back yard.

The amount of tension this year has hindered the work of Christ. It seems highly unfair by human standards that any people should be called upon to be forgers of the future as we have been. To have merged two congregations separate for half a century--to have sold a building deeply loved by so many--to have purchased new land and developed building plans---to have become independent of Annual Conference support. This Fairhaven has done, but the tension has taken its toll. Now to be called upon to forge new patterns of social relations and new symbols of what it means to be a person--this seems just too much.

Yet this is what God is calling us to do. We may wish that He had chosen another people, but He has chosen these two congregations to be the People of God in the Twentieth Century. The danger is not in what we are called to do, but the fearfilled refusal to embrace it. Our God is The Lord of yesterday, today, and tomorrow. If we by our challenge, be assured that as He has done in the past, our God will cut us off like the dead branch of a tree. If we respond in creativity, be also assured that we will hear the words "Well done".
