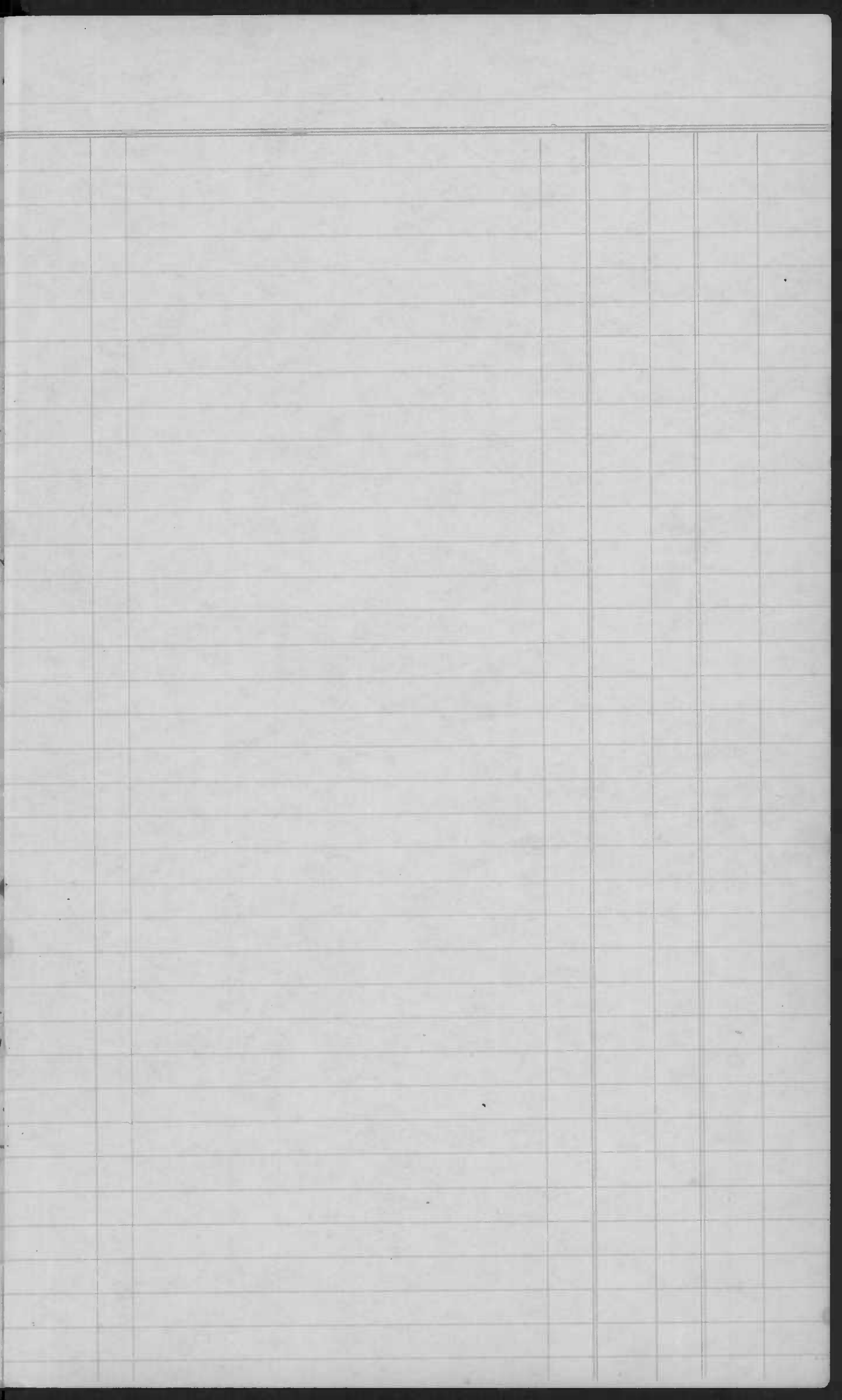

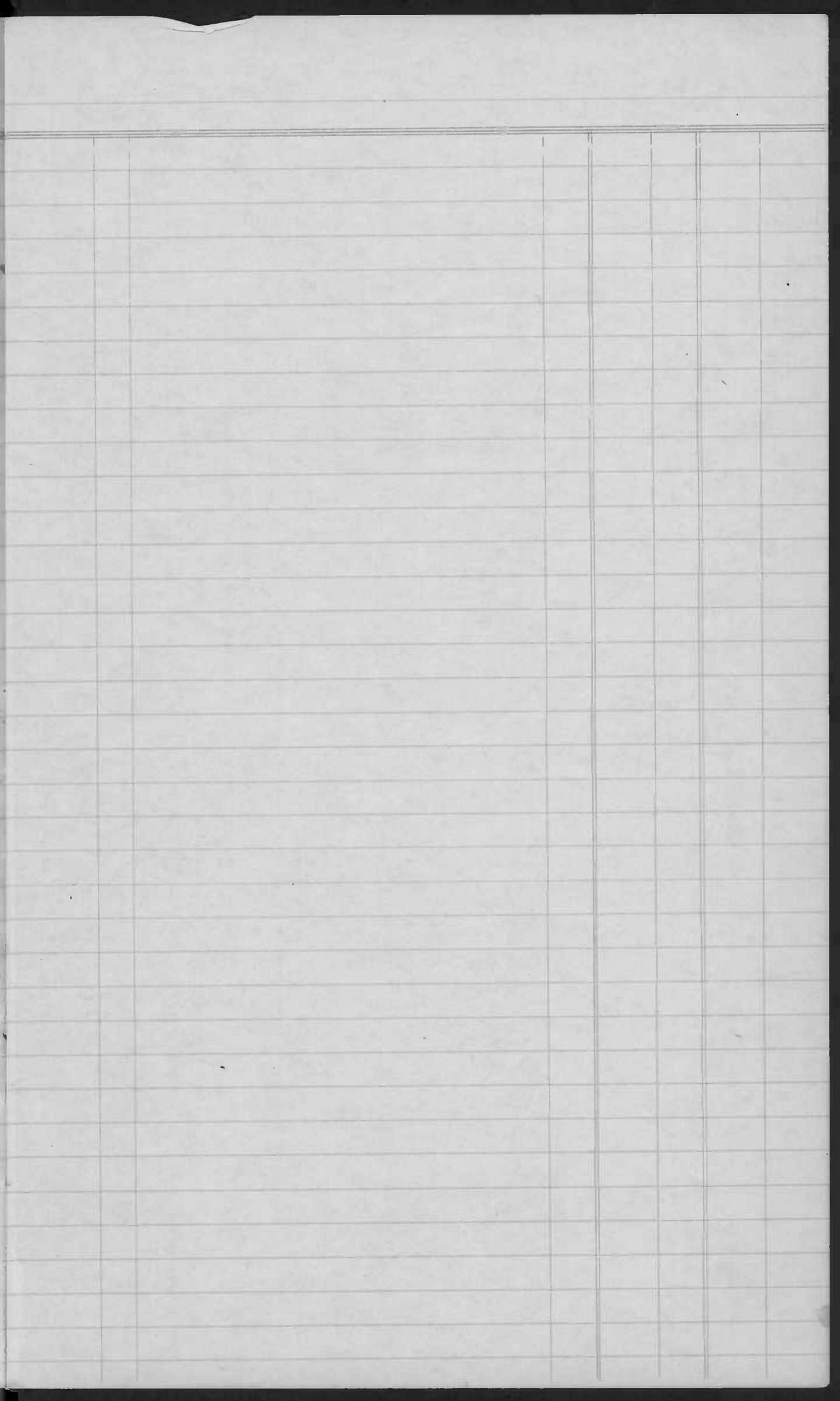
It was then suggested and carried by those present of the male chorus of Emory Grove to take complete charge of the electric bill for one year.

INSTRUCTIONS

The purpose of this book is to provide a permanent record of the membership of the local church school. Just as there is provision for a permanent record of *church* members, so there is need for a permanent record of *church-school* members.

In this book should be recorded the names of all persons who are at present members and all who in the future become members of the church school. The membership of the church school includes all persons in the Christian educational program of the local church, including those in Sunday school and the Methodist Sunday evening fellowship, those in additional sessions on Sunday or during the week in the Children's Division, those in Sunday evening meetings and weekday meetings in the Youth Division, and those in Sunday evening and weekday meetings in the Adult Division. Do not duplicate names when a member is active in more than one group in the church school.

This book should be kept by the general secretary of the church school. It should be considered a part of the permanent records of the local church. It should be kept in a safe place and should be given the protection due the permanent records of the church. When the pastor, superintendent, or other officials need information about members of the church school, it should be available in this record. The records in this book should be kept accurately and strictly up-to-date. This will require full co-operation on the part of department and class secretaries in reporting every week on members added, members whose status has changed, and members who should be dropped. For this purpose the official report blanks from MR-25, *Book of Weekly Report Blanks*, should be used by all secretaries.

Adding names. Secretaries throughout the church school should report to the general secretary each week the names of new members to be entered in this book (using the report form in MR-25, *Book of Weekly Report Blanks*). A person should be considered a member as soon as he indicates his desire to become a member (or, in the case of small children, whenever that is indicated for them).

Names should be entered alphabetically. Before a name is entered, the general secretary should check through all the entries under that letter of the alphabet to avoid entering the same name twice. The alphabet guide will be found on the outside edge of each page.

Dropping names. Names should be dropped from the roll only by competent authority and for valid reason:

- a) *Competent authority.* No name should ever be dropped, regardless of reason, without authority from the Commission on Education exercised through a committee or person designated by the board for that purpose, such as class teacher or department superintendent.
- b) *Valid reason.* Names should be dropped only when one of the following reasons applies: (1) death; (2) moved permanently from the community; (3) joined another church school; (4) absent for at least six months in spite of repeated efforts of church-school workers to secure attendance; (5) specific personal request from the individual (or in the case of children, from the parent or guardian) that his name be dropped.

The procedure for dropping a name is as follows:

- a) The secretary of the class or group will call the matter to the attention of the teacher or superintendent or whoever is authorized by the Commission on Education to drop names.
- b) That person will inquire as to whether one of the reasons listed above applies. If satisfied that it does, he will sign the weekly report blank (in MR-25) so certifying and the secretary will send the blank to the general secretary.
- c) The General secretary will then determine whether the person is a member in some other group in the church school. If not, the name is ready to be dropped.
- d) The general secretary will then locate the person's name in this book, make the proper entries in the last two spaces, and then cross off the name by running a line through it, leaving it so it can still be read for future information if needed.

Members who become unable to attend because of infirmity, continued illness, vocation, and the like, or members away from the community in the armed forces or on extended absence who intend to return, should *not* be dropped. Their status should, however, be changed from "active" to Adult Home Roll, or Youth Home Roll, in accordance with their age.

CONTENTS

THE METHODIST CHURCH-SCHOOL RECORD SYSTEM is a complete system of records and reports for the Sunday school, the Methodist Sunday evening fellowship including evening meetings of youth, additional sessions of the Children's Division, weekday groups, and all other meetings of the local church school, prepared in harmony with the legislation passed by the General Conference of The Methodist Church in 1952. The following items comprise the system:

Individual Registration and Attendance Record Card, No. MR-20

A card, size 4x6 inches, which may be used: (1) by the general secretary in keeping the official permanent central roll of all church-school members, with *Index Cards for Church-School Membership File, No. MR-21*; (2) by department, or class, or group secretary as a membership record or for recording attendance; (3) by teacher or leader for personal use.

Index Cards for Church-School Membership File, No. MR-21

For use with *Individual Registration and Attendance Record Card, No. MR-20* in keeping membership cards in proper arrangement by classifications.

Record Book for Nursery Home Visitor, No. MR-22

For the Nursery home visitor for recording and keeping track of members on the Nursery Home Roll.

Record Book for Classes or Other Groups of the Church School, No. MR-23

A record book which can be used in all churches, large and small, for recording membership, attendance, etc. One of these books is needed for each Sunday-school class or other group in the church school.

Record Book for Adult Home Members, No. MR-24

For the Adult home visitor in recording and keeping track of adult home members.

Weekly Report Blanks for Classes and Other Groups, No. MR-25

A book of report blanks for an entire year for reporting weekly to the general secretary on membership, attendance, and offering.

Quarterly Report of the Assistant Superintendent for Membership Cultivation, No. MR-34

For making quarterly report to the Commission on Education.

Quarterly Report of Department Blank, No. MR-26

For department superintendents in the Children's and Youth Divisions in reporting quarterly to the division superintendent and the Commission on Education.

Quarterly Report of Adult Class or Group Blank, No. MR-27

For leaders of classes and groups in the Adult Division in making quar-

terly reports to the division superintendent and the Commission on Education.

Quarterly Report of the Division Blank, No. MR-28

For the Children's, Youth, and Adult Division superintendents in making their quarterly reports to the Commission on Education.

Quarterly Report on Home Members Blank, No. MR-29

For Nursery home visitors, Youth home visitors, and Adult home visitors in reporting on their work.

Report and Offering Envelope for Adult Home Members, No. MR-30

For Adult home members in making their quarterly offerings.

Absentee Follow-up Slip, No. MR-31

This slip should be used in every class and group in obtaining information about absent members. Available in pads of 100 slips, size 3x5 inches.

The General Secretary-Treasurer's Book, No. MR-32

Every Methodist church school should use this basic record book, which includes all the general records as a whole.

Permanent Register of Church-School Members, No. MR-33

For church/schools not desiring a card system, this book is for keeping the official permanent central roll of church-school members. May be used in all church schools regardless of size.

Report of the Commission on Education, No. QC-56

This is the form used by the Commission on Education and the superintendent to make the annual report to the fourth Quarterly Conference and to such other meetings of the Quarterly Conference and Official Board as may be desired. It provides for that information about the work of the whole church school which is essential for the Quarterly Conference, the Official Board, the pastor, and the district superintendent. The report blank is made in sets, providing one copy of the report for the Quarterly Conference record, one for the pastor, one for the district superintendent, and one to be kept by the Commission on Education. The report blank is available in sets of four blanks as described above.

Quarterly Report of the Methodist Youth Fellowship, No. QC-57

This report to the Quarterly Conference and Official Board, which supplements the report of the church-school superintendent, includes youth membership, adult workers, and other records. In small churches where the Methodist Youth Fellowship is organized as one group, its president should make this report. Otherwise the report should be made by the president of the Youth Council after consultation with the groups in the MYF.
