Stewardship should be encouraged early in childhood by training the child to give a portion of his regular spending money to the church. At least two services during the year should be given by the pastor on stewardship.

An Official Board Assembly will be held on May 25th at Jerusalem Methodist Church in Rockville. This Assembly will also include the chairman of the five Commissions.

A training school for lay speakers will be held starting in April. It will be a ten week series. Persons taking the course will be certified as lay speakers. A lay leader should also be a lay speaker.

The meeting was called to order by the presiding officer, Rev. T. D. Bonington followed by the reading of the prayer found on page 510 of the Methodist Hymnal.

It was moved by Mrs. Esther Jackson and seconded by Mrs. Ruth Jackson that the minutes of the last meeting be adopted as read.

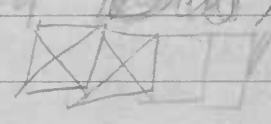
