"Today's Children for Tomorrow's World"

We hear on all sides that family life is disintegrating. Constructive programs for the enrichment of life often divide the family. Parents become the providers of food, lodging, clothing, and transportation, mothers sometimes feel that they spend more time taxiing children to and from myriads of activities than they do at home. Children cannot understand why they aren't understood.

In the midst of many cultural changes that are putting pressures on the American family, the church reminds parents that the home is primarily responsible for Christian nurture.

This study seeks to depict what is happening to families. What are the forces affecting the family and the lives of its individual members? The study explores the meanings and resources of the Christian faith available to families in order that the home and the church may mutually strengthen each other in the task of helping people grow in Christian stature and in ministering to a world whose failure to acknowledge the Lordship of Christ has created terrifying impediments to that Christian growth.

This study assumes that character is not the product of the situation in which it is demanded. The qualities that make for maturity and responsible living develop over a period of years. "As a twig is bent so inclined is the oak."

It further assumes that responsible adults are being developed in today's families, and that family life is a crucible in which fundamental qualities of adult behaviour are being formed.

Another assumption is that Christian forces of our day, the faith, the church, have tremendous responsibility in helping families be the seedbed in which Christian character may grow.

There are two difficulties facing us:

1. The assumptions asserted above are seen to be obvious that we think optimum development of our children will occur automatically, or in spite of our well-intentioned but immature efforts, they will turn out all right anyway.
2. Families and people in families, the fragile relationships in which persons grow, are being confronted by circumstances that threaten the values that Christians would build into their lives, indeed that threaten ~~the values that Christians would build into their~~ life itself.

This study is for everyone, because everyone is in some way close to a family. For those parents whose children are all grown and gone, there is still a possible grandparent relationship. Younger parents look to older ones for cues on how to approach and even how to feel about problems in which their children are involved.

The Christian church as the family of God should be the community in which everyone finds himself truly at home or in which any man recognizes that he may find acceptance.

Values from the study:

1. You may become more informed about the pressures faced by families.
2. You can renew your aspirations regarding the crucial role that families

play in developing mature persons.

3. You can see more clearly the importance and relevance of the Christian perspective on family life and on this world-in-the-making. Christian faith and experience can become more profoundly ingredients of family living.
4. You can find in such study new resources and new resolution for a more responsible participation on your part, right now, in your family, in your relationship with others in their families, and in the church family.

This study deals with the responsibility of families for the creation of those conditions in which children can grow and mature into responsible adults. In this confused world, perhaps the most critical confusion lies in our inability to make value decisions.

WHAT OUGHT WE DO?

How can we help families find the source of values in this kind of world that will be relevant to the problems we face and will at the same time be consistent with our Christian faith, and indeed which emerge out of our faith?

Suggestions for presentation:

- Panel discussions on family life
- Speakers of note in the field of family relations
- Posters of newspaper clippings of events which contribute to world confusion and family living.
- Meaningful worship services
- Work with the minister and members of the Commission on Membership and Evangelism to find ways in which your church is or can be a better church family.
- Study the rituals of the church, especially, the solemnization of matrimony.
- Conduct sampling opinion polls on questions such as: Do you think the father's role in the home should be enhanced? How?
- Make a sampling survey of a few families and their involvement in the organizational life of the community. Are families isolated? Overinvolved? Is there Christian social responsibility or self-centered interests expressed in this involvement?

Dear Montgomery County Voter:

One of the principal duties of the NAACP is to bring to the attention of its members and of the public the records and positions of political candidates on key issues, particularly those issues bearing on civil rights and related areas. We feel that one of the main roads to social justice lies in the determined use of the ballot by an informed electorate.

For example, a resolution was adopted at the 55th Annual Convention of the NAACP, which met in Washington, D. C. during June 1964, urging the Republican National Convention "to repudiate the position taken by Senator Goldwater" with respect to the Civil Rights bill; we are conducting a campaign against his election. It should be clearly understood, however, that this position does not extend to all Republican candidates. In fact, as the Convention resolution stated, "We are committed to support those Republican candidates as well as Democratic candidates who voted for the Civil Rights bill."

We also urge your wholehearted support of those (new) candidates who were not in office at the time of the civil rights debate, but whose records and statements make clear that they are in favor of full citizenship rights for all.

Your NAACP Branch has sent out questionnaires to all candidates and has analyzed their records and positions of these candidates on key issues. Our analysis leads us to believe that each candidate has taken the position which is indicated in the attached "Voters' Guide" on each of the key issues considered.

Also included in the Guide is our analysis and recommendations with regard to the State and County questions which will be on the ballot in November.

Please give your careful consideration to these recommendations and above all, please be sure to vote on November 3rd. Make your vote COUNT!

Board of Education

Your NAACP believes that the needs of our children and of education generally in Montgomery County will be best served by the present members of the Board of Education, namely: Clifford K. Beck, Lucy Kecker, and Lucille Maurer.

State Questions

I. Extension of time allowed for the preparation of County charters.

A vote FOR means: Allowing up to 12 months for the preparation of a proposed charter.

The NAACP votes FOR extending the allowed time because we feel that 12 months of preparation will allow time for adequate public debate of the issues.

II. Transferring the functions of Orphans' Court Judges to the Circuit Court Judges.

A vote FOR means that Orphans' affairs will be settled by judges who are required to be experienced lawyers.

The NAACP votes FOR transferring the functions of the Orphans' Court judges to the Circuit Court judges because Circuit Court judges are often called upon to settle such cases anyway when Orphans' Court judges, who are not required to be experienced lawyers, cannot.

III. Permission for holders of public office to be licensed Notaries Public also.

A vote AGAINST means that no public office holder shall serve as a Notary Public during his tenure in office.

The NAACP votes AGAINST this question because less Notary Public positions would be available to county citizens.

IV. Adjusting the length of sessions of the General Assembly to 70 days each year and increasing legislative salaries accordingly by \$600 a year.

A vote FOR means that there will be sufficient time to review every concern brought before the legislature regardless of whether it is presented in an odd or an even year.

The NAACP votes FOR this question to prevent any delay in consideration of legislation.

V. Re-enactment of the 1963 Public Accommodations law with amendments to extend its coverage on a state-wide basis.

A vote FOR this question means that Montgomery County will be provided with a statewide law in addition to being covered by the Federal Civil Rights law.

The NAACP votes FOR this question in order to retain for Maryland as much civil rights protection as possible in spite of what might be done to change the federal law.

COUNTY QUESTIONS

A. Primary elections for the Board of Education candidates in Montgomery County?

The NAACP votes NO because we feel that School Board elections should be held in a strictly non-partisan atmosphere.

B. Permit certain restaurants to sell liquor by the drink in Montgomery County and prohibiting the sale of liquor to the general public by Country Clubs.

The NAACP votes NO; not to legalize the sale of liquor by the drink in County restaurants because we feel it is not in the best interests of the County to extend liquor sales.

C. \$10,000 a year salaries for County Council members or a continuance of present salaries of \$30 for each day's duty?

The NAACP votes NO change in salary for County Council members because we feel that \$30 per day is adequate.

D. A charter amendment providing that no more than 2 of the three member County Personnel Board may be members of any one political party?

The NAACP votes NO on the amendment because we feel that political affiliation should not be a qualification for appointment.
