Pamphlet #0019 – Pg. 3 – First complete sentence - (Correction dated January 12, 2017)

Change to read: Irvin's father was a member of Mount Zion Baptist Church, while his mother Valeria was acting in the Willing Workers, Pastor's Aide Ministry, and the Missionary Ministry.

Pamphlet #0023 – Pg. 2 – First sentence under the heading **Farming in Dembytown** – (Correction January 12, 2017)

Change to read: As teenage boys, Jerry and George Gilbert worked the farm that their father William (1857 -?) sharecropped on Gunpowder Neck.

Pamphlet #0029 – Page 1 - First sentence under the heading **The Family Remembered** – (Correction dated January 12, 2017)

Change to read: Ms. Kennard's father, John Wesley Williams (1885-1954), was also born in this home, which originally belonged to his parents, George Dutton and Sophia Jane (Williams) Dutton, who is identified in the 1910 census as a laundress.

Pamphlet #0029 – Page 3 - First complete sentence – (Correction dated January 12, 2017)

Change to read: Her oldest sister, Blanche Williams Brooks (1910-2003), looked out for her and made all her clothes when Ena was a young child.

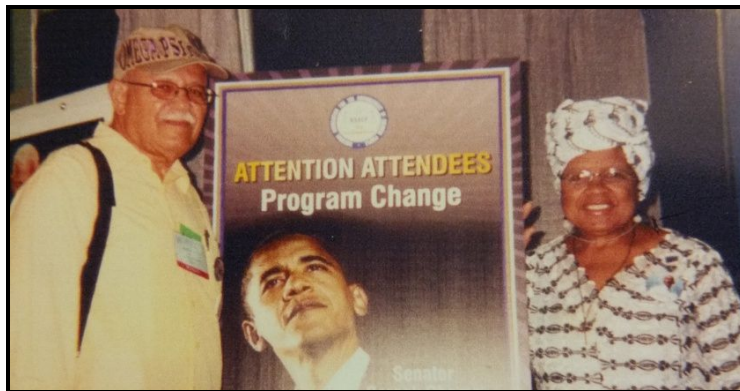
