In the year 1829, there has been paid \$5,397 63 on account of principal and interest of the debt. The Penitentiary owes

The last loan of 30,000 dollars was granted to assist in building the new wing, now completed—the cost of which amounts to \$46,823 44.† The excess being paid out of the profits of the prison.

The particulars of the profits being detailed in the annual reports, it is unnecessary to repeat them here.

The general amount of goods on hand is less than it was the former year—therefore the calculation of profits on the business of the last year is valid, and the estimate for the present value of the goods is considerably reduced, as compared with that value in the former year, on account of the reduced cost of materials.
