The foregoing estimates and calculations are based upon the laws and fiscal regulations now in force, and are entirely subject to the enactments of the current session—but when it is considered that the charge of interest on loans will be largely increased by the effect of previous appropriations for internal improvement in the year 1834, and that the excess of expenditures beyond the revenue, will consequently be augmented to an equal amount, it will devolve on the Legislature as an imperative duty, to provide resources
