*To the Governor
of Maryland,*

SIR:

In obedience to the resolutions, passed by the last legislature, I enclose an abstract from the records of this Department, intended to furnish the necessary information as to the present state of the militia, by which, your honourable body will see the dilapidated situation of the several corps, in consequence of the failure of the officers, to report themselves as required by the resolution.

Information has been forwarded to the General and Field Officers, still in commission, of the vacancies in their respective corps, with a request that they will, as speedily as practicable, furnish this Department with the necessary recommendation of characters, to enable the executive to supply the vacancies.

Major General James Thomas, of the 1st Division—and Major General Thomas M. Forman, of the 2d Division, have neglected to report, and are, in consequence stricken from the rolls. The records of your honourable body will furnish you with the required information as respects the rank of those officers who have reported. Those names in the abstract which have no date of commission attached to them, are not on record.

Herewith are several reports received and dated after the time limited by the resolution. Among those is a report from Upton D. Welch, which is dated 1st of October, and post marked same day. It was not received at the
