

Copy of a letter from the Lottery Commissioners, to the Legislature of Maryland.

OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF LOTTERIES,
BALTIMORE, January 1st, 1834.

To the Honorable

The Legislature of Maryland, now in Session:

In obedience to a resolution of this State, No. 70, passed at December Session, 1827, making it the duty of the Commissioners of Lotteries, to furnish annually to the General Assembly, at the commencement of their Session, a Statement of the sum or sums of public money which they shall have paid into the Treasury in the course of the year ending on the 30th November.—The undersigned respectfully Report, that the whole sum paid by them during the fiscal year into the Treasury, amounts to twenty-three thousand nine hundred and nine dollars and fifty cents,—(\$23,909 50); an increase it will be perceived over the last year of upwards of four thousand dollars,—and the Commissioners confidently anticipate a still increased receipt of revenue from this source, during the present year, of at least five thousand dollars over the amount now reported.
