The House of Delegates,*

GENTLEMEN,

In obedience to so much of your order of the 24th inst, as requires the Treasurer to report to the House, "the parts of the State which have failed to pay, in whole or part, the tax imposed by the act of 1831 chapter 281."

I have prepared and submit the accompanying exhibit of the counties indebted for the said tax.

In obedience to so much of the said order as calls for the designation of "those parts in which the tax has not been levied." I have the honor to report that.

In Baltimore, Montgomery, and Saint Mary's, it does not appear to have been levied at all.

In Talbot, it was not levied in 1832, but in 1833, was levied for that and the preceeding year, in pursuance of the 3d section of the act of 1832, chapter 316.
