“Whereas, the firm, dignified and energetic stand taken by His Excellency, Governor Veazey, in his Proclamation convoking an extraordinary session of the Legislature to defeat the revolutionary designs and proceedings entertained and carried on by the recusant electors, with the view of overthrowing the constitution and form of government, has superseded the necessity of any immediate legislative action on that subject, by inducing a sufficient number of the afore-said recusant electors to the performance of their duty; And whereas, it is the opinion of this house that immediate action on the various other matters referred to its consideration, by the message of the Governor, received on yesterday, is not indispensably requisite; And whereas, it is uncertain whether a quorum of the Senate can be assembled without considerable delay and consequent expense to the State, Therefore,

Ordered, That it is expedient that this house shall adjourn immediately, without day,”

Which was read;

Mr. Ely moved to amend said order by striking out the preamble thereof,

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Ely then moved that said substitute be rejected,

Determined in the negative.
