Sir, in reply to your enquiry on the subject of assessment. I have to state that the amount of assessment in the city of Baltimore, upon which taxes are levied, is as follows:

The above is believed to be correct.

N. B. I will remark that property respectfully is now assessed at the full valuation, and indeed I may say in many instances it is assessed beyond its real value.
