Richard Lemmon, Robert Barry and James Cheston, appointed by the Governor and Council of Maryland, Commissioners under the act passed by both branches of the Legislature of Maryland, at December Session, 1835, entitled, "An act to provide Indemnity, to the sufferers by certain riots in the city of Baltimore" having examined and ascertained "by view, and by such proof, under oath as they deem competent and sufficient, the value of the property injured or destroyed by the mob," belonging to all persons "who have alledged in writing, by proof under oath to the said Commissioners, that their property was injured or destroyed by the mob aforesaid," in further pursuance of their duty under the act aforesaid, do make to the Treasurer of the Western Shore this "return of the estimate of value and damages by them made, specifying the names of the parties injured, and the amount of loss or injury sustained by them respectively," viz:—

Reverdy Johnson, the sum of forty thousand six hundred and thirty-two dollars and fifty cents,

John B. Morris and Lydia Hollingsworth, the sum of sixteen thousand eight hundred and twenty-five dollars and ninety-two cents,

Evan T. Ellicott, the sum of four thousand seven hundred and forty seven dollars and fifty-five cents,
