LATE FROM EUROPE.

Through the politeness of Capt. Wood, arrived here on Saturday last, from Liverpool, we have been favoured with London papers to the 17th of July, which, though many days later than previously received from that quarter, furnish nothing of a very interesting nature. A few extracts are however made from them:—

The negotiation respecting commercial regulations between France and Great Britain, are proceeding with activity; although it is scarcely to be expected to produce a commercial treaty in the true and liberal sense of the words, as the French are very jealous of the trade and manufactures of England.

The Manufactures of Great Britain appear to have gained new activity since the peace. In a letter which appears in one of the British papers, it is observed, "that our orders flow in from every quarter of Europe, particularly Spain, Italy, &c. In the muslin line, there is a greater demand for goods than can be supplied. The American trade, however, no person chuses to touch now; having scarce any other market left before the peace, it has been quite overstocked; above three millions worth of English goods were in the city of New-York alone, when the peace took place, and they have been selling at 50 per cent loss."

The Parliament of England having been dissolved at the close of the last session, the election of Members to form a new one has commenced. Among other returns which have been officially reported are those of the city of London, city of Westminster and Southwark, viz.—Combe, Price, Curtis and Anderson, for the city of London; Fox and Gardner, for the city of Westminster; Tierney and Thornton, for Southwark.

The rapid and successful measures of Paswan Oglou, has roused the attention of the Austrian and Russian Governments; not, we presume, in tender mercy to his Sublime Majesty; but rather to get footing in European Turkey.

Bonaparte has made a tender of the mediation of France to Paswan Oglou, for the purpose of adjusting the differences of that Pacha with the Porte. This unexpected interference of the First Consul is supposed to be the result of an application to him on the part of the Turkish government.

Hostilities have broken out between the Russians and Persians, the former of whom have already penetrated into the province of Chilan. Some violence offered to the Russians at Asterabat is mentioned as the cause of these hostilities. Persia and European Turkey open a rich prospect to the desiring eyes of Austria, Russia, and France.

The difficult affair of the indemnities is at length finally arranged. A French Minister is to repair to Ratisbon in July, to notify the plan, and cause it to be carried into execution, on the part of the powers interested in it. The only Ecclesiastical Electorate to be preserved is the Electorate of Mentz. Upon the subject of the Indemnity to his Sardinian Majesty, a specific convention has been agreed upon between Russia and France.

Importation of Cotton into England, from 15th Jan. to 6th July, 1802—viz. 40,202 packages from the United States, 38,187 do. from other parts.

The votes for continuing Bonaparte in the First Consulship for life, have been generally returned; and a great proportion of them, with the addition, that he shall have the privilege of naming his successor.

The First Consul is to set out for Brussels and Antwerp, very shortly; and will be accompanied by Gen. Berthier and Adj. Gen. Duroc.

In a proclamation which Bonaparte addressed to the French people on the 14th July, he says:—"Frenchmen, you have conquered all obstacles, and your destinies are accomplished." Most truly said.

The comparison between Bonaparte and Cromwell will fail, if he assume the title of Emperor—Cromwell would never assume that of King; he knew that Protector was a new and undefined word, that could be made to mean just what he pleased; but "every body (as he observed) had a notion of a King."

Sir John Borlase Warren, is appointed Minister Plenipotentiary to the Court of Petersburg. M. Schimmelpennick, late Ambassador from the Batavian to the French republic, is appointed to the same office at the Court of St. James.

Toussaint Louverture has arrived at Brest. Mr. Fox, is about setting out for Paris.

The French Funds fluctuate very little—they are 53f. 95c.—British Three per cent Consols, 75 1/2.

Our letters from Liverpool, furnish very favourable accounts of the state of the markets, with a prospect of their continuing to appreciate. This circumstance is attributed to the expectation of an immediate treaty of Commerce with France.

We are sorry to notice, that Gen. MATTOON, declines being considered a candidate for a seat in Congress, at the next election.

EXTRACTS

From late Greenock papers received at this office, by the ship Andromache, arrived yesterday. [Daily Advertiser.]

LONDON, July 12.

In proportion as the fate of the 14th of July draws near, the Paris papers seem anxious to announce not only the numbers that have voted for giving the Consulship for life to Bonaparte, but those that have added to their votes, the wish to vest in him the power of naming his successor. In the Seine and Oise 7880 persons, and in the district of Ghalon in the Saone and Loire, 8602, out of 22,886 made that addition to their votes. We have little doubt that this power will be vested in Bonaparte, and at no distant period.

Grain is diminishing in price in several of the departments of France. At Paris, however, it is still extremely dear.

The following paragraph is from a private letter brought by the last French Mail:—

Two libels which appeared lately against the First Consul, have very seriously occupied the Minister of Police and his satellites for some time, not only to discover the authors and their accomplices, but more especially to prevent their circulation: the author of the first was soon found out and arrested, a Priest—but the other would, perhaps, have long remained unknown, had he not either from compunction, or some other motives, avowed himself—there is something extraordinary in the fact, as well as the manner, in which he has conducted himself. General Simon is the person who has voluntarily declared himself the author of the libel, printed under the title of Address aux Armees, which is highly reprehensible for its virulence, and the probable consequence of publication. This General sent into Paris a certain number of copies of his addresses; concealed in the great pots of butter which came usually from Brittany, where he resides; but as soon as he heard the effects his work produced, and that the tranquility of several Citizens was likely to be disturbed on account of the suspicion which had fallen upon them, he applied to Citizen Mounier, the Ex-Consul, who is now prefect of L'ile et Vilaine, in Brittany, and avowed himself author of the libel; and added, that "he was incapable of allowing the innocent to suffer for what, in a moment of discontent and passion, he had himself committed. He was concerned for having been so imprudent, but that as there was no remedy, he constituted himself prisoner and only requested that he might be conducted to the Temple, in a manner suitable to his rank as General." Mounier consented, and General Simon arrived at Paris on the 29th ult. escorted by an Officer of

rank in the Gendarmerie. He is a young man of silent character, but who has conducted himself in the Army with distinction. His father is Simon de Troye, a man of letters, and one of the Librarians of the Tribunal.

More troops have embarked at Brest for Martinique. Admiral Villaret (as our private correspondence informed us some days ago) has been appointed Captain General of the island, and will sail immediately with two sail of the line, some frigates, and transports.

Among other reports in Paris it is said, an Infernal Machine has been discovered under a little bridge, over which the Chief Consul passes, in his way to Malmaison,

PARIS, July 7.

The trading part of Italy attaches the greatest importance to the surrender of Porto Ferrajo by the English; and the merchants feel peculiarly happy that it is in the hands of the French. France, by becoming mistress of the Island of Elba, commands the whole of the Tuscan sea, and the coasts of that country; the Island contains several salt-pans, which produce very considerable sums to the state; the inhabitants are as brave as they are faithful.

Mr. Dundas is the first Member elected from Scotland, for the New Parliament.

We hear that the Directors of the Bank of Scotland have resolved to place in their Great Hall in the new building, now going on, a full length picture of the Right Hon. Henry Dundas, the present Governor of the Bank, to which he has rendered essential service.
