(No. XX.)  
AN ORDINANCE  
For the payment of the journal of accounts.  
WHEREAS by the journal of accounts  
of the present and late session of the  
city council, it appears that there is now  
due from the city of Baltimore, the sum  
of eleven hundred and fourteen dollars:  
BE it therefore enacted and ordained by the  
Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,  
That the register of the city shall be, and  
he is hereby authorized and required, to  
pay to the several persons, their execu-  
tors, administrators or assigns, who shall  
apply for the same, the several sums of  
money allowed to them respectively, as  
they appear to be ascertained by the said  
journal of accounts, out of any money now  
in the treasury, or that shall come into  
the treasury, subject to the appropriati-  
ons of the mayor and city council of Bal-  
timore.

AN ORDINANCE  
For increasing the number of lamps in the  
city of Baltimore.  
BE it enacted and ordained, by the mayor  
and city council of Baltimore, That the  
mayor be and he is hereby authorized and  
directed to cause to be put up the following  
additional lamps, to wit: One  
on the north east corner of Waggon-alley  
and Eutaw-street, in the 1st ward—one  
at the intersection of North and Bridge-  
streets, in the 6th ward—one at the cor-  
ner of Union and French-streets, in the  
6th ward—and two in the 7th ward,  
to wit: One at the south east corner of  
Gough and Bond-streets, and one at the  
south west corner of Bank & Bond-streets  
—two in the 8th ward, to wit: one at the  
north east corner of Lancaster and Wolf  
streets, the other at the south west cor-  
ner of George and Wolf-streets—and  
two lamps in the fish market. And the  
mayor is hereby authorized to cause to be  
lighted the following lamps, to wit: the  
lamp erected at the corner of New Church  
and Calvert-streets, in the 3d ward, and  
the other that is put up at the Baptist  
meeting-house in Front-street, in the 6th  
ward—and that the expense of erecting,  
lighting and maintaining the same, be de-  
frayed out of the funds appropriated for  
watching and lighting the city, and the  
said lamps shall be subject to the same  
regulations as other public lamps in the  
said city.
