Caution to the Unwary.

AT a General Court of Sessions held in
Charleston, May 12, 1866, before his hon-
orable Judge TREZZANI, came on the trial of
Captain *Joseph Baker*, for swindling *Byron*
Conroy out of ten boxes of sugar, was found
guilty, and sentenced by the Court to pay a fine
of 20 dollars, and to refrain 17 1/2 dollars (4 cents
of *Byron Conroy*—and if these two sums and
cost be not paid, to be imprisoned six months,
unless they be sooner paid.
N. B. Since the above, Captain *Baker* was
sent to jail he sent for me, and said he was
willing to pay me for the sugar, if he could
get it from *Joseph Sibley*, said *Joseph* know-
ing that he was accountable to Captain
Baker for 334 dollars 11 cents, which is as fol-
lows:—
"Charleston, 24 August, 1865,
"This is to certify that *Joseph Sibley* has
entered bail for Captain *Joseph Baker*, in a suit
brought against him by *Byron Conroy*, and to
make said *Sibley* secure in the business, said
Baker has deposited in *Sibley's* hands 234 dol-
lars 11 cents, which said *Sibley* is accountable
to said *Baker* for, as soon as the suit is deter-
mined.
