Shipwreck.

A **SCHOONER,**
Without any live person on board or any papers whereby she can be identified, was stranded on Senepuxent Beach, in Worcester county, Eastern Shore of Maryland, on the 12th of October, of the following dimensions, to wit: The length from the fore part of the stem to the after part of stern post, 72 feet, 19 feet beam, 7 feet 8 inches hole, the quarter deck projecting on the main deck 3 feet 4 inches, the companion was landing on the main deck in the cabin, her stern painted black without any name appearing, supposed to be washed in the gale, no moulting or lining, yellow cabin windows, red counter, yellow sides, black benches, two bowsprit shrouds on a side, 4 shrouds forward and abait on a side; having on board a quantity of whale oil in hogheads and barrels, marked with the letters L. H. the harpoons were also marked with P. A. there were no papers found except a protection of a certain Absolom Tobson, a mulatto man, dated New-York, the 12th of December 1797, and a memorandum, in a small pocket-book, of boards, scantling and shingles, signed Wm. Shummon, without date or place. The wreck and all perishable property will be sold in a few days; the oil, if no owner should come forward, will be sold in three months from this date, under the direction of the act of assembly making provision for wrecks.
