Few people, who have had occasion to take passage up or down the North River, but have experienced the inconvenience and risk of going on board vessels deeply loaded and lumbered on deck; therefore Captain Bunker has determined to take no freight on board the Experiment, which will remedy that inconvenience and entirely do away the risk.
The owners of this vessel, being desirous to render the passage as short, convenient and agreeable as possible, have not only taken care to furnish her with the best Beds, Bedding, Liquors, Provisions, &c. but they have been at very great expense and trouble in procuring materials and building her on the best construction for sailing and the accommodation of Ladies and Gentlemen travelling on business or for pleasure.

I hereby certify that I have this day attended the proving of the Hay Scales kept by Mr. George Shealy, in Old-Town, and after first proving them by correct weights to my satisfaction, I saw a load of hay weighed which also appeared very satisfactory to me. I examined the gudgeons and boxes upon which the burthen lays and found them very sharp and keen, so as to discover the immediate influence of every weight that was added. The construction is singular, and I think much to the purpose of justice, being solely composed of iron and well tempered steel, and as the wagon is hoisted by chains clear of all other incumbrance except the load it contains, I am convinced, after a careful examination, that neither the sellers nor purchasers of hay have any thing to dread from their inaccuracy in any respect whatever. Pursuant to your orders I have this day exhibited a proof of the Hay Scale, which I have kept for two years past, and which is attested by the foregoing certificate from the standard keeper. I am well informed, sir, that the voice of slander (aided by improper notices) has often been raised against the accuracy of my scale, and often refuted by a similar exhibition of proof, in the presence of a number of gentlemen, buyers and sellers of hay, who have witnessed and announced it to the public through the medium of the public papers, which papers are now in your office.
Had I been more accommodating and less scrupulous (with some hay sellers) I should have enjoyed more custom, but have foregone much by refusing to weigh bags of horse feed, marking, &c. on the hay, hence has arisen the outcry against the accuracy of the scale.
The apology of many for passing me and going so much farther to weigh, is, that by so doing they gain one, two or three hundred weight more per load. Query—If the seller gains (by travelling) who must lose; it would be absurd, indeed, to say that both parties could gain where justice is done. I have ever made it my duty, sir, as well as my interest, to dispatch as quick as possible, all those who have been pleased to favor me with their custom, and to do justice to the party absent, to wit, the purchaser, as well as the seller present, nor shall I ever shrink from that duty, in violation of justice, to gain the respect or custom of any person whatever.
I return my grateful acknowledgments to those gentlemen who have been pleased to favor me with their custom, and hope by a steady and punctual attention to justice and dispatch, to merit and obtain a continuance of their favors, and remain, sir, respectfully yours and the public's most humble servant.
