100 Dollars Reward.
On the 7th inst. (the day on which they were printed) there was stolen from the printing room of the Hager's-Town Bank, four sheets, or impressions of printed notes, each half sheet containing 4 notes, viz. one of 100 dollars, one of 50 dollars, one of 5 dollars, and one one note, all blank; and as none struck from the same plate have been issued by the bank, except eight 100 dollar notes, from No. 1 to No. 8, inclusive, or will be issued until the stolen notes are recovered, the counterfeiters may readily be detected. The 10 dollar and 5 dollar notes are No. C; all of the same denomination which have been issued, are No. A, and B, of course no 10 dollar or 5 dollar notes No. C, are in circulation, but counterfeiters, or any of 100 dollars, except eight. The stolen notes are badly executed, being printed by a person who did not understand the business; they have a smutty appearance, and two of the 10 dollar notes, which I have seen and which were detected in Baltimore, are very badly filled up and signed.
