of another Opinion.

And hove you would not come into any further Confiderasion of festling a Salary on the Governour at this present Seilion; I thisk you cannot wonder that I should defer the Confide-

ration of your Allowances in the fame manner.

What has been hitherto done, may be charged on this House of Representatives only; but the Country will now have an Opportunity, by a new Choice, of shewing their Doty and Loyalty to his Majesty, as well as their Faithfulnels to their own Constitution-
