DOUBLE, or as the French call it, a Cross Marriage having, some Months ago, been treated of, and at last agreed on, between the Courts of Spain and Portu-GAL, to wit, of the Prince of ASTWRIAS with the Infanta of Portugal, and of the Prince of BRAZIL with the Infanta of Spain:

The Excuange of those Two Princesses was lately perform'd with a Splendor and Magnificence suitable to the Grandeur of those Two wealthy Kingdoms. But before we proceed to that Ceremony, we shall premise a short Account of the two Royal Pair.

DORFERDINAND, is the third Son of PHILIP V. King of Spain, by his first Consort Mary Louisa Gabriela, Daughter of Victor Amedeus, Duke of Savoy, and King of Sardinia. Upon the Death of LEWIS, his eldelt Brother, (August 31st, 1724.) to whom King Pritte had resign'd the Crown, and of Don PHILIP his second Son, Don FERDINAND, became PRINCE of ASTURIAS. He was born on the 23d of September 1713, N. S.

By his second Wife. ELIZABETH, Drughter of the Prince of Parma, King Pull I phad two Sons, viz. Don CARLOS, born January 10th, 1716, N. S. and Don FRANcisco, born March 21st, 1717, N. S. but died soon after; and an INFANTA, born March 31st, 1718, N. S. and married November 25th, 1721, to LE wis XV. the present King of France, but sent back to Spain in 1725, by reason of her tender Age.

Don John V. King of Portugal, was born the 22d of Ottober 1699, N. S. was crown'd the 1st of January, 1707. He married MARY ANNE Archdutchess of Austria, born September 7th, 1783, Diughter to the late Emperor Le o-FOLD, by whom he has had Illue,

I. MARY MAGDALEN JOSEPH THEROSA-BARBARA, IN-FANTA of Portugal, born Dec. 4th, 1711.

II. Don Pedro Prince of Brazil, born 29th OA. 1712. Died *O&.* 29th, 1714.

III. DON JOSEPH PEDRO-JUAN-LEWIS, Prince of Brazil, born the 9th of June 1714.

IV. Don CARLOS Prince of Portugal, born the 2d of

May, 1716. V. Another Prince born the 7th of July, 1717.

This being premised, we shall now give our Readers faithful Abstracts of the leveral Advices from Madrid and Lisbon

relating to this Affair:

Madrid, Fanuary 18, N. S. We daily receive Advice of their Majesties Progress with the Royal Family, who are all in perfect Health, and continue their Journey, not withstanding the deep Snows. On the 7th, they lay at Cagarrubies; the 8th, at Torrijus; the 9th, at Talavera, where the Nobility and Citizens had prepared great Feasts for their Entertrinment; the 10th at Oropefa; the 11th at Naval-Moral; the 12th at Zaraizejo; the 13th at Villa Messa; and the 14th at Medellin; whence they propoled to be at Badajoz in two

Days, to get every Thing ready for the Exchange of the Princesses. Mean while, it is no inconsiderable Mortification to the Grandees of Spin, that the King, did not upon this Occusion, dispence with his Edicts against the Wearing of Gold apon their Cloaths, that they might make as bright a Figure as the Portugueze.

Lisbon, Jan. 20, N. S. On the 8th Inflant, the King and Queen set out hence, with the Princes of Afford's the Prince of Brazil, and the Infantes, and lay that Night at Aldea-Galega. The next Morning, about Five, they proceeded on their Journey, heard Mass in the Church of our Lady at Atalaya, and lay in the new Palace at Vendasnovas. On the toth, about Ten in the Forenoon, they arrived at Monte-Mayor, where having heard Mass, and visited the House in which S. John de Dien was born, the King went forwards, notwith. standing the Badness of the Weather, and came to Evera, the Nobility of which City and Neighbourhood went to meet him a quarter of a League out of Town, and attended him to the Cathedral-Church. On the 11th, his Majesty gave Audience to the Chapter and Senate of Evara; and the next Day lie vifired feveral Churches and Convents, and gave the Carthuffans 5000 Crulades to gild the High Altar of their Church. The same Day (the Twelfth) the Queen arrived at Evora, not having been able to reach that Place before, the Cold being to excellive, that she could not travel. On the 13th, the King conferred the Title of Count de Alva upon the General Don John Diego de Attaida, and constituted the Count de Assumir, Don John de Almeda, the Marquiss de Alegrette, Don Manuel Telles de Sylva, and the Marquisses de Cascaes and de Fontes, Gentlemen of his Bed-Chamber. On the 14th, at Four in the Morning, the King fet out again, with the Prince of Brazil and the Infantes, and lay that Night at Villaviciosa, where the Quen and the Princess of the Assuria's arrived the next Day. Fither Manuel de Figuereido, a Jesuite, came home on board the Ship lately return'd from the Eift-Indies, with two Gentlemen of the Great Mogul's Court, who brought Prefents to his Portugueze Majesty. They made a Visit at Goa to our Vicercy of the Indies, and presented him with a Syrpao, or Habit of their Country, and with a Knot of Rubies and Diamonds.

Madrid, Fel. 1. N. S. We have received these further Para ticulars of the Proceedings of the two Courts, viz. Their Catholick Majesties arrived the 19th ult. about I wo in the Af-IP ternoon at the Palace built over the Caya, (a League from [Bad joz) which little River separates the Province of Estremadura in Spain from that of Alentejo in Portugal. The faid in Palace was a square Building, painted Infide and Our with the Asms of Spain and Portugal. The Troops of the King's Houshold, and those of Estremadura, were under Arms, and made a Lane on this Side the River, to the Number of 6000 Men, with the Squadrons of Life. Guards, and the Battalions of Spanish and Walloon Guards at their Head. When the Court drew near the Palace, they faw on the other fide of the River a magnificent Coach, in which were their Portugueze Mijelties, the Princels of the Afturia's, the Prince of Brazil, and the Infantes, passing thro' a Line of the Troops of Portugal, under Arms, like tho e cf Spain; lo that both Cours entered the Hall delign'd for the Exchange of the Princesses at the same Instant. After the Marriage Contract were read and fign'd, the two Kings were alone about any Hour. The Nuprials of the Prince and Princels of the Affair
