Law, Statute, Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithland-

And be it further Enacled, That where any Lands shall be found Vacant or Escheatable in such Processioning, on which shall be the Plantation or Improvement of any Person or Perfons, or be, and lie next adjoining to the Dwelling Plantation of any the Inhabitants, that then and in such case, it shall not be lawfue for any Person or Persons to take up such Land or Lands Vacant or Eicheat, until they shall have first applied to the Person or Persons whose Improvement or Plantation it is next as joining, and that they refule or neglect for and during the space and term of Six Months, to proceed to the securing and taking up fach Vacant or Escheat Lands; but that at the Expiration of the laid Six Months, then it. shall and may be lawful to and for fuch Perion or Perions to as aforefaid firit discovering the same, and applying as aforesaid, to take up and secure the same.

And in order to prevent Disputes and bad Neighbourhood where Vacant Land may happen to be in the miest or contiguous to Trzets or Parceis of Land belonging to several Persons, Be it Enalled, That in cale such Persons, or any Two or more of them may incline to fecure such Vacancy, such Two or more Persons as shall be legally insided to the Lands contiguous to such Vacancy, in their own Right, or in the Right of any Insant to whom they or either of them shall be Guardian, shall have the Pre emption aforesaid, and liberty of taking up such Vacancy in proportion to the number of Acres contained in the contiguous Tracts in which they are so as aforesaid Interested. *Provided* the same Vacancy shall be surveyed or taken up within Six Months next after the Discovery thereof: And the Person or Persons reglecting or resusing to comply with the terms before-mentioned, shall not have any Benefit of the Privileges hereby intended. Provided alfo, that fuch Guardian who is in Possession of any Lands belonging to any Infant or windr configuous to such Vacancy as aforesaid, shall make use of the Liberty aforesaid to the Benefit of such Infant, and to the Ule and Benefit of no other Person or Perfons whatfoever.

And be it further Enacted, That where any Guardian shall secure as atoresaid, any Vacancy contiguous to the Lands of any Infant under his Guar jat fhip for the Benefit of fuch Minor, if the faid Infant, when he or she shall attain unto the Age of Twenty one Years, shall refuse to pay and allow unto his or her faid Guardian, all his just Charges, Expences and Diffurfements, in and about the securing the Vacancy as aforefaid intended for his or her Benefit, it shall and may in such case be lawful for such Guardian to hold and enjoy such Va-

cancy to his own proper ule.

And be it further Enasted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Controverly shall arise concerning the Notice being given as aforefaid, within Two Years after the taking up of such Vacant or Escheatable Lands, that then the Onus probandi shall be up in the ferson who ought to have given the Notice as aforefait; and if no fuch Controverfy doth arise in Two Years, Possession skall be held and taken as good Proof that Notice was given according to the true intent and meaning of this Act.

This Act to continue for Fifteen Years from the End of this present Session of Assembly, and to the End of the next Session of Assembly which shall happen after the Expiration of Fisteen

Mery, without a main malt, and that the commerce was in fome pain for her, left fhe should be met with by the Algerines, who had appeared in fight of that bay. The fame let. ters add, that the captain of the Algerine craizer, of 32 guns, who had stopped three or four Euglish vessels, had been feverely bestinadoed for it at Algiers, and was reider'd incapa. ble of ferving any more.

Abril 24. Letters from the Ruffian provinces bordering ca Poland all agree, that many regiments are filing off from the heart of that empire towards Ingermania, Livonia, and fin.

Advices from Dantz ck, Elbing, and some other parts of Polish Profila, inform us, that they are forming large magazines in Ducal Prussia; that they task of having a camp between Koningsberg and Welau; and that, besides these wirlike dispositions, they are building a considerable number of prames along the Villula.

From Hamburgh they write, that the bankers of that city have, within these sew days, remuted considerable soms, from France and Spain, to the Swedistr court; which we may suppose will greatly contribute to preserve prace in the North. They add, that the swedes continue to raile recruits with the utmost diligence at Hamburgh, Lubeck, and other places in

that neighbourhood.

Some letters from India, brought over in admiral Boscawen's fleet, take notice, that the French East India company are making several new settlements, and building sorts; particularly one within fight of Madrass: That they have actually a reater force in the East-Indies than when they took Fon St. George; and that the English settlements, in case of a new war, run a great risque of being swallowed up, if not timely reinforced.

April 24. On Sunday last the Deal-Cosse man of war, one of admiral Boscawen's squadron, arrived at Portsmouth.

April 25. Letters from Carthagena, in the Levant, dated the 15th inflant, mention, that 4 new Javeques, of 30 glas each, were fitting out in that harbour, and would put to its next month to cruize upon the Moors, in company with my Spanish men of war, that were expected to join them from Ferrol. The same letters add, that a large Dutch fly boat was arrived from Santander, with 312 cannon, of different bores, defigned for the ships that are to be built for his Cathohe majesty's service; and that a great quantity of timber was already received for the same purpose.
